SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO PREPARE AND DEVELOP SOLUTIONS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION OF NURSES TO ADDRESS THE SHORTAGE OF THE NURSING AND HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the State has historically had a shortage of
 health care workers, which was exacerbated by the coronavirus
 disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic that has pushed the State's
 health care system to its breaking point; and

6 WHEREAS, nurses, nurse aides, and other health care workers 7 who directly care for and support patients at hospitals and care 8 homes have continued to provide high quality care despite the 9 incredible challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, often at 10 significant personal costs to themselves; and

12 WHEREAS, health care workers faced high levels of stress
13 and job turnover before the COVID-19 pandemic began, which were
14 greatly exacerbated by the pandemic; and

16 WHEREAS, improving nurse and health care worker safety and 17 working conditions leads to better patient care and staffing 18 standards, such as minimum staff-to-patient ratios, adequate 19 break and overtime protections, and hospital staffing plans, 20 should be collaboratively developed by interested stakeholders 21 to allow the health care system to better serve patients and 22 Hawaii's communities; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Health is requested to convene a working group to prepare and develop solutions and make recommendations for the recruitment and retention of nurses to address the shortage of the nursing and health care workforce in the State; and
