## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTIES TO DEVOTE SUFFICIENT FUNDING TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTY ETHICS BOARDS OR COMMISSIONS.

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives adopted House esolution No. 9, Regular Session of 2022, to establish the commission to Improve Standards of Conduct (Commission); and
WHEREAS, the Commission was tasked to ensure state laws and ules relating to standards of conduct of public officers and mployees contain clear standards, enforcement, and penalties nd provide recommendations to increase awareness of, compliance ith, and deterrent effects of the Code of Ethics, lobbying aws, campaign finance laws, and other relevant laws and rules; nd
WHEREAS, the strength and stability of our democratic overnment rely upon the public's trust in government nstitutions, including the expectation that officers act thically with prudence, integrity, and sound judgment; and WHEREAS, an essential goal of the Commission was to provide ecommendations that would help restore public trust in state overnment and increase the level of transparency in its
WHEREAS, the Commission convened regularly throughout 2022 o diligently review, discuss, and consider the issues resented, submitted an interim report to the House of epresentatives outlining areas of immediate and long-term ocus, then continued its work with input from the public and ertain individuals and agencies to issue a final report with arious recommendations and accompanying proposed legislation; nd



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WHEREAS, many of the county ethics boards or commissions 1 lack the necessary resources to adequately meet their 2 constitutionally mandated obligations; and 3 4 WHEREAS, limited or no staffing prevents these county 5 ethics boards or commissions from sufficiently investigating 6 7 complaints, providing advice to current county employees, or offering trainings on how to follow the pertinent code of 8 9 ethics; now, therefore, 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 12 House of Representatives concurring, that the counties are urged 13 14 to devote sufficient funding to their respective county ethics boards or commissions; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Executive Director 18 and General Counsel of the Hawaii State Ethics Commission, Chair 19 20 of the Hawaii State Ethics Commission, City and County of Honolulu Mayor, County of Maui Mayor, County of Kauai Mayor, 21 County of Hawaii Mayor, Chair of the Honolulu City Council, 22 Executive Director and Legal Counsel of the City and County of 23 Honolulu Ethics Commission, Chair of the Maui County Council, 24 Chair of the County of Maui Board of Ethics, Chair of the Kauai 25 County Council, Chair of the County of Kauai Board of Ethics, 26 Chair of the County of Hawaii Board of Ethics, and Chair of the 27 County of Hawaii County Council. 28 29 30 31
