
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A SUNSET MEMORIAL PARK WORKING GROUP
TO STUDY POTENTIAL SOLUTIONS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR A
LONG-TERM MANAGEMENT PLAN, FOR SUNSET MEMORIAL PARK.

1 WHEREAS, Sunset Memorial Park in Pearl City, Oahu, has been
2 neglected for years and has been the subject of numerous
3 complaints by people who have family members buried there; and
4

5 WHEREAS, the years of neglect have led to a damaged
6 mausoleum, sinking graves, and overgrown grass and bushes that
7 cover up hundreds of graves, making it nearly impossible to
8 access some graves; and
9

10 WHEREAS, due to the lack of security, Sunset Memorial Park
11 is often the target of vandalism, with thieves displacing ashes
12 from copper urns to sell the urns and homeless encampments
13 accidentally setting fire to the area; and
14

15 WHEREAS, the company that owns Sunset Memorial Park
16 involuntarily dissolved in 2006 and the company's owner passed
17 away in 2011, leaving the property in legal limbo; and
18

19 WHEREAS, since the passing of the property's owner,
20 maintenance of Sunset Memorial Park has relied solely on
21 volunteers to clean up and care for the cemetery; and
22

23 WHEREAS, the Legislature enacted Act 193, Session Laws of
24 Hawaii 2018 (Act 193), in response to the overwhelming number of
25 volunteers at Sunset Memorial Park, to limit liability for
26 volunteers maintaining or repairing cemetery grounds; and
27

28 WHEREAS, Act 193 further required the Department of
29 Commerce and Consumer Affairs, in consultation with the
30 Department of Accounting and General Services, to develop short-



1 term and long-term strategies for the upkeep, repair, and
2 maintenance of Sunset Memorial Park; and

3

4 WHEREAS, as a result of Act 193, the Department of Commerce
5 and Consumer Affairs worked with a surveyor to map the cemetery
6 and create a website and database to help identify graves at
7 Sunset Memorial Park; and

8

9 WHEREAS, the report from the Department of Commerce and
10 Consumer Affairs concluded that once inventory and mapping of
11 the cemetery are complete, the Department will explore viable
12 long-term options for the cemetery, such as deeming Sunset
13 Memorial Park as a dissolved corporation under state law,
14 exercising certain powers to settle any unfinished business and
15 affairs of the cemetery, and distributing the cemetery's assets
16 after identifying those with a legal interest in the cemetery;
17 and

19 WHEREAS, almost five years have passed since the enactment
20 of Act 193; and

21

22 WHEREAS, although the Department of Commerce and Consumer
23 Affairs has created a website and database to facilitate grave
24 identification and has explored options for the cemetery, there
25 is still no long-term plan or legal and physical solution for
26 the issues at the cemetery; and

27

28 WHEREAS, the dilapidated, unsightly state of Sunset
29 Memorial Park is of great concern for the families whose loved
30 ones are buried there and the surrounding community; now,
31 therefore,

32

33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second
34 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the
35 House of Representatives concurring, that a Sunset Memorial Park
36 Working Group is requested to be convened to:

37

38 (1) Study potential solutions for the legal and physical
39 situation at Sunset Memorial Park and make
40 recommendations for a long-term management plan; and

1 (2) Follow up with the Department of Commerce and Consumer
2 Affairs on any developments since the enactment of Act
3 193; and
4

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sunset Memorial Park
6 Working Group is requested to comprise the following members:
7

8 (1) One member of the Senate, selected by the President of
9 the Senate, who shall serve as Co-Chairperson of the
10 Working Group;
11

12 (2) One member of the House of Representatives, selected
13 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, who
14 shall serve as Co-Chairperson of the Working Group;
15

16 (3) The Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, or the
17 Director's designee;
18

19 (4) The Comptroller, or the Comptroller's designee;
20

21 (5) The Attorney General, or the Attorney General's
22 designee;
23

24 (6) One member from the Pearl City Neighborhood Board,
25 selected by the Co-Chairpersons; and
26

27 (7) One member from Friends for Sunset Memorial Park
28 Cemetery, selected by the Co-Chairpersons; and
29

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sunset Memorial Park
31 Working Group is requested to submit a report of its findings
32 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
33 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
34 the Regular Session of 2024; and
35

36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and
37 Consumer Affairs is requested to prepare the report and provide
38 any necessary administrative support to the Sunset Memorial Park
39 Working Group; and
40

41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
42 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce



1 and Consumer Affairs, Comptroller, Attorney General, Chair of
2 the Pearl City Neighborhood Board, and Friends for Sunset
3 Memorial Park Cemetery.
