SENATE RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE FOURTH SECTOR OF THE ECONOMY AS COMPLEMENT TO THE THREE TRADITIONAL SECTORS, AND THE GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF FOR-BENEFIT ORGANIZATIONS IN PROMOTING SUSTAINABLE AND EQUITABLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 crisis deepened
 existing structural flaws in Hawaii's economy, demonstrating how
 global events can have an outsized negative impact on Hawaii's
 island communities; and

- 6 WHEREAS, there is growing public demand to address the 7 systemic failures underlying the current economy by 8 transitioning to a new economic model that is more resilient, 9 inclusive, and sustainable, and that invests in and builds 10 locally-owned and stewarded assets; and
- WHEREAS, there is a growing movement of for-benefit 12 13 enterprises in Hawaii and around the world that aim primarily to achieve social or environmental objectives while also generating 14 15 revenue, thus promoting the achievement of sustainable development; advancing human rights; producing decent and 16 quality jobs; promoting the economic empowerment of women; 17 combating climate change; and eradicating poverty, exclusion, 18 and social inequalities; and 19
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21 WHEREAS, for-benefit enterprises come in a wide range of models, including purpose-driven businesses, social enterprises, 22 Native Hawaiian culturally-informed businesses, cooperatives, 23 community-owned enterprises, public benefit corporations, 24 community development banks, and regenerative businesses, and 25 they strive to uphold regional- and place-based environmental, 26 social, and cultural values in their core business, governance, 27 and financial models; and 28

30 WHEREAS, globally and in Hawaii, there is a growing 31 movement of intermediaries, investors, and funders who seek to 32 invest in for-profit businesses, consumers who seek to purchase 33 from for-benefit producers, and workers seeking jobs with for-34 benefit firms; and



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1 2 WHEREAS, with mounting awareness and engagement in the fourth sector of the economy, innovators across business, 3 government, finance, civil society, philanthropy, academia, and 4 other spheres are advancing a range of interventions to 5 encourage, incentivize, and enable all for-benefit enterprises 6 7 to become more sustainable and accountable, and to scale their positive impacts on society and the environment, thus delivering 8 on the promise of sustainable economic development; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the realization of the promise of the fourth 11 sector of the economy necessitates a deliberate approach to 12 align and accelerate the efforts of stakeholders to build a 13 supportive ecosystem for for-benefit businesses; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, such an approach would advance a sustainable, inclusive, and more efficient and resilient capitalism model for 17 18 Hawaii, by blending the power of entrepreneurship and dynamism of market economies with the social purpose and public-welfare 19 priorities of the nonprofit and public sectors; now, therefore, 20 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 23 24 that this body recognizes the importance of the fourth sector of 25 the economy as complement to the three traditional sectors, and the growth and development of for-benefit organizations in 26 27 promoting sustainable and equitable economic development; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is requested to convene a Fourth Sector Working 30 31 Group; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following individuals, or their respective designees, are requested to serve as members of 34 35 the Fourth Sector Working Group: 36 The Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, who is 37 (1)38 requested to serve as the convening chair; 39 Faculty members from the University of Hawaii System 40 (2) 41 with relevant scientific expertise; 42



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1 (3) Two members of the Senate and two members of the House of Representatives, to be appointed by the President 2 of the Senate and Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives, respectively; and 4 5 (4)Representatives from the private and public sector 6 actively working in the emerging fourth sector of the 7 economy in Hawaii; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the initial Fourth Sector 10 Working Group members are requested to elect a chair from among 11 12 its members; and 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chair of the Fourth Sector 14 15 Working Group may invite other interested parties with relevant experience to join the Working Group; provided that the Working 16 Group is requested not to exceed fifteen members; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fourth Sector Working Group is requested to develop a long-term strategic plan to identify 20 opportunities, challenges, best practices, and enabling policies 21 for developing a sustainable and thriving fourth sector of the 22 23 economy in Hawaii; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fourth Sector Working 25 26 Group's strategic plan is requested to consider how to: 27 (1) Enhance knowledge on the emerging fourth sector of the 28 29 economy of Hawaii and its supportive ecosystem through research and data collection; 30 31 32 (2) Develop more enabling policy and regulatory environments for the fourth sector of the economy in 33 Hawaii; 34 35 Fast-track, support, and promote existing and new for-36 (3) benefit businesses, financial models, and investment 37 structures; 38 39 40 (4)Increase educational and training opportunities for students and practitioners in areas related to the 41 fourth sector of the economy; 42

12 13 14	(7)	Mobilize financial and other resources to for-benefit organizations and fourth sector ecosystem development;
14 15 16 17 18 19	(8)	Develop mechanisms for assessing and monitoring the social and environmental impacts of for-benefit organizations and ensuring their accountability to their stakeholders;
20 21 22 23	(9)	Support community and statewide capacity building and ecosystem development efforts to accelerate growth of the fourth sector of the economy in Hawaii;
24 25	(10)	Create a designated home and focal point for the fourth sector within state government; and
26 27 28	(11)	Coordinate and collaborate nationally and globally on fourth sector development and trade; and
 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38 39 40 	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fourth Sector Working Group is requested to submit a preliminary report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024, and a final report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Fourth Sector Working Group is requested to dissolve on June 30, 2025; and
