## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO WORK IN COLLABORATION TO PRESERVE THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF SPECIAL NEEDS INMATES AND OTHERS IN THE STATE'S JAILS AND PRISONS.

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is statutorily
required to provide mental health services to inmates in
community correctional centers; and

5 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is also 6 statutorily required to develop and make available gender-7 responsive, community-based programs for women offenders by 8 providing them with the appropriate range of opportunities to 9 ensure that their needs are met, including programs designed to 10 provide substance abuse and mental health treatments, as 11 appropriate; and

WHEREAS, to preserve the health and safety of inmates and others, the Department of Public Safety has adopted a corrections administration policy that establishes communication guidelines between the facility administrator and treating clinicians or their designees regarding significant medical and mental health needs of inmates prior to transfers or programming; and

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21 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is transitioning 22 into a rehabilitative and therapeutic model of corrections 23 administration, and therefore, there is a need to revise the 24 training programs for its line correctional officers with 25 increased focus on the administration of inmates who are 26 contending with a myriad of mental health and behavioral issues; 27 and

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WHEREAS, the Department of Health has expertise in 1 identifying and addressing mental health and behavioral issues, 2 including provision of mental health education, treatment, and 3 rehabilitation services; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Department of Public 6 Safety can work together to address various issues relating to 7 inmates in the State's jails and prisons with medical or mental 8 health disabilities or disorders that interfere with the ability . 9 10 to carry out normal activities (identified as "special needs inmates" by the Department of Public Safety); and 11 12 WHEREAS, the line staff of the Department of Public Safety 13 would benefit greatly from receiving training from the 14 Department of Health on the subject of mental health and 15 behavioral issues; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, a collaboration between the Department of Health and Department of Public Safety to preserve the health and 19 20 safety of special needs inmates and others in the State's jails and prisons would benefit both departments as well as the larger 21 22 community; now, therefore, 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the 25 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 26 27 Health and Department of Public Safety, and as of January 1, 2024, its successor, the Department of Corrections and 28 29 Rehabilitation, are requested to work in collaboration to preserve the health and safety of special needs inmates and 30 31 others in the State's jails and prisons; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Corrections System Oversight Commission is requested to provide oversight of the 34 collaboration between the departments to ensure the well-being 35 36 of special needs inmates and that their significant medical and 37 mental health needs are being adequately addressed; and 38

of Health, Director of Public Safety, and Oversight Coordinator
of the Hawaii Correctional System Oversight Commission.
