Bill No. and Title: Senate Bill No. 1478, Relating to Offensive Cybersecurity.

Purpose: Establishes an offensive cybersecurity program within the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to analyze an evaluate cybersecurity threats and increase cybersecurity awareness and education. Requires the program to conduct penetration testing of state agencies to identify vulnerabilities and assess the severity of computer system security vulnerabilities using the Common Vulnerability Scoring System. Establishes a goal for all state and county agencies to identify and address vulnerabilities having a benchmark score exceeding 3.9 on the Common Vulnerability Scoring System by January 1, 2025. Authorizes the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to enter into memorandums of understanding and mutual aid agreements with other governments within the United States. Makes appropriations and authorizes the establishment of positions.

Judiciary's Position:

The Judiciary supports this bill. We would benefit from having a specialized and centralized program with whom the Judiciary can work with to analyze and assess risks. The growing state of cyber threats and speed at which cyber criminals target government entities

require dedicated resources with that specialized focus that would be redundant if each department had to dedicate their own resources for that purpose. It is much more efficient for the Judiciary to coordinate with such a specialized office.

DEPARTMENT'S POSITION: The Department of Human Services (DHS) appreciates the intent of this measure and defers to the Office of Enterprise Technology Services.

PURPOSE: The purpose of the bill is to establish an offensive cybersecurity program within the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to analyze and evaluate cybersecurity threats and increase cybersecurity awareness and education. Requires the program to conduct penetration testing of state agencies to identify vulnerabilities and assess the severity of computer system security vulnerabilities using the Common Vulnerability Scoring System. Establishes a goal for all state and county agencies to identify and address vulnerabilities having a benchmark score exceeding 3.9 on the Common Vulnerability Scoring System by January I, 2025. Authorizes the Office of Enterprise Technology Services to enter into memorandums of understanding and mutual aid agreements with other governments within the United States. Makes appropriations and authorizes the establishment of positions.

The Department's successful pivot to a hybrid telework environment at the pandemic's start allowed DHS to provide continuous access to benefits and services while keeping residents
