## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU AND DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO CREATE A COMMUNITY RESILIENCE PLAN FOR DISASTER PREPAREDNESS ALONG THE WAIANAE COAST.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for government agencies to plan 1 2 for responses to natural and human-caused emergencies, including but not limited to emergencies resulting from tsunamis, 3 wildfires, hurricanes, and hazardous material leaks and spills; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii is unique in its emergency management 8 situation due to its remote and isolated locale in the northern Pacific Ocean; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Waianae coast is particularly isolated due to 11 its geographic location on the west side of Oahu with a four-12 lane highway serving as the only entrance and exit in and out of 13 the community, which stretches twelve miles from Nanakuli to 14 Kaena Point; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the forty-eight thousand community members of the 17 Waianae coast are served by just one primary emergency medical 18 center, the Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center, with 19 Queen's Medical Center-West Oahu located approximately twenty 20 miles from the Makaha and Makua areas; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the Waianae coast has seen extreme weather before, including in 1996 where a fifteen-day rain event produced 24 twenty-four inches of rain in Makaha Valley where annual 25 rainfall normally ranges from twenty to forty inches, and in 26 December 2008, where a storm produced twelve inches of rain 27 within one day causing Farrington Highway to be impassable for 28 29 several hours; now, therefore, 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 31 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 32 33 that the City and County of Honolulu and Department of Emergency Management of the City and County of Honolulu are requested to 34

create a community resilience plan for disaster preparedness 1 2 along the Waianae coast; and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Waianae coast resilience 4 5 plan is requested to: 6 7 (1) Be community-based and developed in collaboration with local businesses and residents; 8 9 10 (2) Inventory all services, tools, food, shelter, water, medicines, and other resources available that would 11 enable the community to be self-sufficient for a 12 period of three days; and 13 14 15 (3) Be developed in consultation with the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of 20 Honolulu and Director of the Department of Emergency Management 21 of the City and County of Honolulu. 22 23 24 OFFERED BY:
