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**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**  
**REPORT ON THE ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE REVOLVING FUND**  
**FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022**

**Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law, and**  
**Chapter 128E, HRS Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act**

This report, prepared by the State of Hawaii Department of Health (DOH), Environmental Health Administration (EHA), Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office, complies with the Hawaii Environmental Response Law (HERL), Chapters 128D and 128E, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) requiring the DOH to report to the State Legislature on the Environmental Response Law and Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act (HEPCRA).

The report presents the Fiscal Year 2022 accounting of Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) budget and expenditures for five Environmental Health Administration (EHA) programs. The report also presents an accounting of Chapter 128E, HRS, HEPCRA Tier II filing fees collected and distributed for FY2022.

**ERRF Supports Environmental Health Administration**

Prior to FY2016, the ERRF funded five Environmental Health Administration (EHA) programs with 31 occupied positions. They are the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office, Environmental Management Division (EMD), Clean Water Branch (CWB), Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), and the Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB). Due to rapidly declining barrel tax revenues, the 2015 Legislature changed the means of financing for all 31 occupied positions from ERRF to general funds and eliminated 10 vacant positions, effective July 1, 2015. The legislative changes enacted removed certain uses of the fund, returning the focus to removal, remediation, and detection of oil and pollutant or contaminant releases; and removal and remediation of hazardous waste and any other solid, liquid, or gaseous substance that may harm the environment. Concurrently, the 2015 Legislature reduced the corresponding 2016 appropriations to the affected programs: HEER <\$1,132,230>, CWB <\$324,891>, SDWB <\$457,532>, and SHWB <\$892,793>.

**Revenue**

ERRF generates revenue in variable amounts during any given year from the fines, penalties, and interest earned by the environmental programs. A primary source of funding for the ERRF is the 5-cent share of the “environmental response tax” (ERT) which levies a \$1.05 tax on each barrel of oil shipped into Hawaii.

The General Fund receives sixty cents of the barrel tax. The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT), Energy Security Special Fund and the Energy Systems Development Fund, and the Hawaii Department of Agriculture (DOA), Agricultural Development and Food Security Special Fund receive the remaining 40 cents.

In 2015, the Legislature expanded HRS Section 243-3.5(b)(1) to include other fossil fuels by levying a 19-cent tax on each one million British thermal units (MMBtu) of fossil fuel sold by a distributor. The Department of Taxation (DOTAX) Annual Reports for the fiscal years 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022 state that the tax was levied on 5.8, 7.9, 5.9, 4.6, and 5.3 million MMBtu of non-petroleum fossil fuels respectively. The ERRF is allocated a 4.8 per cent share of this additional tax revenue.

In addition, fines and penalties generated by the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office, Clean Water Branch (CWB), Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB), Clean Air Branch (CAB), and the Indoor and Radiological Health Branch (IRHB) are deposited into the ERRF. ERT revenue to DOH in FY2022 was \$1,240,787 which includes fossil fuel collections. Total revenue to the ERRF, including the ERT revenue, was \$2,579,781.

**Budget and Expenditure**

The 2022 legislature appropriated \$1,776,107 for operating expenses to the Environmental Management Division (EMD) and Hazard Evaluation and Emergency

Response (HEER) Office. The state expended \$1,682,276 of the ERRF during FY22 for the four programs.

### Environmental Response Tax Revenue Relatively Stable

The \$1.05 per barrel ERT revenue to DOH's environmental programs is relatively stable over the past five fiscal years. For fiscal years 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 ERT revenue was: \$1,236,065, \$1,287,966, \$1,266,898, \$1,290,770, \$1,248,675, and \$1,116,240 respectively. Note that effective fiscal year 2016 the ERT revenue includes fossil fuel collections.

### 2015 Legislative Changes to HRS 128D and HRS 243 to Affect ERRF in FY2016

In July 2015, Governor Ige signed into law revisions to Section §128D-2 to limit the uses of the fund. In addition, revisions to §243-3.5(b)(1) modified the Environmental Response, Energy and Food Security Tax to add a 19-cent tax on each one million British thermal units (MMBtu) of fossil fuels and to allocate 4.8 per cent of said tax to the ERRF. The change in the means of finance for the 31 occupied positions from ERRF to general funds also took effect in July 2015. Accordingly, the Legislature adjusted the ERRF appropriations to the affected EHA programs. Another provision was that unexpended and unencumbered funds in excess of \$1,250,000 remaining in the fund after June 30 of each fiscal year will be transferred to the general fund. Changes affecting the ERRF have been reported in detail in this Report.

### Hawaii State Response Program Impacted by Federal Budget Cuts

Because ERRF funding does not fully support the state's response obligation, the HEER Office implements the environmental site identification, assessment, and cleanup program using combined ERRF, General Fund, and federal cooperative agreement funding. While the SRP allocation remained stable between 2014 and 2015 at \$980,850, our FY2016 and FY2017 annual allocation dropped to \$936,300, and \$929,600 in FY2019 and FY2020 and then to \$849,600 in FY2021. The smaller Preliminary Assessment/Site Investigation (PA/SI) grant which funds site discovery activities was cut from \$275,000 in 2013 to the 2015 allocation of \$223,000 but has been restored for FY2022 and FY2023 to \$275,000. Grant funds available for FY24 allocations for each state remain to be determined.

Given the relatively stable ERT revenue levels and substantial reductions in federal funding it is hoped that the additional funding from the 19-cent tax on each MMBtu of fossil fuels of which the ERRF is allocated 4.8 percent will help to offset the losses.

### The Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) Site Lists

This annual report presents four distinct Site Lists at the end of this document.

First, per HRS 128D, this annual report identifies Sites Eligible for Possible Remedial Action Under the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA).

Secondly, the *FY2022 Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) Chemical Release Notification Log* lists 440 release notifications managed by the HEER Office State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs). HEER identified 293 cases directly related to petroleum releases.

Thirdly, the *Hawaii State Response Program List of Priority Sites* presents all non-military Hawaii sites identified for potential or known non-emergency response actions under HRS 128D. The list shows 1,058 active sites under direct DOH oversight in the various State programs. This includes eight sites with known or suspected contamination that were open or received No Further Action (NFA) determinations since the beginning of FY2022.

Finally, the *Hawaii State Response Program Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program List of Priority Sites* presents a list of 520 military sites in Hawaii for which HEER's Site Discovery and Remediation (SDAR) section provides oversight. This includes three sites with known or suspected contamination that received NFA determinations.

SDAR provides regulatory oversight of hazardous substance response actions for Department of Defense (DOD) service branches under federal CERCLA authorities and HRS 128D. Sites include numerous high priority unexploded ordnance sites (UXO), and multiple diverse military operations, including tank farms, pipelines, industrial activities and active training sites. A DOD cooperative agreement funds investigation, cleanup and DOH oversight of most military sites under EPA CERCLA authority. Investigation and cleanup of petroleum-contaminated military sites are exempt under CERCLA and are conducted under HRS 128D authority. Cleanup and DOH oversight for petroleum related activities are also covered under the cooperative funding agreements.

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## REPORT ON CHAPTER HRS 128D, HRS, ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSE LAW (HERL) Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) Budget Report

The Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law (HERL) annual report to the Thirty-Second Legislature, State of Hawaii, presents an accounting of Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) revenue and monies budgeted and expended for implementing environmental protection and response plans and actions.

### ERRF Uses

In accordance with HRS 128D, the ERRF may be used for the following:

- (1) Removal, remediation, and detection of oil and pollutant or contaminant releases;
- (2) Removal and remediation of hazardous waste and any other solid, liquid, or gaseous substance that may harm the environment; and
- (3) The payment of expenditures authorized by the Director under section 128D-4, Uses of the Fund.

### Special Funding to Attorney General

The ERRF funds legal support from the state Department of Attorney General on a variety of regulatory oversight issues including issuing orders to noncompliant parties, negotiating agreements with Voluntary Response Program participants, providing legal guidance on program development and legislative proposals, and developing guidance for property owners on implementation of deed restrictions in accordance with Hawaii's Uniform Environmental Covenant Act.

### Annual de minimis Settlements

Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law, requires that the department report annually on any de minimis settlements. During FY2022, there were no de minimis settlements.

### Four Environmental Health Program Budgets

Four DOH environmental programs share revenue deposited to the ERRF and have access to the following appropriation amounts: The Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office \$1,363,895, Clean Water Branch (CWB) \$134,505, Safe Drinking Water

Branch (SDWB) \$140,541, and Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB) \$137,166 for a total FY2022 allocation of \$1,776,107.

In FY2022 the legislature appropriated \$1,776,107 for operating expenses to the Environmental Management Division (EMD) and the HEER Office.

For FY2022 the state expended \$1,682,276 to the four programs. The operational expenses were for emergency and non-emergency environmental response contractors, salary and fringe benefits, travel, response training, standby and overtime pay, legal services, and Tier II Fees distributed to the county LEPCs.

### Environmental Response Revolving Fund Expenditure Ceiling Increase for Navy Water System Incident November 28, 2021

Due to the unanticipated costs resulting from the Navy Water System Incident (Case No. 20211128-1848) petroleum release, the Department of Health requested the Governor to increase the ERRF legislative ceiling by an additional \$4.5 million.

The existing authorized appropriation of \$1,363,895 in ERRF funds was insufficient to adequately respond to the incident of this magnitude. It was estimated that an additional \$4.5 million would be required for the following expenses to address the incident including (1) additional staff to enable thorough sampling and confirmation collection according to State and federal drinking water regulations and procedures, (2) laboratory testing, (3) retention of additional subject matter experts to supplement Department of Health staff, (4) additional staff for data management, (5) emergency repairs for laboratory instruments used for testing of drinking water samples, (6) crisis communications assistance, (7) regulatory enforcement, and (8) overtime costs for the many State employees needed to work on the emergency response.

The ERRF ceiling increase was approved on February 8, 2022 by the Governor. The Department of Health has pursued cost recovery reimbursement from the U.S. Navy for the expenses associated with the response.



**Fund Revenue**

Revenue is generated in variable amounts during any given year from the fines, penalties, and interest earned by the environmental programs, and from the ERT at \$1.05 per barrel. Additional revenue also is generated from the 19-cent tax on each MMBtu of fossil fuels of which the ERRF is allocated 4.8 percent. The DOTAX Annual Reports for the fiscal years 2018, 2019, 2020,

2021, and 2022 states that the tax was levied on 5.8, 7.9, 5.9, 4.6, and 5.3 million MMBtu of non-petroleum fossil fuels respectively. Overall, the ERT revenue is relatively stable over the past five fiscal years. ERT revenue for the past five fiscal years is as follows: \$1,266,898 (2017), \$1,290,770 (2018), \$1,338,582 (2019), \$1,116,240 (2020) and \$1,240,787 (2021). Note that effective fiscal year 2016 the ERT revenue includes fossil fuel collections. The current total spending ceiling for the fund is \$1,776,107.

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## REPORT ON CHAPTER 128E, HRS, HAWAII EMERGENCY PLANNING AND COMMUNITY RIGHT-TO-KNOW ACT (HEPCRA)

### Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF) HEP CRA Budget Report

In compliance with Chapter 128E, HRS, Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (HEPCRA), this annual report to the Thirty-Second Legislature, State of Hawaii, 2023 presents the accounting of Tier II fee amounts as follows:

- Amount collected during Fiscal Year 2022
- Amounts distributed during Fiscal Year 2022
- Projected collection for Fiscal Year 2023

#### HEPCRA Facility Reporting and Fees

HEPCRA facilities are those that store, use, or manufacture above defined thresholds, any hazardous substance, or extremely hazardous substance. An owner or operator of a HEP CRA facility must file notification of such “Tier II” activity and pay a \$200 filing fee annually. HEER Office staff assesses each submitted Tier II report,

records the HEP CRA facility data into the EPA Tier II Submit database and processes the fees for deposit to the Environmental Response Revolving Fund (ERRF).

DOH distributed the deposited Tier II filing fees to the Hawaii State Emergency Response Commission (HSERC) and the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) for operating expenditures. The annual amounts distributed to the LEPCs are based on Tier II fees collected from two fiscal years prior and after HSERC operating expenditures have been deducted.

As of June 30, 2022, there are 916 qualifying Tier II facilities. Military facilities must submit Tier II information but are exempt from filing fees.

The HSERC, LEPCs, and HEER Office are continuing efforts to identify and contact possible non-reporting facilities through community outreach and facility inspections.

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## THE HAZARD EVALUATION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE OFFICE HAWAII STATE RESPONSE PROGRAM MANAGEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION

### The HEER Office Mission

The mission of the HEER Office and the Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) is to address all aspects of releases of hazardous substances and pollutants, including oil, into the environment. HEER Office work includes preventing, planning for, and responding to hazardous substance releases, or risks of releases. HEER accomplishes this mission by responding rapidly to new spills and addressing existing contaminated sites with the highest risk to human health and the environment first, preventing contamination rather than cleaning up after the fact, and basing decisions on sound scientific principles and common sense.

### The Hawaii State Response Program

ERRF funding to the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office is used for operational costs for the office's implementing program, the HSRP. Three operating sections address important focus areas of the HSRP. They are the 1) Emergency Preparedness and Response (EP&R) Section, 2) Hazard Evaluation (HE) Section, and the 3) Site Discovery, Assessment and Remediation (SDAR) Section.

The HSRP provides for oversight of assessment and cleanup activities during chemical emergencies, and on high and medium priority contaminated sites across the Hawaiian Islands. These include privately owned, municipal, and state-owned properties, and federal military sites. DOH has generally curtailed oversight of low priority sites, which pose little hazard, due to state budget constraints.

HEER staff works with property owners, the environmental community, developers, the public, and other state and federal agencies to implement solutions for eliminating risk of chemical exposure to humans and the environment. HSRP examples of work performed are as follows:

- Emergency response to releases of hazardous substances that pose an imminent danger to people or the environment.
- Non-emergency response actions on properties presumed or known to pose a risk to human health and/or the environment because of contamination with hazardous substances.

- Identification and inspection of sites storing and using hazardous chemicals on property.
- Performing ecological and human health risk assessment in the areas of toxicological assessments of chemical threats to human health.
- Establishing appropriate cleanup levels for chemical contamination.
- Assisting the public and responsible parties with access to information such as:
  - Health effects of chemicals
  - Public Record documents
  - Technical guidance and reference materials for cleaning up contaminated sites
- Ongoing development and management of site related electronic records.
- Environmental policy, law, and rule development.

### Essential Federal Funding Support to the HSRP

As a result of legislative changes made in 2015, the ERRF no longer funds core operations for the HEER Office, and the General Fund currently supports approximately 40% of the HEER Office state response program obligations. Consequently, the HEER Office relies heavily on three cooperative agreement sources of federal funding to implement the office's mission and the HSRP.

The federal funding sources are the EPA State Response Program (SRP), the EPA Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection (PA/SI) Cooperative Agreements, and the Department of Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Cooperative Agreement.

### ***The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) State Response Program (SRP) Cooperative Agreement***

The HEER Office continues to receive funding from the EPA State Response Program (SRP) grant under Section 128(a) of the Small Business Liability Relief and Brownfields Revitalization Act (SBLRBRA) of 2002. This SRP grant provides crucial funds for staff salaries, capacity building, and program development activities. The SRP grant awards have been steadily declining from 2011. The SRP grant allocation for the past seven years were \$980,850 (2015), \$936,300 (2016), \$936,300 (2017), \$936,300 (2018), \$926,900 (2019), \$926,900 (2020) and \$849,600 (2021).

***EPA Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection (PA/SI) Cooperative Agreement***

The EPA Preliminary Assessment/Site Inspection Grant funds site discovery efforts combined with federal CERCLA (Superfund) evaluation of sites. HEER staff evaluates and rates sites based on PA/SI system criteria to determine their eligibility for the National Priority List. When a rated site scores too low to be eligible for the National Priority List of Sites, EPA transfers site-oversight responsibility from the EPA to the State of Hawaii. This year, the HEER Office used the \$275,000 PA/SI grant to fund positions, conduct field-screening activities, and fund laboratory costs to complete rapid site screenings that assess residential areas that may have been affected by historic releases of pesticides and other contaminants.

***Department of Defense/State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Cooperative Agreement:***

The HEER Office participates in two federal cleanup programs. The office provides oversight services to the military on sites located on federal property and managed and funded under the Department of Defense/State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program. HEER Office also manages assessment and cleanup activities for sites delegated to the DSMOA funded Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS).

The federal government established the DSMOA program to cover reimbursement of costs incurred by the state in providing oversight services to the Department of Defense (DOD) installations conducting environmental cleanup activities funded under the Defense Environmental Restoration Program (DERP). DSMOA funds are given to the state based on the state's request for advanced or reimbursement payment. The DSMOA Cooperative Agreement funds all staff positions overseeing remedial investigations and cleanups under these two DOD programs.

For FY2022, the state's reimbursement under DSMOA was \$531,331.

**Modern Data Management and Hazard Tracking Tools**

Residual contamination exists at hundreds of sites in Hawaii. Identifying these sites to ensure that unhealthy exposures are not occurring is a shared responsibility of the HEER Office and the affected property owners. The HEER Office has converted many of its public records to electronic format to make them easily available to the public in accordance with Hawaii's Sunshine Law.

**A HEER/UH MOA for Analytical Laboratory Service**

Since 1998, the HEER Office has contracted with the University of Hawaii (UH) to characterize unknown hazardous substances. The successful collaboration allows for quick identification of chemical pollutant unknowns while conducting an emergency response actions. The HEER Office is currently in a five-year contract with UH, effective May 1, 2019 until April 30, 2024. In addition to analyzing unknown substances, the university laboratory staff assists in training and outreach to Fire HazMat teams throughout the State.

**Cost Recovery**

Chapter 128D, HRS, provides legal authority to cost recover all ERRF expenses for DOH response actions. For FY 2022, the HEER Office and the Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch recovered \$70,685. The HEER Office mechanisms for cost recovery require charging billable staff time and expenses to the ERRF and include following:

**Responsible Party Agreement:** DOH recovers oversight expenses for the Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation, Honolulu Harbor, Hickam Community Housing, and GASCO cleanup sites in accordance with the terms of their respective Agreements for Remedial Action.

**Fast Track Agreement:** Parties wishing to receive expedited oversight of investigation and cleanup of low and medium priority sites have the option to enter into Fast Track Agreements, in which they pay oversight costs in return for face to face meetings and expedited document reviews.

**Voluntary Response Program Agreement:** DOH recovers oversight expenses for VRP and other cleanup sites in accordance with the terms of their respective HRS 128D Part II Voluntary Response Program Agreements for Remedial Action.

**Emergency Response Action Expenditures:** Money spent for responding to a chemical emergency is cost recoverable, only when expended from the ERRF. State On-Scene Coordinator's (SOSCs) personnel costs are paid from the General Fund and are not cost recoverable. Moneys expended from the ERRF for private emergency responder contractor services are cost recoverable.

**Penalties:** Penalties are assessable to a Responsible Party for failure to report a release of a hazardous

substance, pollutant, or contaminant, or for failure to comply with a departmental or judicial cleanup order.



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**HEER Office Emergency Preparedness and Response Key Actions**

The Emergency Preparedness and Response (EP&R) Section of the HEER Office is the State’s lead on environmental emergencies, responding to releases or threats of releases of hazardous substances which include oil and/or chemicals on land or in water. The EP&R Section includes highly trained State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs) who provide 24/7 response capabilities and are authorized to take emergency actions to protect public health and the environment.

Deemed essential workers, the SOSCs continue to prepare for and respond to releases and recognize that responder safety is of utmost priority. The SOSCs knew that protecting themselves have a direct impact on how well they can respond to protect public and the environment. As the COVID-19 pandemic continued, the SOSCs were very cognizant how different variants of the coronavirus are evolving. Therefore, SOSCs were very diligent in donning personal protective equipment, maintaining physical distancing, and abiding by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines.

In FY2022 HEER’s SOSCs managed 440 release notifications and performed direct oversight on 266 of those cases.

**Emergency Response Action Expenditures:** Money spent for responding to a chemical emergency is cost recoverable, only when expended from the ERRF. State On-Scene Coordinator’s (SOSCs) personnel costs are paid from the General Fund and are not cost recoverable. Moneys expended from the ERRF for private emergency responder contractor services are cost recoverable.

**Case No. 20210702-0340  
Aircraft Cargo TransAir Flight 380 Down**

TransAir Flight 810, a cargo Boeing 737, departed from Honolulu International Airport heading to Maui reported engine trouble and went down in approximately 350 - 450 feet of water, 2 miles east of Single Point Mooring, 4 miles west of entrance of Pearl Harbor, 1.5 miles offshore Ewa Beach. Two onboard were rescued. Plane carried approximately 1500 gallons of fuel along with cargo and other debris. The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) worked with the company’s insurance to recover the plane. DOH HEER and Department of Land and Natural Resources ensured that the environmental concerns of the State were adhered to. In three months, the plane, its engines, fuselage, and cargo were retrieved.

**Case No. 20210808-0732**  
**Polyethylene Pipes on Fire Near Sand Island Access Road**

On August 8, 2021, several polyethylene (PE) pipes were set on fire. The PE pipes burned for many hours, but the fire was able to be contained on the site. Due to the PE nature of the pipes, large amounts of smoke were created during the fire and a large quantity of water was used by the Honolulu Fire Department to contain the fire. Air monitoring was conducted on scene and nearby area as well. The water runoff was tracked to a main canal. The canal led to an oil water separator and prevented the runoff from going directly into Keechi Lagoon. Despite the large amounts of runoff created from the response, Ke’ehi Lagoon was not impacted.

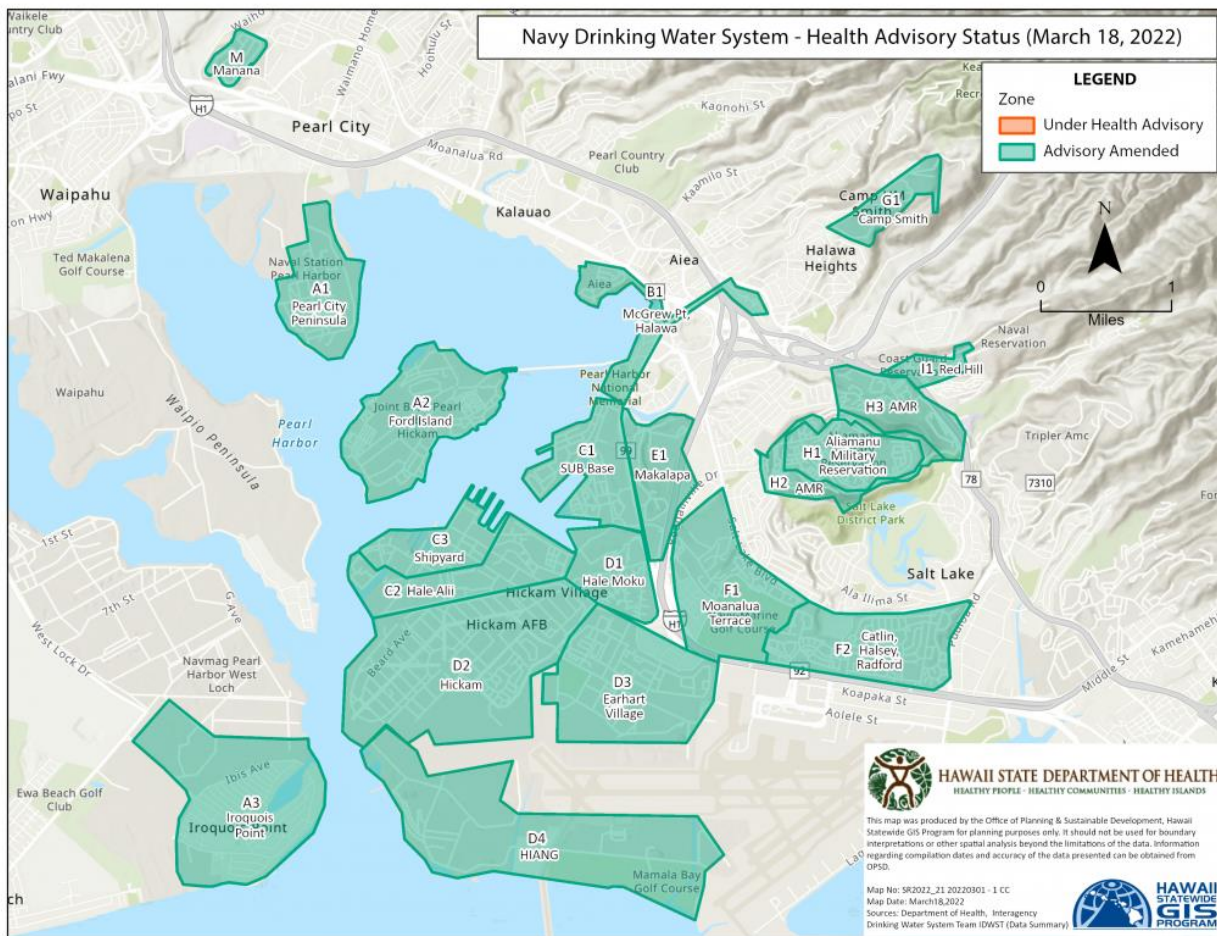


**Case No 20211128-1848**  
**Navy Water System Incident**

On November 28, 2021, the U.S. Navy and the Hawaii Department of Health (DOH) received numerous complaints about fuel-like odors in drinking water on Oahu. As more calls came in, it became apparent that the complaints were from neighborhoods served by the Navy Public Water System. This triggered an emergency response and a Public Health Advisory from DOH recommending that all Navy water system users avoid using the water for drinking, cooking, or oral hygiene. In addition, an Emergency Order was issued by the Governor.

Approximately 93,000 people comprised of residents, military, and commercial entities, were affected by a contaminated Red Hill Shaft, a Navy drinking water well contaminated with jet fuel JP-5, stored at the Navy’s Red Hill Bulk Storage Facility. The Red Hill Shaft sits approximately 100 feet below Red Hill tanks. Hawaii DOH, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Army, and the Navy formed an Interagency Drinking Water System Team (IDWST) to coordinate the restoration of safe drinking water by flushing the water distribution system, residence system flushing, sampling, and analyses. In late March 2022, the DOH declared the water was safe to drink and the residents were able to return to their homes. Long-term monitoring is ongoing to ensure that the water continues to be safe.

The State’s cost recovery against the Navy is ongoing. To date, \$1,243,087 was recovered from the Navy for DOH’s expenditures during the Navy Water System Incident.





**DOH Emergency Order Docket No. 21-UST-EA-02**

**Emergency Change in Service and Defueling of 20 Underground Storage Tanks, Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility**

On December 6, 2021, Governor Ige and DOH issued an Emergency Order (EO) to the Navy requiring the Navy to suspend Red Hill operations, treat the contaminated water, and drain the fuel tanks. On May 6, 2022, DOH issued a superseding Emergency Order to submit to DOH a plan for permanently defueling the Red Hill Bulk Storage Facility (the “Defueling Plan”). The Defueling Plan must, at a minimum, include plans for oil spill/release prevention, containment, and response/contingency plans, including the deployment of resources sufficient to adequately respond to and clean up any releases that occur during the defueling and closure process. DOH Underground Storage Tank Program along with HEER have been enforcing the requirements in the EO to prevent and respond to oil spills at Red Hill to protect drinking water as well as surface waters of Halawa Stream and Pearl Harbor. This work has resulted in the Navy’s installation of a diversion barrier system in the Adit 3 Tunnel to divert any large oil spill away from the Red Hill Shaft, the Navy’s drinking water well. At DOH’s request, the Navy has also sealed up drains (connected to groundwater) and sealed up floor cracks in the Red Hill tunnels.

**Case No. 20220418-1419**  
**Oil Spill USS Chung-Hoon**

On April 18, 2022, DOH State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs) responded to a release of about 400 gallons of F-76 Fuel from a fuel barge from refueling operations for the USS Chung Hoon at Bravo Pier in Pearl Harbor.

Navy response personnel applied booms and absorbent pads on the water. Crews used fire hoses to push oil to the belt skimmer on a boat. Oil was recovered using absorbents (and placed into 55-gallon drums), a boat skimmer and a vac truck. SOSC was on-scene and issued a notice of interest to the Navy and inspected under the pier. SOSC recommended installation of absorbent booms under the pier to capture residual oil that was observed. The Navy complied. The release was secured.

**Case No. 20220504-0414**

**Fire at a Used Lithium-Ion Battery Accumulation Facility**

A used battery storage facility mysteriously caught fire before midnight on May 3, 2022. The fire involved used Lithium-ion batteries. Honolulu Fire Department (HFD) extinguished the fire by removing every pallet of used Lithium-ion batteries from the building and quenching each burning stack. However, extinguishing the fire was challenging and described as “blowing out trick candles on a birthday cake” as a stack of batteries that appeared to be extinguished would re-ignite later. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Pictured is a pallet of used Lithium-ion batteries that burst into flames during HEER’s investigation four hours after HFD left the scene. To economically ship batteries to a recycler, the facility accumulates the used Lithium-ion batteries on pallets indoors stacked on the floor. It takes the facility several months to accumulate enough batteries to pack a 45’ shipping container.

**Port Allen Generating Station Diesel Leak from Valve**

On May 31, 2022, a 40,000-gallon aboveground storage tank containing diesel overflowed into a secondary containment at the Port Allen Generating Station. The berm storm water drain valve was left open, releasing approximately 100 gallons of fuel into an adjacent cobblestone ditch. Crews soaked the standing fuel up with absorbents and excavated the impacted berm.

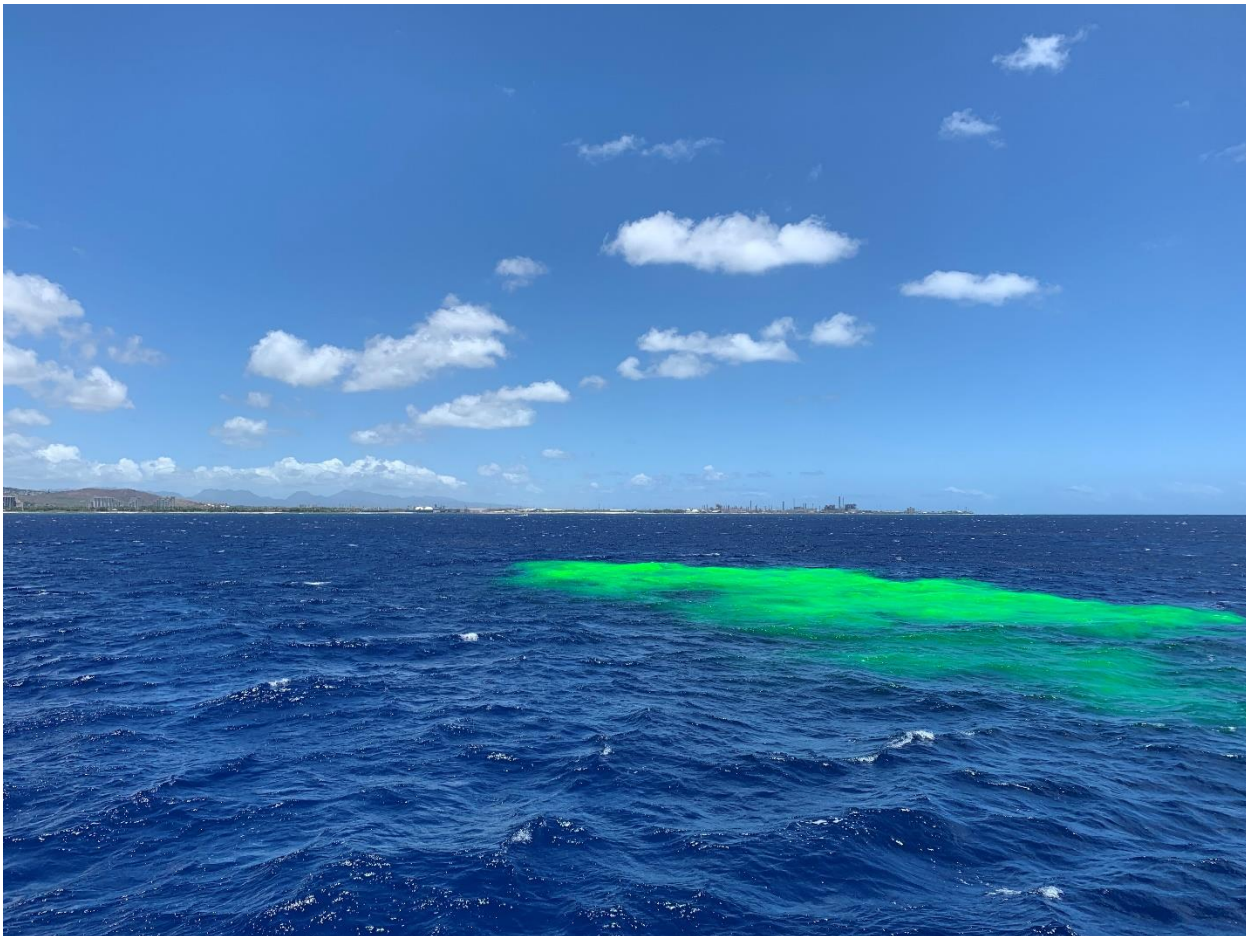
### ***HEER Guidance and Training***

The HEER Office routinely provides training opportunities to emergency response personnel from the counties and State and Federal agencies.

Notable HEER Office training conducted during FY2022 include the following:

#### **Annual Oil Spill Dispersant Exercise**

On August 3-5, 2021, the Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response Office (HEER), Emergency Preparedness and Response (EP&R) section organized a series of trainings and exercises to assess the state's current response program and strengthen preparedness in the event of a large-scale marine oil spill from O'ahu's Single Point Mooring. The exercise involved the deployment of the state-owned Airborne Dispersant Delivery System from a United States Coast Guard C-130 aircraft, in addition to Marine Spill Response Corporation's (MSRC) dispersant helicopter buckets. The state also partnered with MSRC to deploy offshore monitoring equipment used for rapid collection and reporting of real-time data on the transport and dispersion of oil in the water.



## Chemical Safety Days

On June 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> 2022, the HEER Office hosted two days of Chemical Safety Days. The two-day seminar has been developed to increase importance of preparing for chemical emergencies. Companies that store, use, or manage chemicals as well as first responders are provided educational opportunities for the awareness and safe use of hazardous substances as well as how to take the proper actions in case of an emergency.

A tabletop exercise regarding chlorine simulation release was held in addition to responding to lithium ion batteries, fentanyl awareness as well as cylinder identification.



## **Hazard Evaluation Actions and Studies**

### ***Health Impacts of the November 2021 Petroleum Contamination of the Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam Water System***

#### **Working to Understand the Human Health Impacts of JP-5 Jet Fuel Contamination on People Served by the Joint Base Pearl Harbor Hickam Water System**

The November 2021 release of jet fuel from the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility and the subsequent contamination of the drinking water system was a massive environmental catastrophe that sickened thousands of people. The event was unprecedented, with no historical or experimental models available that predict health effects from drinking water contaminated with JP-5 jet fuel. Given the lack of available information, it became necessary to further investigate possible health impacts, as well as provide health information and guidance to the public, health care providers, and the community. HEER staff worked extensively on this aspect of the emergency response to this contamination event spearheading efforts that included:

- Partnering with CDC's Agency for Toxic Substance and Disease Registry (ATSDR) to perform 2 Assessment of Chemical Exposure (ACE) Health Impact Surveys to evaluate the experiences of people exposed to the contaminated water.
  - The first ACE survey was conducted in January and February 2022 and had 2289 participants. 87% of participants reported health symptoms from the incident with 80% of those having improvement when they switched to an alternative water source. The survey demonstrated people were having significant health symptoms as well as significant life disruptions from the event and mistrust of responding agencies.   - The Follow-up Ace survey was conducted in September 2022 and was designed to evaluate ongoing health symptoms and people's attitudes towards their drinking water. The follow-up survey had 986

participants. Of the respondents, 80% reported on going health symptoms with 65% of those expressing high or very high confidence that their symptoms were related to the contaminated water incident. Participants also expressed significant mental health impacts from the event and concern and frustration with communication, transparency and trust. Further data analysis is ongoing, but a summary of preliminary results from the follow-up ACE survey can be found [here](#).

- Creation and dissemination of outreach materials to assist affected persons and health care providers in understanding the potential health impacts from exposure to JP-5 jet fuel in drinking water. HEER staff developed guidance for medical providers as well as public fact sheets on these topics. Information was shared via traditional media, DOH's medical advisory program, social media and by posting on DOH's website. Examples of these materials can be found on the [DOH Red Hill website](#) by clicking on the "Show Resources" button at the bottom.
- Extensive research and risk assessment work to develop an Environmental Action Level (EAL) for the release of fresh JP-5 jet fuel in drinking water. This effort, led by HEER staff, required complex risk assessment work and calculations to account for the specific chemical properties of JP-5 and the freshness of the fuel. Risk Assessments of this type generally take months to years to complete but was accomplished by the HEER Office in a few weeks due to the emergency nature of the problem. - Continued efforts to urge the Department of Defense, the Defense Health Agency and the US Navy to apply their extensive resources to further caring for people affected by the water contamination. With its partners at CDC/ATSDR, HEER has been instrumental in convincing the Department of Defense and Defense Health Agency to establish a Red Hill

Water Clinic to centralize evaluation and treatment of on-going health concerns. In addition, HEER and CDC/ATSDR staff continue to urge DOD and DHA to establish a third-party health registry that would follow exposed persons for years to evaluate health impacts.

### ***Evaluating Infrastructure and Health Risks of Lead in Drinking Water at Hawaii Schools and Child Care Facilities***

**Hawaii Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Section 2107 Drinking Water Project**  
WIIN 2107 is a federal grant for testing drinking water for lead contamination at schools and childcare centers. Working in close collaboration with DOH's Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB), State Laboratories Division (SLD), and Children with Special Health Needs Branch (CSHNB), plus the Hawaii Department of Education (DOE), and the Hawaii Department of Human Services (DHS), HEER completed Stage 1 of this extensive project in 2021, testing for lead in drinking water from 6,210 taps at 106 elementary schools and 117 child care facilities.  
Stage 2 of the WIIN project, which included testing 4,459 samples at the remaining 72 DOE elementary schools completed in October 2022. Overall project results found elevated levels of lead in the drinking water at 3.7% of the elementary school taps and 1.6% of the child care taps. In total, 133 elementary schools and 4 child care facilities had at least one tap above the project action level for lead of 15 parts per billion (ppb). HEER created and helped distribute educational and communication materials for the staff, students, and families at the schools and childcare centers as well as a public website (<https://health.hawaii.gov/WIIN>) that displayed results in near real time and provides information on the project and resources for reducing lead exposure from drinking water. HEER continues to work with DOE and DHS to prevent exposure from lead in the drinking water at their facilities and develop long-term solutions to these infrastructure problems in an effort to maintain a safe and healthy environment for kids to learn and grow. In October 2022, HEER staff, in partnership with DOH's SDWB and Hawaii DOE were awarded a \$2 million competitive grant from EPA to replace problematic drinking water fixtures at schools. This grant award will close the circle of this important project that investigated and identified lead hazards in

drinking water at schools and will now repair the infrastructure to fix this problem. Work on the fixture replacement and verification testing is anticipated to commence in early 2023.

### ***Ecological and Human Health Risk Key Studies***

The HEER Office Hazard Evaluation (HE) Section provides ecological and human health risk assessment, conducts toxicological assessments of chemical threats to human health, establishes appropriate cleanup levels for chemical contamination, and assists the public with information concerning the health effects of chemicals.

### ***Evaluating Perfluoroalkyl Substance (PFAS) Contamination in Hawaii and Potential Risks to Human Health and the Environment***

PFASs are a large class of chemicals used in many materials for their waterproofing qualities. Traditional sources of PFAS include aqueous firefighting foam (AFFF) used frequently at airports and military bases, waterproof and stain resistant consumer goods, food packaging, and a variety of industrial processes. Because of their many uses and their persistence in the environment, PFASs are known to accumulate in treated wastewater, biosolids from wastewater treatment and at landfills. Currently, little is known about the burden of PFAS contamination in Hawaii. In FY2022, HEER worked on multiple projects to help further assess the burden of PFAS contamination in Hawaii and its potential risks to Human Health the environment. Current projects include:

- Evaluating PFAS contamination in treated wastewater and biosolids, landfill leachate, and soils where treated wastewater is reused. This project was funded by the EPA in FY2020 and is designed to better understand the degrees of PFAS contamination in treated wastewater that is reused or discharged to the ocean as well as in biosolids and landfill leachate. Samples for this project have been collected from wastewater treatment plants and landfills from Kauai, Maui and Hawaii Counties with plans for the collection of



samples from Honolulu County wastewater treatment plants and landfills as well as from Army and Navy locations on Oahu. Results from this project will help HEER better understand how these chemicals are moving through the environment and evaluate potential human exposures to PFASs and begin to develop ways to limit these chemicals in the environment.

- HEER staff led by Dr. Roger Brewer, utilized the latest scientific information to develop Environmental Action Levels (EALs) for 18 PFASs in soil and groundwater. The EALs have undergone extensive public review and final interim EALS were published in December 2020 with an update in August 2021. These EALs are the most comprehensive set of risk-based, soil and groundwater action levels for PFASs in the US and continue to be reevaluated by HEER staff.
- HEER staff has begun the early planning work for a project evaluating PFASs in compost when compostable food ware is included in the substrate for the compost. This project will also evaluate the amount of PFAS taken up into plants when this compost is used as a soil amendment.

#### **Evaluating the Risks of Climate Change on Sites with Chemical Contamination**

The HEER Office continues its work evaluating the risks of climate change on sites with known chemical contamination in Hawaii. Hawaii has around 1,000 sites with known chemical contamination that are monitored and regulated by the Department of Health's Hazard Evaluation and Emergency Response (HEER) Office. Many of the contaminated sites are in low lying areas and along shorelines and are at risk for coastal erosion, as well as submersion and impacts from flooding, groundwater inundation and sea level rise.

While hazards from contamination may be mitigated by removal, treatment or destruction of contaminated media, the most commonly used remedial option across the islands is to prevent exposure by managing contaminated materials in place. This is often done through a combination of physical containment, including protective caps or treatment, and

institutional controls such as guidance or restrictions against reuse of sites for residential housing, playgrounds and schools. However, the use of these strategies has historically been viewed in the context of a static environment. The increasing impacts from climate change and sea level rise including more frequent flooding, accelerated erosion and related disruption of contaminated lands due to sea level rise, ground water inundation and an increase in storms and heavy rain events require an equal progression in the manner in which risk is evaluated and mitigated for these types of sites. Of particular concern are large, current or former industrial sites in coastal areas that are known to be heavily contaminated and are at high risk of climate change-related impacts. This includes many harbors, airports, bulk fuel terminals, and former landfills in the islands.

Specific concerns related to these contaminated areas result from the chemical changes induced by sea level rise, effects of barometric pressure changes and increased precipitation (e.g., storms), groundwater inundation and increased flooding. Risks to human health and the environment can increase significantly when these contaminants are moved from their current location to areas that did not previously contain contamination. This includes the possible release of contaminants into drinking water sources and the food chain via fish and shellfish. The HEER office published a memo outlining these hazards and specific risks in Hawaii in June 2021. The memo can be viewed on HEER's Climate and Health website at <https://health.hawaii.gov/heer/climate-and-health/>. HEER plans to expand work in this area by defining guidance for environmental clean-ups in climate change impacted areas and continuing research and modeling into the potential hazards.

#### **Assessing the Chemistry and Toxicity of Groundwater Contaminated with Petroleum Fuels**

The HEER Office is near completion of a study of the chemistry and toxicity of drinking water contaminated with petroleum fuels. The results of the study will be used to update HDOH action levels. The results of the study will be used to update Hawaii's existing guidance and better assess the health risk posed by petroleum-contaminated groundwater in Hawai'i, including impacts to groundwater beneath the Navy's Red Hill Tank Farm complex. The study, the most detailed of its kind carried out in the US, is being overseen by Dr Roger Brewer and funded through grants to the HEER Office from the USEPA.

**Health Advisories for Kilauea Eruptions and Evaluating Public Health Effects from the 2018 Kilauea East Rift Zone Eruption**

HEER continues to provide technical support and public outreach regarding volcanic emissions and resulting air quality hazards. HEER staff actively participates in the Inter-Agency Vog Network and collaborates with other Branches within DOH to issue health advisories on protecting oneself from hazards related to volcanic gases and vog.

The HEER Office and the Emergency Medical Services and Injury Preventions Systems Branch (EMSIPSB) have partnered with the University of Hawaii, Manoa Department of Atmospheric Sciences on a project to develop a real-time public messaging service about vog based on forecasts from the established Vog Measurement and Prediction Project (VMAP). The new public messaging service called the Vog and Laze Exposure (VALE) Critical Warning System, is designed to provide real-time alerts to residents in areas where poor air quality from volcanic emissions is predicted within a short time frame. This warning system will allow residents to make health protective choices during periods of rapidly changing conditions. The VMAP vog model has recently undergone a significant upgrade with a public facing webpage (<http://mkwc.ifa.hawaii.edu/vmap/new/>) to disseminate information.

**Health Surveillance for Environmental Factors**

In FY2022, staff provided risk assessment support and responded to a diversity of inquiries concerning potential health hazards. These inquiries included questions regarding heavy metals (mercury, lead, and arsenic), pesticides, indoor and outdoor air pollutants, drinking water contamination and illnesses potentially related to the environment. Inquiries come from the public, the media and the medical community. In FY2022, HEER responded to over 70 direct individual inquiries related to environmental health concerns.

**The Hawaii Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (HI-CLPPP)**

In October 2017, CDC funding revitalized the Hawaii Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (HI-CLPPP) as a joint program of the HEER office and the Children with Special Health Needs Branch (CSHNB). In FY2022, this funding was renewed for an additional 5

years. HEER hosts a full-time epidemiology specialist for childhood lead activities and provides medical direction and technical assistance from HEER's Toxicologist, Dr. Diana Felton. Together, the HI-CLPPP team is working to reduce children's exposure to lead by primary prevention outreach and education, improving blood lead level surveillance, advocating for increased blood lead testing, case management, guidelines for health care professionals, lead poisoning education, and linking families to needed services.

HEER and HI-CLPPP have continued to expand their Residential Lead Investigation program which offers free residential lead inspections to families of children with elevated blood lead levels. HEER staff who are Hawaii certified lead risk assessors, have performed over 31 residential lead inspections, helping more than 50 children and their families identify and eliminate home based lead sources.

In October 2021, the CDC revised its reference value for children's blood lead level lowering it from 5 µg/dL to 3.5 µg/dL reflecting the growing understanding that even small amounts of lead are detrimental to children's health and development. HEER and HI-CLPPP have adapted to this new reference level and are now providing public health services to all families of children with blood lead levels above 3.5 µg/dL.

