SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP A WRITTEN PLAN FOR EVERY PUBLIC SCHOOL ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, AND HIGH SCHOOL TO PROVIDE A UNIT OF INSTRUCTION IN ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER HISTORY AS PART OF THEIR REQUIRED CURRICULUM, COMMENCING WITH THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR.

WHEREAS, because of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic, 1 2 there has been a sharp increase in discrimination against Asians in the United States; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there is also an increased awareness of the issues that Pacific Islander Americans, especially migrants from 6 Compacts of Free Association (COFA) nations, continue to face, 7 especially the lack of access to health care; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the State's current K-12 school curriculum fails to adequately teach Asian American and Pacific Islander history, 11 particularly regarding the impact of historical discrimination 12 of the United States against Asians and Pacific Islanders, such 13 as the 1882 Chinese Exclusion Act, the internment of Japanese-14 Americans during World War II, and the displacement of and 15 detrimental health impacts to Pacific Islanders that resulted 16 from the nuclear testing, mining, and establishment of United 17 States military-industrial complexes across the Melanesian, 18 Micronesian, and Polynesian islands; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, oftentimes, Asian Americans are held as the "model minority", a mythos that only serves to justify discriminatory 22 practices against other minorities and ignores the countless 23 sacrifices of early Asian immigrants; and 24 25 WHEREAS, there is widespread negative public perception of 26 Pacific Islander Americans in the State, especially COFA 27 migrants as they are wrongfully perceived as a drain on 28 29 resources and continue to face discrimination in access to housing, education, and employment; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, teaching students about the contributions of Asian 1 American and Pacific Islander communities to the economic, 2 cultural, social, and political development of the United States 3 could be greatly beneficial and would allow students to feel 4 empowered and to understand their ethnic identities as well as 5 6 their personal civic duty; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 10 that the Department of Education is requested to convene a working group to develop a written plan for every public 11 12 elementary, middle, and high school to provide a unit of instruction in Asian American and Pacific Islander history as 13 part of each school's required curriculum, commencing with the 14 2024-2025 school year; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 18 to consist of members invited by the Superintendent of Education; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan developed by the 21 working group is requested to include how: 22 23 The Board of Education will incorporate in its 24 (1)25 curriculum a unit of instruction on the events of Asian American and Pacific Islander history, including 26 27 the history of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders 28 in Hawaii, contributions of Asian Americans and 29 Pacific Islanders toward advancing civil rights from the 19th century onward, and contributions of the 30 Asian American and Pacific Islander communities to the 31 cultural, economic, political, and social development 32 of the United States; and 33 34 (2)The Superintendent of Education will prepare and make 35 36 available to all school complex areas instructional material, including but not limited to instructional 37 material established by non-governmental sources that 38 39 shall be the quidelines for development of the Asian American and Pacific Islander history education in 40 each school; and 41 42



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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in addition to teaching students about Asian American and Pacific Islander history, the 2 updated curriculum is requested to include a unit of instruction 3 about how race shapes power structures and lived experience to 4 5 further teach students about their civic duty; and 6

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each school complex area is 7 requested to determine the minimum amount of instructional time 8 that qualifies as a unit of instruction in Asian American and 9 Pacific Islander history; and 10

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of Education 12 13 is requested to monitor each school complex area's compliance with the Asian American and Pacific Islander history curriculum 14 requirements during their annual compliance visit; and 15 16

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Board of Education, the 18 Superintendent of Education, and the superintendents of each 19 complex area in the State. 20

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
