Catholic Charities Hawai'i (CCH) is a tax exempt, non-profit agency that has been serving people in need in the State of Hawaii since 1947.

CCH supports HB 1486, HD1, which would provide add funding to the Kupuna Care (KC) Program which provides an array of in-home and community-based services to help elders remain in their own homes and communities. During the pandemic, we understand that the KC funding in the base budget was reduced by \$1.8M. We ask that the funding be returned to the \$9M base and that consideration be given to INCREASE the funding further to \$10-\$12M in order to provide adequate services for our growing elderly population.

CCH provides services for over 4,000 older adults each year and has been a provider of Kupuna Care (KC) Transportation for many years. The social isolation during the pandemic has had a negative impact on the physical and emotional health of our already frail elders. As the pandemic restrictions have lessened, more seniors are returning to in-person medical appointments and engaging in the physical and social activities that help them maintain their wellbeing.

We also hope that additional KC funding will ease the need to restrict these in-home and community-based services. Currently, the eligibility criteria is being defined very strictly and appears to keep frail elders from qualifying for KC services rather than helping to expand the services to serve a wider circle of frail elders in need.

Chair Joy San Buenaventura, Vice Chair Henry Aquino, and Members of the Committee:

I am Ron Shimabuku, Director of Public Policy and Advocacy for the Alzheimer's Association. We are testifying in **SUPPORT of House Bill No. 1486, House Draft 1.**

The Alzheimer's Association was established to assist those facing Alzheimer's disease and other dementias by providing local support groups and educational resources while advancing crucial research and public policy initiatives.

Alzheimer's disease is a public health crisis across the country. In Hawaii, approximately 29,000 individuals aged 65 and older live with Alzheimer's disease. By 2025, this figure is projected to increase by 20.7%. In addition, many are experiencing subjective cognitive decline — one of the earliest warning signs of future dementia. In 2020, 6.7% of individuals aged 45 and over reported increased confusion or worsening memory loss, putting them at risk of later developing dementia. More than two-thirds have not talked to their healthcare professional about it.

The bill, as received by your Committee, would appropriate an unspecified amount of funds for the fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much thereof for the fiscal year 2024-2025 for the Kupuna Care Program in the Executive Office on Aging. This would take effect on June 30, 3000.

The Alzheimer's Association would like to acknowledge the Legislature's work and commitment to the Kupuna Care Program. In 2022, the Kupuna Caregivers Program was incorporated into the Kupuna Care Program, which added much-needed services and support for care recipients, caregivers, and employed caregivers. We recognize the value that this program brings to the state, especially to those living and impacted by Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

With this, we respectfully urge your favorable consideration of this bill.

Hawai'i's aging population, like that of the United States,' is rapidly increasing as more and more residents born during the baby boomer era of 1946–1964 turn 60. Between 2010 and 2020, the percentage of the state's population over the age of 65 increased from 14.3–19%, and is projected to reach 22.6% by 2030. Within the same decade, the number of people over the age of 85 increased by more than a third, from 30,238 people to 41,600.

The significant increase in Hawai'i's elderly population and the concomitant increase in demand for services, particularly those that allow for aging in place, require an ongoing commitment to ensure that Hawai'i's kupuna are adequately cared for.

The Kupuna Care program was enacted in 1999 to help frail and vulnerable seniors age in place by leading independent, meaningful, and dignified lives in their own homes and communities. One of the principles of the program is that long-term care should be available to everyone, regardless of government or private insurance coverage or eligibility for other assistance programs, such as medicaid and supportive and nutrition services under Title III of the Older Americans Act.

The Kupuna Care program is considered an alternative to traditional long-term care options and uses state funds to provide a continuum of home and community-based supports to form a safety net for all kupuna and their caregivers. Access to the Kupuna Care program for all seniors is necessary to maintain a consistent continuum of care for vulnerable older persons, particularly as individuals' access to resources, support systems, and capacity change over time. Please support this bill.