For calendar year 2021, 15,159 children (≤6 years old) were tested for blood lead levels. 244 children had an elevated blood lead level between 3.5-9 µg/dL. Another 26 children had an elevated lead level of ≥10 µg/dL. Addresses of children with elevated lead levels have been provided to HUD funded programs in the City and County of Honolulu and the neighbor islands to ensure that landlords receiving state or federal rental subsidies comply with lead-based paint requirements.

It remains an on-going concern for HI-CLPPP that less than 30% of Hawaii's keiki are tested for lead. This low testing rate combined with lead poisoning's initially silent nature ensures that many children with lead poisoning are unrecognized and not receiving the services they require to minimize the devastating neurodevelopmental effects of lead poisoning. HI-CLPPP continues to work to raise awareness about childhood lead poisoning and to work with providers and families to increase blood lead testing rates.

### ***Environmentally Related Illness and Injury Reporting and Surveillance (Pesticides and Heavy Metals)***

Under the authority of Section 321-311, HRS, Environmentally Related Illness and Injury Surveillance, the HEER Office is required to collect information on Pesticide and Heavy Metal Poisoning. Maven, the electronic surveillance database, receives these results automatically using electronic laboratory reporting (ELR). Using the lab results in Maven, HEER is able to track children and adults with elevated levels of heavy metals including lead, arsenic, cadmium, mercury, and zinc, as well as abnormal markers of pesticide exposure. Tracking these cases allows HEER to analyze the data for geographic and demographic trends and provide individual case management support to doctors and families. HEER staff continues to work with Information Technology Specialists in other sections of DOH to maximize the functionality and efficiency of the Maven system.

The Hawaii State Legislature authorized a new Epidemiology position by Act 49, SLH 2017. The Epidemiologist II was just established in November 2022 and will develop, lead, and conduct epidemiological investigations to identify and investigate environmental health concerns by collecting, analyzing, interpreting, and reporting available health data to evaluate whether public health is being harmed. This epidemiology work will focus on environmental pollutants with an emphasis on assessing disproportionate impacts on vulnerable communities. The HEER Office is awaiting final approvals to recruit this position.

### ***Collaborations on Public Health Education and Outreach***

**Technical and Risk Communication Assistance** to the Department of Education (DOE) on environmental health issues including heavy metal contamination of soils, lead-based paint, mold exposures, drinking water contaminants and safe disinfection practices in the era of COVID-19.

**Hawaii Poison Center (HPC)** The HPC operates a 24/7 hotline to assist residents and health care providers. DOH receives data from the HPC on the number and types of acute pesticide poisonings. The HPC is mandated by legislation and is under the auspices of

the Hawaii State Emergency Medical Services and Injury Prevention System Branch. Annually, the center receives over 9,000 information and poisoning exposure calls from residents and health care providers throughout the state. Services are provided free of charge every day of the year, 24 hours a day by registered nurse specialists, pharmacists, and physicians specially trained in medical toxicology. The center is operated by the Rocky Mountain Poison Center, Denver, Colorado, an accredited regional poison center by the American Association of Poison Control Centers (AAPCC). The HPC provides 24/7 medical advice for management of suspected pesticide exposures and informs DOH on behalf of the providers. This system provides an enhanced and streamlined communication option for the providers. HEER Toxicologist, Dr. Diana Felton continues to work with the HPC on industrial, occupational, and environmental poisonings providing local technical support and collaboration.

**EPA's Children's Health Protection Advisory Committee (CHPAC)** HEER Toxicologist, Dr. Diana Felton continues to serve on EPA's Children's Health Protection Advisory Committee (CHPAC). The CHPAC is made up of 25 members including researchers, academicians, health care providers, environmentalists, state and tribal government employees, and members of the public who advise EPA on regulations, research, and communications related to children's health. Recent CHPAC topics have included environmental health and safety at schools, take home pesticides exposure, and EPA's America's Children and the Environment data resource. Dr. Felton's participation in the CHPAC ensures that Hawaii's children's environmental health priorities are represented to the EPA on a national level.

### ***HEER Guidance and Training***

**Technical Guidance Manual (TGM)** The HEER office updated the primary guidance used to assess health and environmental risk posed by contamination of soil, air and water. The document includes "Environmental Action Levels" (EALs) for over 200 chemicals commonly found at contaminated industrial, residential and agricultural properties. Additional investigation is normally required when concentration of a chemical in soil, water or air exceeds the EAL. Areas of the TGM updated in 2021 include the sections on Decision Unit characterization for sampling and methods for

sampling groundwater and surface water. In addition, the entire TGM was moved from an external server managed by a consultant to HEER's internal server, allowing for greater control and more frequent updating of the guidance.

**Chinese Academy of Sciences** Dr. Roger Brewer, a toxicologist and environmental scientist with the HEER Office continues his collaboration with the Chinese Academy of Sciences. Dr. Brewer has provided expertise and training related to Hawaii's Technical Guidance for the investigation of environmental contamination, including the translation of Hawaii's Technical Guidance into Chinese and expansion of the guidance to assist in the cleanup of heavily contaminated, industrial sites in China. Lessons learned from this collaborative work with environmental experts in China will be used to update and expand HEER Office guidance documents. The English translation of the Hawaii-China guidance has been proposed for publication as an international standard and is expected to be completed in 2022.



**Site Discovery, Assessment, and Remediation  
Cleanup Highlights**

**Continued Redevelopment of Contaminated Properties**

As the movement towards re-development of properties for housing across the State increases, the HEER Office continues to invest heavily in investigations of older regions of Oahu and the neighbor islands that have been targeted. For FY2022, the HEER Office accomplished its primary mission of discovery and oversight of assessment and cleanup activities on high and medium priority sites across the state, including privately owned, municipal, and state-owned properties and, federal military sites. New project managers have been trained and mentored to address the various site work required.

**Sites Evaluated for Removal and Remedial Actions**

Property owners, responsible parties, and prospective purchasers frequently contact the HEER Office to report releases of hazardous substances, pollutants or contaminants as required by HRS 128D and to assess and manage hazardous substances, pollutants or contamination affecting properties in which they have an interest.

Our general state and federally funded remedial project managers (RPMs) evaluate information provided, determine the nature and extent of contamination and, if necessary, require removal or remedial actions to be taken to protect human health and the environment.

To date, 1863 state sites have been identified and investigated by the section including 31 consultations, 37 admin sites to track multiple interests, 25 RCRA lead sites. 777 sites received NFA determinations. Of these, 410 sites have been addressed and have no ongoing oversight requirements.

Four hundred and ten (410) of the NFA sites require Institutional Controls, and another 444 sites have remedies selected with long term management with restrictions in place to protect human health and the environment. HEER is in the process of reviewing records of sites closed prior to 2008 to assess current conditions and effectiveness of protective measures implemented at that time.

During FY2022, 47 new state sites were added with 11 active site discovery efforts and 36 redevelopment sites statewide. Five sites were given a no further action letter, including three sites which require ongoing institutional controls to manage residual risks. At the end of FY 2022, 1050 state sites remain open under active oversight and are being remediated or assessed for future action.

SDAR provides regulatory oversight of hazardous substance response actions for Department of Defense (DOD) service branches under federal CERCLA authorities and HRS 128D. Sites include numerous high priority unexploded ordnance sites (UXO), and multiple diverse military operations, including tank farms, pipelines, industrial activities and active training sites. A DOD cooperative agreement funds investigation, cleanup and DOH oversight of most military sites under EPA CERCLA authority. Investigation and cleanup of petroleum contaminated military sites are exempt under CERCLA and are conducted under HRS 128D authority. Cleanup and DOH oversight for petroleum related activities are also covered under the cooperative funding agreements.

To date, 1,091 military sites have been identified and investigated by the SDAR section under the Hawaii State Response Program Defense and State Memorandum of Agreement (DSMOA) Program. 572 sites received NFA determinations. Of these, 150 sites have been addressed and have no ongoing oversight requirements. Four hundred twenty-two (422) of the NFA sites require Institutional Controls, and another 146 sites have been placed into long term management with restrictions in place to protect human health and the environment.

During Fiscal Year 2022, 13 new sites were added to the DSMOA program. Two sites received NFA determinations, including one site that requires long term controls to manage residual contamination. 517 military sites remain open at the end of FY 2022 under active oversight and are being remediated or assessed for future action.

**Responsible Party Cooperation**

The Hawaii Environmental Response Law, HRS 128D, requires responsible parties and property owners to investigate and clean up contamination under the regulatory oversight of the HEER Office. The HEER Office has the authority to issue orders to require investigation and cleanup of properties that pose an

imminent threat to human health or the environment. In instances where there is no responsible party, or the responsible party fails to take action, ERRF funds may be expended to complete cleanup activities to protect human health.

The HEER Office aims to collaborate with responsible parties and property owners in identifying potential hazards and directing potential investigations and cleanup activities. This partnership approach results in more successful and timely cleanups, while conserving fund monies. In 2019, Responsible Parties conducted the vast majority of investigation and cleanup actions on a voluntary basis, without a formal cleanup agreement in place.

A limited number of cleanup actions were conducted under one of three types of regulatory agreements with the HEER Office, described below.

### **Voluntary Response Program Key Oversight**

The Voluntary Response Program (VRP) encourages voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties and includes a cost recovery mechanism to offset HEER oversight costs. Under Chapter 128D, HRS, DOH has the authority to grant prospective purchasers or developers an exemption from future liability if cleanup is performed to DOH specifications under the program.

Past, current or future property owners can participate in this program, but exemptions from liability can only be given to future purchasers or tenants. Completion of the voluntary cleanup action is accompanied by a Letter of Completion (LOC) issued by the Department of Health and noted on the property deed. The most recent LOC was issued for the Waiialua Sugar Mill site on the North Shore of Oahu in December 2018. The Iwilei Center site, which entered the VRP program in 2019 completed a Draft Response Action Memorandum in 2022, however, due to potential changes to the proposed future use, the HEER Office is working with the owner and the City and County of Honolulu to reevaluate the remedial alternatives for the site. The new proposed future use would include transit-oriented residential mixed-use development. The site is ideal based on its proximity to the future Iwilei Rail Station. To date, 35 contaminated properties have been enrolled in the VRP program. Of these, DOH has issued 28 LOCs for 26 sites, closed one site with a No Further Action (NFA) determination without liability relief, and seen five sites withdraw from the program.

Responsible parties with sites participating in the VRP pay the state for DOH oversight of their remedial activities. Over the past year, investigations and remediation efforts were conducted at two VRP sites in the program, along with long-term management of sites that have received LOCs but where residual contamination left in place requires on-going management. Redevelopment of these sites requires additional coordination and oversight by the HEER Office to ensure compliance with LOC restrictions. In FY2022, three VRP sites required oversight to ensure compliance with land use restrictions, including the Iwilei Costco site, the Honolulu Wood Treatment site in Kapolei, and the BEI site in Iwilei.

### **Fast Track Program**

The HEER Office Fast Track Cleanup process provides a streamlined approach for property owners to conduct protective, independent cleanups of low and medium priority sites, and improve Hawaii's ability to focus on more serious and complex releases. The program provides expedited oversight initiated with a standardized application for sites with low environmental risks. Forms and information on Fast Track Cleanups (FTC) designed to enable landowners or other private parties to conduct a voluntary investigation or cleanup under a simple agreement with the HEER Office are located at:

The most notable Fast Track site to date has been the International Market Place where the remedial action required was completed and site has been fully re-developed. The No Further Action Letter with Institutional Controls was issued in FY17.

During the pandemic, interest in FTC dropped dramatically as redevelopment activities slowed dramatically. In FY22, the SDAR Section considered other ways to engage with stakeholders and those responsible parties whose projects had slowed or stopped. Outreach activities are being planned for spring summer and fall 2023 engagement opportunities with our stakeholders. With invitations to low priority site owners to educate and assist them with the Fast Track Cleanup process and our guidance and template documents to provide clear direction to help them get started again on their environmental activities with assistance from SDAR.

**Site Discovery Program**

Discovery of historically contaminated sites that may pose a threat to current or future users is an important focus area for the HEER Office. HEER Office uses federal funding to locate and sample properties that may have invisible contamination that could cause harm, especially when sites are redeveloped to residential use, or if contaminated soils are excavated and re-used where children could be inadvertently exposed. The Site Discovery program was awarded a grant of \$275,000 for 2022 by the EPA.

Since 2007, the HEER Office Site Discovery program has investigated 131 sites statewide of which 53 sites required no further action based on initial assessment sampling and detailed historical reviews. 79 sites require further investigation. In FY2022, 11 additional sites were added, with two sites requiring no further action.

In FY2022, our Site Discovery focused on Hawaii Department of Education elementary schools, to further support their efforts to identify and manage contaminant concerns at all of their elementary schools statewide. Over the past two fiscal years, DOE has sampled at many elementary schools statewide and developed school specific EHMPs for all of their elementary schools to ensure school staff know what measures are needed to keep children safe from potential contaminant exposures. Our Site Discovery priority this year was to focus on remaining public elementary schools built before 1988 (the year organochlorine pesticides were banned for use in the US). These schools are listed by SDAR priority and recommendations to DOE.

**Paia Elementary Medium Priority** Lead and chlordane detected above EPA RSLs and DOH EALs. DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Kalaheo Elementary Medium Priority** Chlordane was detected well above EPA RSL and DOH EAL under two of three buildings. DOH advised DOE to conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Kilauea Elementary Medium Priority** Arsenic was detected above EPA RSLs and below DOH EALs. Results for DDT, aldrin, dieldrin and dalapon were detected below both the respective EPA RSL and DOH EALs. DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Makawao Elementary Medium Priority** Lead detected in crawl space of Building A's foundation above the PEA RSLs and DOH EAL. DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Kekaha Elementary Low Priority** Chlordane was detected well above EPA RSL and DOH EAL under a school classroom, which is off limits to students. DOH advised DOE to conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Koloa Elementary Low Priority** No samples collected due to low risk of exposure to soil in the footprint of a former building that had been treated with a variety of arsenic, organochlorines or chlorinated herbicides. DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Elsie H. Wilcox Elementary Low Priority** A release is suspected but samples were not collected due to low risk of exposure to soil in the footprint of the 12 concrete and hollow tile classroom buildings built in 1957.

**Elele Elementary No Further Action (NFA)** DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Haiku Elementary NFA** DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-

based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Wailuku Elementary NFA** DOH recommended DOE conduct soil testing under and around foundations of structures being demolished or remodeled where lead-based paint and/or banned pest control products were historically applied.

**Waihee Elementary NFA** No samples were taken - Release of hazardous materials was suspected on the school grounds because of the long operating history of the 140-year-old elementary school buildings. Recent renovations and construction on the campus following DOH approved EHMP have reduced potential exposures to lead based paint and pest control products applied before 1990.

**Site Discovery Scope and Data Collection Approaches** Sites are identified by searching historical digital collections that include the Hawaii State Archives, the Hawaii State Public Library System’s Hawaii and Pacific Collection, the University of Hawaii at Manoa Library Maps, Aerial Photographs and GIS website and national resources including the Library of Congress Sanborn Map Collection and the Chronicling America digital collection of Hawaii newspapers. These resources, plus locally administered plantation museums in each county provide maps, aerial photos, and oral histories to assist in locating areas formerly used to store, mix and load pesticides for distribution on sugarcane, pineapple and other agricultural industries.

The Site Discovery Program’s primary focus has been on hidden hazards from the most important agricultural industries of Hawaii’s past, sugarcane and pineapple. Arsenic was first used as an herbicide one hundred years ago in the sugar plantations in the state. In 1948 dioxin-containing herbicides began to be widely used as well. Since 2007 the HEER Office Site Discovery Program has searched for herbicide mixing and loading sites on every island to identify invisible contamination left behind by the historical operations at each plantation. Historic mixing sites have been identified under public housing projects, privately owned parcels with homes, planned subdivision projects, industrial areas and agricultural settings. Of the more than 30 confirmed herbicide mixing sites, only two landowners were aware of the possible contamination on the land they owned. This past year a mixing site on Kauai that stopped operating almost

20 years ago was discovered with high arsenic and dioxin in surface soils.

**Site Discovery Focus Urban Redevelopment and Territory of Hawaii School Board Campuses**

Given the rapid rate of urban redevelopment, the scope of the Site Discovery Program is expanding to include assessments in urban areas rapidly transitioning from former industrial activities to residential neighborhoods. These communities include condominium towers, restaurants, shopping locations and transit stations to attract and service the new residents.

Kakaako Mauka was once a major industrial section of Honolulu. A wood treatment facility, foundries, dry cleaners, breweries, chemical distributors and manufacturer are just a few of the industries that operated in this area. We have noted that the Howard Hughes continues redevelopment activities without consulting with us about environmental assessment and implementation of DOH-approved contaminant management practices prior to initiating construction or other ground disturbing activities.

In addition, the HEER Office continues working with the DOE and the Hawaii National Guard to identify former firing ranges at high schools and former Hawaii National Guard shooting ranges that date back to 1915 to ensure lead contamination from these operations does not pose a threat to current students and other users.

Lead-based paint first used on Territory of Hawaii, Board of Education facilities from the 1920s-1970s continues to impact soil at many of Hawaii’s school campuses. First identified in East Hawaii campuses like Naalehu, Keaau, Pahoa, and Waiakeawaena, investigations of lead and arsenic in soil indicates schools constructed prior to 1970 are likely to have elevated lead in soils. The Site Discovery Program will continue to investigate campuses in Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai County. Investigations are currently occurring in City and County of Honolulu by the DOE.

**Hawaii’s Unique Challenges**

As a small, isolated state in the middle of the Pacific, Hawaii faces unique challenges cleaning up contaminated properties. On the mainland, common cleanup solution is often removal and disposal of contaminated materials to a nearby waste facility, or

onsite treatment of contamination to reduce or remove hazards.

Unfortunately, limited available land for dedicated disposal facilities and the economics of transporting remedial equipment and waste across the Pacific constrain feasibility of both disposal and treatment options. As a result, Hawaii has relied on risk-based closures and on-site management of contamination for many sites as these are frequently much more feasible alternatives to implement. However, especially in the face of rapid land use changed redevelopment, Hawaii is facing the challenge on how to effectively control and how to keep the engineering and institutional controls in place over long periods and changing uses, and control soil export from those sites. Additionally, in our low-lying coastal regions, future sea level rise has the potential to reduce the effectiveness of engineering and institutional controls and mobilize previously contained environmental hazards.

**Refining the Proactive Approach to Contamination State-wide**

The biggest challenge we face in the HEER Office is that the majority of recently reported releases are the result of historic industrial and fuel handling activities, and tend to occur most frequently in industrial centers, harbors, airports, pipeline corridors and historic chemical use and storage facilities. Managing sites individually as releases are reported means that HEER often finds out after a problem or release issue has occurred.

