SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO ESTABLISH A 2023 ASIA-PACIFIC ECONOMIC COOPERATION HAWAII DELEGATION TEAM TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 2023 ASIA-PACIFIC ECONOMIC COOPERATION EVENTS IN SEATTLE AND SAN FRANCISCO.

1 WHEREAS, the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) is a 2 regional economic forum established in 1989 that aims to create 3 greater prosperity for the people of the region by promoting 4 balanced, inclusive, sustainable, innovative, and secure growth 5 and by accelerating regional economic integration; and 6

7 WHEREAS, APEC is the only international intergovernmental 8 grouping in the world committed to reducing barriers to trade 9 and investment without requiring its members to enter into 10 legally binding obligations, but endeavors to achieve its goals 11 by promoting dialogue and arriving at decisions on a consensus 12 basis, giving equal weight to the views of all members; and 13

WHEREAS, APEC's twenty-one member economies, comprised of 14 Australia; Brunei Darussalam; Canada; Chile; People's Republic 15 of China; Hong Kong, China; Indonesia; Japan; Republic of Korea; 16 Malaysia; Mexico; New Zealand; Papua New Guinea; Peru; The 17 Philippines; The Russian Federation; Singapore; Chinese Taipei; 18 19 Thailand; United States of America; and Vietnam, represent over 20 forty percent of the world's population and over fifty percent of the world's trade; and 21

WHEREAS, Seattle, Washington is the headquarters for the
National Center for APEC, which includes the top fifty American
Blue Chip corporations; and

WHEREAS, in August 2023, the National Center for APEC in 27 Seattle will host the APEC Ministerial and United States Senior 28 29 Official Meetings to showcase the United States' economic 30 leadership in the Asia-Pacific region, with the theme of having cultural and language diversity and highlighting indigenous 31 Americans, Native Americans, Asian Americans, and Pacific 32 33 Islanders throughout the communities of the Asia-Pacific region; 34 and



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1 2 WHEREAS, from November 12, 2023 to November 14, 2023, APEC Summit meetings will be held in San Francisco, California; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii is actively seeking to expand its 5 international ties and has an abiding interest in developing 6 7 friendship, goodwill, and economic and educational relations between the people of Hawaii and the people of Asia-Pacific 8 regional economies; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the State would be able to expand these ties and 11 further develop connections in the Asia-Pacific region by 12 participating in the 2023 APEC Events; now, therefore, 13 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 16 that the Governor is requested to establish a 2023 APEC Hawaii 17 18 delegation team to participate in the 2023 APEC Events; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 2023 APEC Hawaii delegation 20 21 team is requested to: 22 Help to pass the torch during the Opening Ceremony of 23 (1) the November 2023 APEC Summit; 24 25 (2) Serve as the Welcome Committee with the "Aloha Spirit" 26 and open an Expo Pavilion to showcase the Hawaiian 27 "Aloha" goods and services and participate in the 2023 28 29 APEC trade-shows during the APEC events in Seattle and San Francisco; and 30 31 (3) Use APEC Hawaii's strategic business plans to have 32 trade show engagements during the 2023 APEC events in 33 Seattle and San Francisco; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the East West Center of Hawaii is 36 requested to coordinate with Native Hawaiians and South Pacific 37 38 Islanders to participate during the APEC Ministerial and United States Senior Official meetings in Seattle in August, 2023; and 39 40 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to coordinate 42



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with the Hawaii Tourism Authority; Chamber of Commerce Hawaii; 1 and neighbor island chambers of commerce to recommend trade show 2 participants from Hawaii to be included in the APEC Hawaii 3 4 delegation team; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chamber of Commerce Hawaii 6 7 is requested to work closely with ethnic chambers of commerce, including but not limited to chambers of commerce from Japan, 8 the Philippines, People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, 9 10 Vietnam, Hong Kong, Singapore, India, and Thailand, to ensure that ethnic chambers of commerce in Hawaii receive equal 11 representation and may voice concerns; and 12 13

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 14 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States; 15 Governor; Director of Business, Economic Development, and 16 Tourism; Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Tourism 17 Authority; President of the East-West Center at the University 18 of Hawaii; and Executive Director of Chamber of Commerce Hawaii. 19 20

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
