SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCORPORATE PLANT-BASED PROTEINS IN MEALS SERVED IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, a plant-based diet has been shown to reduce the 1 chance of developing diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and 2 cancers, among other things; and 3 4 WHEREAS, fifty percent of children between the ages of two 5 and fifteen already have fatty streaks in their arteries and 6 research shows that within ten years, half the nation will be 7 8 obese; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the average meat and dairy products served in school are highly processed and treated with antibiotics and 11 growth hormones, which can impact health outcomes; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the agricultural industry, including produce, 14 animals, and grain, generates approximately one fourth of all 15 greenhouse gas emissions; and 16 17 WHEREAS, an increase in plant-based protein consumption can 18 19 be beneficial not only to the health of Hawaii's students, but also to the environment; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the Department of Education is beginning to incorporate more plant-based and vegetarian options into school 23 24 menus at the request of students; now, therefore, 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 26 27 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that the Department of Education is urged to incorporate plant-28 based proteins in place of animal proteins in fifty percent of 29 30 meals served in public schools; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the 33 Board of Education, and Superintendent of Education. 34
