## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO PERFORM A FEASIBILITY STUDY OF THE BENEFITS OF AUTHORIZING REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES PROVIDED THROUGH TELEHEALTH BY WAY OF AUDIO-ONLY TELEPHONIC COMMUNICATION.

WHEREAS, telehealth has served as a lifeline of access to 1 2 essential health care services for residents with adequate broadband coverage and offers an affordable, convenient option 3 4 for patients; and 5 6 WHEREAS, however, many Hawaii residents who live in rural 7 and underprivileged communities are often cut off from receiving essential health care through telehealth because they lack the 8 9 broadband coverage necessary to access this care; and 10 WHEREAS, furthermore, elderly residents and others who may 11 have limited digital literacy may have difficulties accessing 12 telehealth services through the Internet; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the use of standard telephone contact in 15 telehealth during the COVID-19 pandemic demonstrated the 16 effectiveness of this tool as a mode of essential health care 17 18 delivery, especially for residents living in rural, isolated, and underprivileged communities; and 19 20 WHEREAS, medical professionals have used standard telephone 21 22 contacts for decades to provide necessary access to primary care when a patient is homebound or otherwise unable to access in-23 person or face-to-face care; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 26 27 continues to authorize coverage of audio-only (telephone) telehealth services used in the treatment of mental health and 28 substance abuse in certain circumstances, allowing federally 29 30 qualified health centers and rural health clinics to use telehealth to care for patients in patients' homes; and 31

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2 WHEREAS, it is important to ensure equitable access to 3 telephonic and telehealth services for patients who are covered 4 by private insurance with those who are covered by managed care 5 plans; and 6 WHEREAS, developing a provider reimbursement system that 7 also incorporates reimbursement for telephonic services, 8 including audio-only communication, would increase access to and 9 encourage greater utilization of mental health services through 10 telephonic telehealth; now, therefore, 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 14 that the Department of Health is urged to perform a feasibility 15 study of the benefits of authorizing reimbursement for services 16 provided through telehealth by way of audio-only telephonic 17 18 communication; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is urged to report to the Legislature with the results of its 21 22 feasibility study, including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the Regular Session of 2024; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 25 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health. 26 27 28 29 OFFERED BY:
