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TESTIMONY OF THE

CHIEF ELECTION OFFICER, OFFICE OF ELECTIONS TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY ON SENATE BILL NO. 383

RELATING TO VOTER REGISTRATION

February 10, 2023

Chair Rhoads and members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary, thank you for the opportunity to provide comments on Senate Bill No. 383. This bill requires that any person who applies for an identification card or driver's license be automatically registered to vote; and requires that the applicant be provided the opportunity to opt-out of voter registration.

The election officials work with the Department of Transportation (DOT) to implement automatic voter registration. Since the enactment of Act 126 Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, we worked with DOT to update the voter registration portion of the driver license and State ID application to include the opportunity to opt-out of registering to vote or to proceed with completing the requirements of the voter registration affidavit. The additional information on the voter registration portion of the driver license and State ID application includes phone number, email, a statement attesting that the applicant is eligible to register, and the ability for a special needs voter to request an electronic ballot.

Given the implementation of automatic voter registration in 2021 and that this bill does not provide substantive changes, we do not believe that this bill is necessary.

Chair Rhoads, Vice Chair Gabbard, and Committee Members:

The League of Women Voters of Hawaii supports SB 383 that requires any person who applies for an identification card or driver's license be automatically registered to vote and the clarification language that requires that the applicant be provided the opportunity to opt-out of voter registration.

The League supports the updated language in this bill that includes the statement "The applicant shall be offered the opportunity to opt-out of voter registration" and we do not feel this weakens the Automatic Voter Registration law that became effective in July 2021. The added language makes clear that the decision to **not register to vote** while obtaining a drivers' license still remains with the individual.

The Automatic Voter Registration bill made effective in July, 2021 has led to a steady statewide increase in voter registration across our state. For the General Election in 2018, 756,751 people were registered and by the General Election in 2022, 861,358 people were registered. An increase of 100,000 voters in four years is impressive and in addition to the Automatic Voter Registration bill, the hard work of our County Clerks and Office of Elections share in this progress as they are significantly supported by this legislation.

Making voting registration easy and convenient is very, very important in a modern democracy. Let's keep up this good work!

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on SB383.

I **OPPOSE** SB 383.

According to Chief Elections Officer Scott Nago and Honolulu City Clerk Glen Takahashi, there are approximately 100,000 "deadweight" registrants on our voter rolls^{1,2}. The voter rolls are obscenely bloated, this needs to be addressed and remedied BEFORE any legislation is passed that increases potential deadweight on our voter rolls.

Hawaii is in the top ten states with percentage of noncitizens as residents.^{3,4} It is illegal for noncitizens to vote.

How will these individuals be properly screened to prevent them from automatic voter registration when they get a drivers license?

In researching to prepare testimony for this bill, I was hoping to find robust legislation that addresses this.

Instead, I found the opposite. <u>HRS § 286-104.5</u> Limited Purpose Drivers License, allows for noncitizens to show their HAWAII VOTER REGISTRATION CARD as proof of residency to obtain a drivers license.

Apparently noncitizens are already voting, and can use their voter registration to get a drivers license. Unbelievable.

Focus on fixing the current broken laws instead of flooding the universal mail-in voting system with more ballots.
