## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO CREATE A PLAN FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A MARITIME COLLEGE AND TO ESTABLISH A MARITIME COLLEGE.

WHEREAS, the maritime industry is the most important part 1 2 of the State's critical supply chain and a long-standing source of family-sustaining union jobs; and 3 4 WHEREAS, there is a shortage of licensed mariners in the 5 6 State; and 7 WHEREAS, employers more frequently hire licensed mariners 8 who have graduated with a baccalaureate degree from an 9 accredited maritime college; and 10 11 WHEREAS, maritime colleges award baccalaureate degrees and 12 prepare students for International Convention on Standards of 13 Training, Certification and Watchkeeping for Seafarers 14 certification and licensing by the United States Coast Guard; 15 16 and 17 WHEREAS, there is no maritime college in Hawaii; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents must leave the State to receive 21 the education necessary for a maritime career; and 22 23 WHEREAS, maritime colleges are routinely highly ranked in degree value and social mobility; and 24 25 WHEREAS, maritime colleges have an outstanding reputation 26 for offering career pathways that improve the economic 27 conditions of frontline and marginalized communities; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii is the premier higher 30 education institution in the State and serves the intellectual, 31

educational, research, and workforce development interests of 1 the people of Hawaii; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the establishment of a maritime college as part of 4 the University of Hawaii System would encourage the development 5 of a local workforce in maritime and related marine industries; 6 7 and 8 WHEREAS, a maritime college would provide valuable research 9 and workforce development in the areas of maritime studies, 10 marine transportation, marine engineering, marine biology, 11 environmental protection, oceanography, marine energy, 12 shipbuilding, marine communications systems, maritime policy and 13 law, labor studies, Polynesian voyaging, languages, and maritime 14 history; and 15 16 WHEREAS, a maritime college would also provide a well-17 rounded education in the arts, sciences, social sciences, and 18 Hawaiian studies, with a focus on oceans; and 19 20 WHEREAS, graduates from a maritime college would be well 21 prepared for United States Coast Guard deck and engine 22 licensing; now, therefore, 23 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 26 27 House of Representatives concurring, that the University of Hawaii is urged to convene a working group to create a plan for 28 the establishment of a maritime college; and 29 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to consist of the following individuals: 32 33 The President of the University of Hawaii System, or 34 (1)35 the President's designee; 36 37 (2) The Vice President for Academic Strategy of the University of Hawaii, or the Vice President's 38 designee; 39 40

(3) Plans to secure a traditional land grant as well as an 1 important natural harbor areas land grant; 2 3 Potential federal grant funding sources; (4) 4 5 (5) The development of a comprehensive accreditation 6 7 strategy; 8 The maritime college's curriculum, including the 9 (6) 10 incorporation of union apprenticeships; and 11 (7) The administrative structure of the maritime college; 12 13 and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 15 to submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and 16 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later 17 than December 1, 2023; and 18 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body urges the University of Hawaii to establish a maritime college as soon as possible 21 and in appropriate consultation with the working group; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the University of Hawaii System, Regional Director of the Hawaii 26 27 Region of the Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific, President of the International Longshore and Warehouse Union Local 142, 28 29 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, 30 Comptroller, Director of Transportation, Maritime Administrator 31 of the United States Maritime Administration, and each member of Hawaii's congressional delegation. 32
