SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS TO RELOCATE ALL LIVE FIRE TRAINING AND AVIATION ACTIVITY AWAY FROM PUULOA RANGE TRAINING FACILITY.

WHEREAS, the facility now known as Puuloa Range Training 1 Facility was transferred from the United States Army to the 2 United States Navy between 1915 and 1916; and 3 4 WHEREAS, during the Vietnam era, the facility supported 5 long-range sniper training until the training was moved in 1979 6 to what is now called Marine Corps Base Hawaii, in Kaneohe; and 7 8 WHEREAS, after the sniper training exercises were relocated 9 to Kaneohe, Iroquois Point was connected to Ewa Beach via an 10 access road mauka of the training facility, allowing TheBus to 11 service Iroquois Point; and 12 13 WHEREAS, in 2011, the Marine Corps doubled the length of 14 Puuloa Range Training Facility's Alpha Range, the range closest 15 to the Ewa Beach community, and re-established sniper training 16 at the facility, without seeking community input or conducting 17 an environmental assessment; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the expansion of the range and reinstatement of 20 sniper training forced the closure of the access road and 21 termination of TheBus service to Iroquois Point, eliminating a 22 tsunami evacuation route: and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, since the reinstatement of sniper training at Puuloa Range Training Facility, the facility's public address 26 system and shooting exercises have prompted hundreds of noise 27 28 complaints from the surrounding community; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the United States Marine Corps recently announced that Puuloa Range Training Facility will be used as a night 31 landing zone for the Marine Corps' helicopters, which will 32 significantly increase noise pollution outside of the facility's 33 regular hours; and 34

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WHEREAS, persistent noise pollution, like that experienced 1 by residents who live near the training facility, can cause 2 hearing loss, increase the risk of miscarriages or low birth 3 weight, and can cause or exacerbate cardiovascular disease, type 4 two diabetes, sleep disturbances, mental health impairments, 5 childhood learning delays, and other health, developmental, and 6 behavioral issues; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the open-air ranges at Puuloa Range Training 9 10 Facility also create the risk of a stray bullet, ricochet, or an accidental weapons discharge impacting nearby schools, churches, 11 homes, and parks; and 12 13 WHEREAS, in 2020, range gunfire was mistaken for an active 14 15 shooter situation, causing lockdowns at nearby schools; and 16 17 WHEREAS, environmental studies of the area surrounding 18 Puuloa Range Training Facility have shown lead contamination 19 that is more than seventy times the legal limit; and 20 21 WHEREAS, environmental studies have also found that there is a high risk of munitions constituents, materials originating 22 from unexploded ordnance, migrating to nearshore waters, 23 adjacent parks, and nearby homes; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands recently 26 27 announced the planned construction of approximately six hundred homes for Native Hawaiians on land directly adjacent to the 28 29 Puuloa Range Training Facility; and 30 WHEREAS, the Native Hawaiian families who reside in these 31 32 homes will disproportionately bear the risks of noise pollution, environmental pollution, and the possibility of stray qunfire 33 unless the United States Marine Corps relocates shooting 34 35 exercises and aviation activity and carries out environmental remediation; and 36 37 38 WHEREAS, the First Responder Campus in Mililani and Camp Blaz sniper training facility on Guam are currently under 39 construction, offering possible alternatives for military and 40 non-military training; and 41 42



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WHEREAS, alternatively, the United States Marine Corps 1 could relocate sniper training to Marine Corps Base Hawaii, as 2 it did in 1979; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the United States Marine Corps' plan to move four 5 of Puuloa Range Training Facility's firing ranges inland to help 6 mitigate coastal erosion does not adequately address the 7 community's concerns about environmental harm, noise pollution, 8 and the dangers associated with the facility's open-air ranges; 9 now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 13 that the United States Marine Corps is urged to relocate all 14 live fire training and aviation activity away from Puuloa Range 15 16 Training Facility; and 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 18 Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of Defense, 19 Commandant of the Marine Corps, and United States Marine Corps 20 Forces Pacific Commander. 21 22 OFFERED BY: Kurt Ferlba 23 24
