SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND HAWAI'I ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS TO EXPAND THE REVITALIZATION OF THE FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA AND 4-H YOUTH PROGRAMS TO SUPPORT PATHWAYS TO AGRICULTURE CAREERS IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii imports more than eighty-five percent of 1 its food and is considered highly vulnerable in issues of food 2 3 security; and 4 WHEREAS, the State has since recognized this vulnerability 5 and has initiated a major policy pivot towards food and 6 agricultural self-sufficiency to lessen its reliance on imported 7 food products; and 8 9 WHEREAS, this transitional undertaking requires serious and 10 careful investment into the local agricultural sector and 11 related trades, particularly through the expansion of education 12 and training opportunities for the next generation of farmers; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, the current lack of young farmers and ranchers 16 17 with the experience, skills, and ambition required to undertake the rigorous and complex work of farming and ranching as a 18 19 business poses a significant hurdle to vitalizing local agriculture; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, Future Farmers of America is a national nonprofit youth and student organization that promotes and supports 23 agricultural education in middle and high school classrooms and 24 currently has thirteen active chapters and over one hundred 25 fifty members in Hawaii; and 26 27 WHEREAS, 4-H is national network of youth organizations and 28 is currently delivered by Cooperative Extension, a community of 29 more than one hundred public universities across the nation, 30 which provides children and teens with opportunities to complete 31



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hands-on projects in agriculture and other areas; and in Hawaii, 1 Cooperative Extension is a program of the University of Hawaii 2 at Manoa College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources; 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, agriculture education emphasizes and requires 6 skill and knowledge in the areas of science, technology, 7 engineering, mathematics, and the arts and can prepare students 8 for careers in global agriculture, food and fiber production, 9 and management of natural resources systems that offer 10 competitive salaries; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Future Farmers of America and 4-H offer students 13 pathways to careers in Hawaii with companies and agencies that 14 often must resort to searching out-of-state for skilled workers 15 and farmers due to the lack of local agricultural labor; now, 16 therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 21 Education and the Hawai'i Association of Independent Schools, in 22 consultation with the University of Hawaii at Manoa Cooperative 23 Extension, are urged to expand the revitalization of the Future 24 Farmers of America and 4-H youth programs and reestablish and 25 strengthen pathways for youth to find careers in agriculture; 26 27 and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 30 Board of Education, the Superintendent of Education, the 31 President of the Hawai'i Association of Independent Schools, and 32 the Associate Dean and Associate Director for Cooperative 33 Extension at the University of Hawaii College of Tropical 34 Agriculture and Human Resources. 35 36 OFFERED BY: Gut Ufert 37 38
