SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE TO INCREASE ACCESS TO WI-FI IN PUBLIC PARKS THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

WHEREAS, access to the Internet is essential for life in 1 2 the twenty-first century, which is increasingly reliant on digital technology; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the coronavirus pandemic 2019 highlighted the 5 importance of digital connectivity, as people were forced to 6 depend on the Internet to connect with basic educational, 7 8 occupational, and health care services; and 9 10 WHEREAS, as the State exits the pandemic, many businesses and government organizations are continuing to expand options 11 for accessing services remotely to increase efficiency and 12 improve public health; and 13 14 WHEREAS, rural and neighbor island communities often lack 15 the same basic infrastructure that urban residents enjoy, making 16 the development of systems for remotely accessing public 17 services an urgent matter of social and economic equity; and 18 19 WHEREAS, while federal programs have been offered to assist 20 low-income families in paying for broadband technology, many 21 working families remain unable to afford the increasing monthly 22 cost of internet service because of Hawaii's high cost of 23 living; and 24 25 WHEREAS, numerous cities have begun installing Wi-Fi in 26 public parks to support internet access for underserved 27 communities, including the cities of Los Angeles, California and 28 Indianapolis, Indiana; and 29 30

WHEREAS, in 2016, the Department of Commerce and Consumer 1 Affairs designated the location of one hundred new Spectrum Wi-2 Fi hotspots at public parks, civic and community centers, and 3 other gathering places as part of a court order approving the 4 5 transfer of Oceanic Time Warner Cable to Charter Communications; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, the State has identified strengthening digital equity as a strategic imperative in the development of a modern 9 economy for local residents and future generations; now, 10 11 therefore, 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Broadband 15 and Digital Equity Office is requested to increase access to Wi-16 Fi in public parks throughout the State; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant 20 Governor, State Broadband Coordinator, and Mayor of the City and 21 County of Honolulu, and Mayors of the Counties of Hawaii, Maui, 22 and Kauai. 23 24 25 26
