## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESEARCH INSTITUTE, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE JUDICIARY AND DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, TO REPORT ON THE OUTCOMES OF INDIVIDUALS RELEASED ON BAIL AND OTHER FORMS OF PRETRIAL RELEASE.

1 WHEREAS, several jurisdictions, including Hawai'i, have 2 explored abolishing the use of monetary bail as a condition of 3 pretrial release, an effort commonly known as bail reform; and 4

WHEREAS, when deliberating whether to enact bail reform 5 measures, consideration of statistical information is critical 6 to the discussion, such as the percentage of individuals 7 released on bail who while in the community pending trial were 8 subsequently arrested for committing new crimes, failed to 9 appear at a required court appearance, or experienced other 10 adverse outcomes, and how these adverse outcomes compare to 11 individuals released on other grounds, such as supervised 12 release and release on recognizance; and 13

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WHEREAS, the Harry Frank Guggenheim Foundation's January 15 2023 report entitled Is Bail Reform Causing an Increase in 16 Crime? assessed bail reform in eleven jurisdictions, which did 17 not include Hawai'i, for the effect, if any, of bail reform on 18 crime and found that "[v]iolent crime trends after reforms 19 present no clear or obvious pattern in these 20 jurisdictions...neither violent nor nonviolent crimes or charges 21 increased markedly immediately after jurisdictions implemented 22 bail reform."; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Hawai'i's current bail system continues to use 25

25 WHEREAS, Hawail's current ball system continues to use
26 monetary bail as a condition of pretrial release; however, data
27 on the outcomes of individuals released after meeting bail have
28 not been compiled or publicly reported; and
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30 WHEREAS, the Criminal Justice Research Institute was
 31 established by Act 179, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, within the

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Office of the Chief Justice to assess the administrative and 1 2 technological feasibility of collecting, aggregating, and reporting on criminal pretrial data for purposes of establishing 3 a centralized statewide criminal pretrial justice data reporting 4 5 and collection system; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Criminal Justice Research Institute has, as part of its progress towards establishing a pretrial database, 8 identified statewide pretrial data sources from the Hawaii State 9 10 Judiciary that would reveal the outcomes of individuals released into the community pending trial; now, therefore, 11 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Criminal Justice 15 Research Institute, in collaboration with the Judiciary and 16 Department of Public Safety, is requested to compile and report 17 18 data on the outcomes of individuals released into the community pending trial, to include the numbers and percentages of 19 individuals who met bail; were on supervised release; or were 20 21 released on recognizance and who, while pending trial, 22 subsequently were arrested for committing new crimes, failed to appear at a required court appearance, or other adverse 23 24 outcomes; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Criminal Justice Research 27 Institute is requested to submit a report on the pretrial data 28 to the Legislature by December 1, 2023, and it is requested that 29 the report be made publicly available and posted on the Criminal Justice Research Institute's website; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the 33 Hawaii Supreme Court, Director of Public Safety, Director of the 34 35 Criminal Justice Research Institute, Administrator of the Criminal Justice Data Center, and Oversight Coordinator of the 36 37 Hawaii Correctional System Oversight Commission. 38 39 Kal Rhonh 40 OFFERED BY:
