SB 736

Status & Testimony

RELATING TO HOUSING.

Allows the Hawaii Community Development Authority to approve the residential development on the nine parcels conveyed to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs pursuant to Act 15, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012. Raises the building height limit and increases the maximum floor area ratio for residential development on three of the nine parcels. Exempts the residential developments on the nine parcels from the requirement to dedicate public facilities of land or facilities, or cash payments in lieu thereof, as a condition of development; the prohibition on sale or assignment of fee simple interest in land in the Kakaako Community Development District; and the prohibition on residential development in the Kakaako Makai area. Appropriates funds for repairs of certain structures located on the nine parcels and for compensation relating to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs' pro rata portion of income and proceeds from the public land trust.

WTL/HWN, WAM/JDC

RELATING TO PUBLIC PARKING AT ALA WAI BOAT **SB 1034** WTL/HWN, WAM HARBOR. Status & Requires the maintenance of at least three hundred parking **Testimony** stalls at Ala Wai boat harbor at no cost for recreational ocean access and for the practice of traditional and customary Native Hawaiian rights. RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN TRADITIONAL AND WTL/HWN, JDC **SB 1036** CUSTOMARY FISHING PRACTICES. Status & Authorizes the department of land and natural resources to Testimony issue special activity permits for the purpose of recognizing and protecting individuals exercising their Native Hawaiian traditional and customary rights. HWN/WTL, WAM RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. **SB 1040** Requires the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to establish Status & the Kauhale Pilot Program on the Leeward Coast of Oahu to Testimony provide individual or shared micro housing units and services to homeless Native Hawaiian individuals and families who meet the definition of homeless under federal guidelines. Exempts low-income rentals, tiny home villages, and kauhale from certain provisions for the duration of their underlying leases consistent with the Governor's 2015 and 2018 Proclamations on Homelessness. Appropriates funds. HWN/WTL, WAM RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION REVIEWS. **SB 1354** Allows the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to assume [Measure added Status & historic preservation review of the effect of any proposed project on 02-03-231 Testimony for lands under its jurisdiction except for projects affecting properties listed or nominated for inclusion in the Hawaii register of historic places or the national register of historic places.
