SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE OFFICE OF PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT TO DEVELOP A FOOD RESILIENCY PLAN FOR STATE OF EMERGENCIES CAUSED BY DISASTERS.

WHEREAS, the State heavily relies on imported commodities 1 for food consumption and production; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, many imported commodities arrive through harbors and airports that are directly in the inundation zone that will 5 be impacted in the event of a natural disaster; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, other than foodbanks, the State lacks a food and supplies stockpile that is ready and capable to handle the 9 aftermath of a natural disaster; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Department of Defense and the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency are tasked with natural disaster 13 14 response; and 15 WHEREAS, Central Oahu is home to Wheeler Airfield, the only 16 airfield outside of the inundation zone, that will become home 17 to the First Responders Technology Campus and Cybersecurity Data 18 Center; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the First Responders Technology Campus and 21 22 Cybersecurity Data Center may serve as a warehouse for stockpiles; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, to prevent further devastation during a natural disaster, a food stockpile may alleviate some of the stress on 26 foodbanks in the event vital harbors and airports are inundated; 27 now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 31 that the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development is urged 32 to develop a food resiliency plan for state of emergencies 33 caused by disasters; and 34 35



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Adjutant General, Director of the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development, and Administrator of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency.
