Chair Wakai and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General provides the following comments.

The purpose of this bill is to amend the Election Frauds statute, section 19-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to include within the practice of intimidation two additional violations: (1) the carrying of any firearm or weapon; and (2) the act of photographing the face of any voter without permission from both the voter and an appropriate election official when such actions occur at or near a voter service center, place of deposit, or polling place.

It appears that the proposed wording would require that to be guilty of an election fraud, a potential violator must be carrying a firearm or weapon <u>and</u> photographing the face of any voter without permission. In order to clarify that <u>either</u> the carrying of any firearm or weapon, <u>or</u> photographing the face of any voter without permission would each be separate violations under section 19-3, HRS, we recommend that page 3, line 16, of the bill be amended to read as follows:

(A) The carrying of any firearm or weapon; [and] or . . . .

To prevent the amended wording from limiting forms of intimidation to solely those that are specified in the amendments to section 19-3(4), we further recommend that page 3, lines 14 to 15, of the bill be amended to read as follows:
