SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH A BENEFICIAL TREATMENTS ADVISORY COUNCIL TO REVIEW, EVALUATE, AND RECOMMEND NEW MEDICINAL MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENTS.

1 WHEREAS, mental health conditions are treated in various 2 ways depending on the condition, including with medication, therapy, and psychosocial services; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, these treatments are effective for certain 6 conditions and patients but do not treat all mental health conditions; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, research supports natural and alternative medicines and therapies as safe and effective methods for 10 treating depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, addiction, 11 end-of-life psychological distress, and other afflictions; and 12 13 WHEREAS, due to their efficacy in treating treatment-14 resistant depression and post-traumatic stress disorder, 15 methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA) and psilocybin have each 16 17 been granted breakthrough therapy designation status, which fast-tracks research and potential approval of treatments, by 18 19 the United States Food and Drug Administration; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that the Department of Health is requested to establish a 23 Beneficial Treatments Advisory Council; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Beneficial Treatments 26 27 Advisory Council is requested to examine: 28 29 Federal, state, and local laws, regulations, (1)administrative rules, and procedures regarding 30 medicinal mental health treatments; 31 32 33 (2) Existing medical, psychological, and scientific studies, research, and information relating to the 34
