In consideration of SENATE BILL 1090 RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES

Senate Bill 1090 establishes requirements for number plates for zero-emission (ZEV), hybrid, and gasoline-powered vehicles. Requires the Department of Transportation to adopt or amend its administrative rules to authorize the use of high-occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes by ZEVs. The Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission (Commission) supports this bill.

The Hawai'i Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission consists of a multijurisdictional effort between 20 different departments, committees, and counties. The Commission supports mechanisms to reduce overall vehicle miles traveled as well as converting all remaining vehicle based ground transportation to renewable, zero-emission fuels. The Commission's 2018 Statement on Ground Transportation Emissions Reduction directs the Commission to "Amend laws, such as the state procurement laws, to better align them with clean transportation priorities."

Driving EVs cuts greenhouse gas emissions in half or more and providing HOV lane access for EVs can encourage EV purchases and be a powerful strategy for reducing emissions. States that adopted HOV lane exemptions for specific vehicle types found the incentive encouraged drivers to acquire EVs and reached their planned EV quota earlier than anticipated. Authorizing the use of HOV lanes by ZEVs will help the State to stay on track to meet its 2045 climate goals.

SUBJECT: S.B. 1090 - Relating To Number Plates HEARING: Wednesday, February 8, 2023, 3:00 p.m.

The City and County of Honolulu, Department of Customer Services (CSD) offers the following comment on this bill.

Pursuant to Section 6-402 of the Revised Charter of the City and County of Honolulu, CSD administers the motor vehicle registration program for the island of Oahu.

The bill expresses a concern that Hawaii's electric vehicle license plate numbering scheme will soon need to be changed. Currently, electric vehicle license plates use four characters, three of which are numbers and one of which is a letter. At the current pace of electric vehicle sales, the current alphanumeric sequencing for the electric vehicle license plates will last approximately five years. Thereafter, the sequencing can rotate into the use of two numbers and two letters. The inclusion of an additional letter into the license plate number will extend the sequencing for another five years.
