SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES MED-QUEST DIVISION TO EXPAND THE TYPES OF QUALIFIED PROVIDERS ALLOWED TO PROVIDE LACTATION CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR THE MEDICAID POPULATION IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and 1 Prevention, breastfeeding has health benefits for babies and 2 mothers, as breast milk provides a baby with ideal nutrition, 3 supports growth and development, and can also help protect the 4 baby and mother against certain illnesses and diseases; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends 7 8 exclusive breastfeeding for about six months then continued breastfeeding while introducing complementary foods until a 9 child is at least twelve months old; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 12 13 Public Law 111-148, includes guidelines for coverage of breastfeeding support and counseling; and 14 15 WHEREAS, a lactation consultant is a certified health 16 professional who specializes in the clinical management of 17 breastfeeding and is trained to assist mothers in preventing and 18 solving breastfeeding difficulties, such as sore nipples and low 19 milk supply; and 20 21 WHEREAS, lactation consultants commonly work in hospitals, 22 physician or midwife practices, public health programs, and 23 private practice; and 24 25 WHEREAS, lactation consultants in the United States are 26 often nurses, midwives, nurse practitioners, dietitians, and 27 other health care professionals who have obtained additional 28 certification through the International Board of Lactation 29 Consultant Examiners or the Academy of Lactation Policy and 30 Practice's Certified Lactation Counselor Program; and 31



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1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's QUEST Integration Program, which provides 2 eligible low-income adults and children access to health and 3 medical coverage through managed care plans, does not currently 4 allow all qualified providers who have obtained International 5 Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners certification or 6 Certified Lactation Counselor certification to provide lactation 7 consultant services; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii's Medicaid population would greatly benefit 10 from increased access to lactation consultant services to assist 11 12 breastfeeding mothers; now, therefore, 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 14 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 15 that the Department of Human Services Med-QUEST Division is 16 17 requested to expand the types of qualified providers allowed to provide lactation consultant services for the Medicaid 18 population in the State; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to expand the types of 21 22 qualified providers, the Department of Human Services Med-QUEST Division is requested to take any steps necessary to obtain 23 necessary approvals, create internal processes, and credential 24 appropriate providers who have obtained International Board of 25 Lactation Consultant Examiners certification or Certified 26 Lactation Counselor certification; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 30 Services Med-QUEST Division is requested to submit a report to the Legislature on the steps taken and progress made in 31 expanding the types of providers who can provide lactation 32 33 consultant services no later than twenty days prior to the 34 convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services, 37 Director of Health, and Administrator of the Med-QUEST Division. 38

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
