SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JUDICIARY TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON EXISTING LAWS, POLICIES, AND PROCEDURES THAT ARE DESIGNED TO ASSIST AND PROTECT PRO SE PARTIES WITH PHYSICAL AND INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES.

WHEREAS, it is in the State's best interest to address and 1 minimize challenges that people with disabilities face, 2 3 especially in legal proceedings; and 4 WHEREAS, nineteen percent of adults in Hawaii have a 5 disability; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, people with disabilities live in poverty at more than twice the rate of people without disabilities and are more 9 likely to face economic hardship due to a significant wage gap, 10 limited work opportunities, barriers to education, and 11 additional expenses; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, these financial constraints can make obtaining legal counsel unduly burdensome and often result in people with 15 disabilities having to represent themselves pro se in legal 16 17 matters; and 18 WHEREAS, legal proceedings in which there is a discrepancy 19 of legal representation between opposing parties, including 20 proceedings in which one party is represented by an attorney and 21 the other is pro se, can engender predatory or even abusive 22 23 behavior; and 24 WHEREAS, persons with disabilities are particularly 25 vulnerable to abuse and victimization due to physical, 26 27 intellectual, and emotional challenges, and some pro se parties with disabilities have reported bullying or harassment by the 28 29 opposing counsel; and 30 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State to reduce 31 the risk for abuse in legal proceedings for people with 32 disabilities and protect vulnerable pro se parties from undue 33 economic and mental duress; and 34

1 2 WHEREAS, to make informed policy decisions concerning the State's efforts to protect vulnerable populations in legal 3 4 proceedings, it is necessary to understand the State's existing laws, policies, and procedures that are intended to prevent 5 6 legal mistreatment; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 9 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that the Judiciary is requested to conduct a study on existing 10 11 laws, policies, and procedures that are designed to assist and protect pro se parties with physical and intellectual 12 disabilities; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Judiciary is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 16 recommendations for updating or strengthening protections for 17 pro se parties with disabilities, and any proposed legislation, 18 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 19 convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the Hawaii 23 Supreme Court, Administrative Director of the Courts, and Deputy 24 Administrative Director of the Courts. 25 26 27 len 28
