SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONDUCT AN ASSESSMENT REPORT TO EVALUATE THE FEASIBILITY AND PRACTICALITY OF IMPLEMENTING HIGHER LEVELS OF COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE FOR THE GENERAL AVIATION INDUSTRY AND HELICOPTER OPERATIONS AT AIRPORTS IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the Legislature seeks to promote the highest 1 levels of safety in the general aviation industry and in the 2 operation of helicopters in the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, higher levels of required commercial general 5 liability insurance may be associated with increased private 6 sector incentives to adopt national or worldwide best practices; 7 and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Airports Council International - North America 10 conducted a study to assist airports in assessing the adequacy 11 of insurance coverage requirements beginning in 2006, which 12 identified general liability limits ranging from a minimum value 13 of \$1,000,000 at airports such as San Francisco International 14 Airport to a maximum value of \$300,000,000 at John F. Kennedy 15 International Airport; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Legislature seeks to assess and evaluate the 18 feasibility and practicality of implementing higher levels of 19 commercial general liability insurance for the general aviation 20 industry and helicopter operations at airports in the State; 21 now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 24 25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 26 Transportation is requested to conduct an assessment report to 27 28 evaluate the feasibility and practicality of implementing higher 29 levels of commercial general liability insurance for the general 2023-1971 SCR SMA.docx
