SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF A CONTINUOUS LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

WHEREAS, the legislative process allows Hawaii's people to 1 engage with policy to create meaningful change for the State; 2 and 3 4 WHEREAS, pursuant to article III, section 10, of the Hawaii 5 State Constitution, the Legislature only has sixty to seventy-6 7 five session days, generally stretching from the middle of January until early May to conduct its business during a regular 8 9 session; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the compressed, rushed legislative process may 11 12 inhibit the public from participating and advocating at the 13 Legislature; and 14 WHEREAS, individuals who are not full-time employed in 15 16 advocacy may have an easier time participating in the 17 legislative process if the timetable and deadlines were not as 18 compressed; and 19 20 WHEREAS, efficiency, productivity, orderliness, and transparency of the Legislature could be improved by requiring 21 that the Legislature be in session during every month of the 22 23 year; and 24 25 WHEREAS, creating greater transparency of the legislative process for State's citizens will allow more individuals to 26 engage in the policymaking process while also creating more 27 28 opportunities for legislators to make informed policy decisions; now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 31 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 32 that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to conduct a 33 study on the feasibility of a continuous legislative session; 34 35 and 36



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to 1 examine functions of continuous legislatures in other states in 2 comparison to Hawaii; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is also requested to 5 6 determine, if any, an increase in productivity of the legislative session by allowing more time for the legislative 7 8 process; and : . 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 10 Bureau is requested to submit the study to the Legislature no 11 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 12 Session of 2024; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 15 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Legislative 16 Reference Bureau. 17 18 19 20 45th C OFFERED BY:
