SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO MOVE BEYOND CURRENT RATE STRUCTURES AND PROVIDE ADDITIONAL BENEFITS FOR THOSE COMMUNITIES THAT HOST RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, the State continues to move towards its mandated 1 renewable energy and carbon emission goals -- including its goal 2 3 to become completely carbon neutral by 2045 -- which will reduce electricity costs and lower carbon emissions; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the State's growing need for clean energy has 7 accelerated the development and construction of different renewable energy projects in more locations around the State, 8 creating new jobs and opportunities; and 9 10 WHEREAS, while development and construction may boost a 11 local economy, residents living in a community impacted by a 12 large-scale renewable energy project often face a disruption in 13 14 their lives as a result; and 15 WHEREAS, residents of the State living in communities that 16 host large-scale renewable energy projects are charged a flat 17 rate for energy by their providers, regardless of their 18 proximity to these energy producing projects; and 19 20 WHEREAS, benefit packages provided by developers to 21 communities that host large-scale renewable energy projects are 22 often not enough to provide them with fair compensation; and 23 24 WHEREAS, communities around the State should be encouraged 25 to desire more large-scale renewable energy projects, and the 26 provision of direct benefits to residents who host renewable 27 28 energy projects can help stimulate community buy-in and investment; and 29 30



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WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission has the oversight 1 2 of and authority to influence the rate structures of energy providers; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 6 House of Representatives concurring, that the Public Utilities 7 Commission is requested to move beyond current rate structures 8 and provide additional benefits for those communities that host 9 10 renewable energy projects; and 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chair of 13 the Public Utilities Commission, and mayor of each county. 14 15 16 17 Cun

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