In response to these issues, the HEER Office has begun to adopt a broad, proactive strategy to address the discovery, interim management and remediation of sites statewide. The strategy consists of three components:

1. Programmatic/Areawide Environmental Hazard Management Plans (EHMPs)
2. Extensive Public Outreach, Material Development
3. Site and Document tracking by the public via iHEER & Notification System Use
4. Automated DigClean Alerts to County permittees receiving approvals for ground disturbing activities in areas where known or presumed contamination in present. The system directs the permittee to site-specific hazard information at their proposed work site and telephone or email assistance on

protective measures needed to safely manage potentially contaminated soils or groundwater.

The combination of these four components allows the HEER Office to address potential sites before they become issues by providing the public at-large with as much information and guidance as possible about potential hazards before contamination or potential contamination is encountered. Our priority is provide consistent, publicly available information about local and areawide contamination concerns that property owners, tenants, developers and prospective purchasers can use to keep their tenants, contractors and the public safe from contamination exposures on their properties.

Notification and tracking allow the HEER Office to flag sites with known historic contamination entering the redevelopment process before construction starts. This enables early intervention by the HEER Office during the planning process of development rather than having to stop construction that can lead to costly delays. It also prevents unintended exposure of construction workers and the general public.

Lastly, the development of a C-EHMP streamlines information gathering about the proposed project and distills contaminant management to essentials, while prescribing expected minimum hazard management procedures. The template will reduce time and costs in preparation of the document and will more effectively protect human health and the environment by adding minimum handling standards and tracking of companies involved in the project.

This enables HEER to maintain its services to the public. Here is a brief description of the three components:

**Programmatic/Areawide Environmental Hazard Management Plans (EHMP)**

There are several areas throughout the State that we know have significant contamination being left in place after remedies have been selected and implemented. As the residual contamination may still pose a potential risk to utility and construction workers performing sub-surface maintenance and development activities, guidance has been developed and provided to these entities to protect their workers as they do work in these contaminated areas. This is the primary role of areawide EHMPs and they address areas where 1) the type of contamination is known through several

site-specific investigations in the area and 2) the contingency plans for handling the type of contamination in question is well defined. By providing information regarding management of the various media (soil, groundwater, soil gas) up front, all entities performing intrusive work in the area will be prepared and equipped to manage any hazard they may encounter. This also provides better worker safety and reduces the number of incidents that our emergency responders must address.

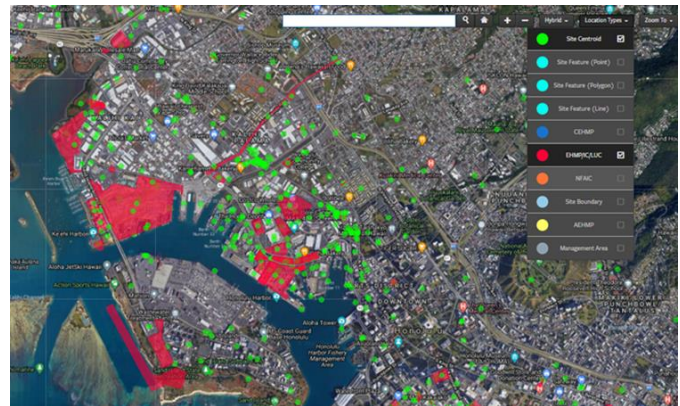
**Extensive Public Outreach & Material Development**  
Environmental Hazard Management Plans and other types of institutional controls are only as effective as the amount of awareness affected parties have. Public outreach and continuing education to all relevant parties (utilities, lenders, contractors, State departments, etc.) is required to reinforce what needs to be done and maintain site safety. Meeting with the various stakeholders annually allows the HEER Office to get its safety message out consistently and frequently. HEER Office outreach materials for the various types of contamination (UXO, arsenic, petroleum) on sites are developed and regularly updated keep these important messages fresh in the minds of the public.

During FY2022 the HEER Office maintained outreach to other State Departments and City and County Departments involved in Construction and Design such as DOT Airports and City and County of Honolulu Department of Design and Construction, and General Contractors aiming at raising awareness of proper contaminant handling at the engineer and planning level. The HEER Office assisted DOT Airports with the ongoing implementation of the DOH-approved Programmatic EHMP to manage contamination encountered at all State-owned airports. In addition, the HEER Office reviewed and provided comments on DOT Airports updated bid specs regarding the handling and management of contaminated media during construction projects. At the same time the HEER Office continues to raise awareness on the construction worker level by providing Contaminant Awareness Training. In FY2020, HEER first published a C-EHMP template and a C-EHMP Addendum, which may be used for construction projects at sites with an existing, HEER Office approved long-term EHMP. The use of these templates has resulted in more appropriate and cost-effective preparation of C-EHMPs. Revisions to these templates will be completed as the need arises.

To assist developers, landowners, and contractors better understand the steps to properly identify and manage contamination during their projects, the HEER Office has prepared Fact Sheets for property owners. The Fact Sheet focuses on providing guidance on identifying and managing contaminated media. These Fact Sheets help provide information so developers, landowners, and contractors can comply with appropriate environmental rules and regulations, better estimate project costs, avoid project work stoppage with better planning for anticipated encountering of contamination during construction, and describes steps to take when contamination is encountered.

**Site and Document tracking by the public via iHEER & Notification System Use**

iHEER is the HEER Office’s site management and document repository system. SDAR sites can be located on a map-based viewer by the public, site information viewed, and many documents directly downloaded. Some restrictions on site viewability and document download apply due to site security or ongoing investigations. iHEER can be accessed via the following link: <https://eha-cloud.doh.hawaii.gov/iheer#!/home>

iHEER development has made significant progress during the last FY. After last year’s Public Record document migration from the previous system, development of the system focused on further development of the site viewer, grouping, and labeling

sites for specific categories. For better site identification site centroids and site boundaries were separated into different layers. Additional layers were added to be able to track site controls such as site-specific EHMPs, Areawide EHMPs, and temporary Construction EHMPs. For internal management, a layer was added to include site-specific features. Site with controls and sites without controls can also be separately viewed.

1,028 Brownfield sites have been tagged and are searchable via a query. Sites affected by an anticipated 3.2 feet of sea-level rises (SLR) and anticipated acute flooding (3.2 feet of SLR plus 1 percent annual chance of flooding) have been tagged and can be queried.

Lastly, iHEER has been updated with a feature that imports the previous status prior to migration from the previous database and updates the status based on either uploaded new documents, document transfer, or a manual override.

This fiscal year, SDAR staff continued to update site data for individual sites with the addition of site centroids and property boundaries, EHMP boundaries, and site features. All new incoming documents are processed in iHEER now and are directly accessible thereafter. The immediate access to all documents by staff turned out to be especially advantageous during allowed teleworking as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **Honolulu Rail Transit Project**

As drivers along H-1 see every day on their morning commutes, the rail project is becoming a reality. The Honolulu Rail Transit Project (HRTTP) guideways are springing up across the landscape and pre-construction activities are occurring all along the route. The HEER Office maintains close regulatory oversight of the HRTTP to ensure any contamination encountered during construction is managed safely, efficiently and in accordance with state law.

The HRTTP includes construction of 21 rail stations, installation of hundreds of columns to support 20 miles of elevated guideways, extensive utility relocations, a large rail car maintenance and storage facility, and several park and rides.

During FY2022, construction slowed or stopped at five westernmost stations. Additionally, guideway construction accelerated in the industrialized area near

the airport, and preconstruction activities associated with utility relocation continued throughout the City Center part of the project. Both the Airport and City Center Guideway Areas are located within densely populated regions of Oahu in areas with much higher potential for contamination than the western segments. HDOH is particularly concerned with an area along Dillingham where Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) contractors encountered very high volatile concentrations during geotechnical boring several years ago. The Dillingham section rail alignment has been shifted to the mauka side of the Dillingham, due to the hazards and density of utilities buried under the roadway.

To address environmental concerns in accordance with the Programmatic EHE-EHMP, oversight of the HRTTP continues to require close coordination between the HEER Office SDAR Section and multiple other regulatory authorities. During FY2022, the SDAR Section worked closely with the Solid and Hazardous Waste Branch (SHWB), the Clean Water Branch (CAB), and the HEER Office's EP&R Section on the HRTTP.

### **DOT – Airports Collaboration on Airport Rail Construction**

The Hawaii Department of Transportation, Airports Division (HDOT) continued to be a valuable partner in FY2021. Their close oversight of construction within their property boundaries has alerted HDOH to several issues. The partnership allows HDOH contractors to access portions of the construction to do audits and construction to ensure compliance with the Programmatic EHE-EHMP. The coordination with HDOT has helped HDOH ensure construction continues safely, while collecting data that will help HDOT continue the investigation after HART returns the site to HDOT. The HEER Office continues to work closely with DOT-A to remediate legacy and new issues with petroleum releases and PFAS contamination.

### **EPA Brownfields Funding Supports Rail Cleanup and Assessment of City Center Sites**

NTS – City Center Group 1-5 Phase IIs in conjunction with characterizations of properties HART has not acquired.

Last fiscal year, HDOH had a joint meeting with HART to discuss project details and upcoming reviews associated with two Brownfields grants HART received. A cleanup grant was awarded to investigate disposal options for soil and groundwater at the future Iwilei

Station site and an assessment grant targeted 99 properties for Phase I Environmental Site Assessments in the City Center Area. This year, additional sites have been added to the cleanup grant work. For the HECO Site (Downtown Station Makai Lot), a Sampling and Analysis Plan was approved, samples were collected and HEER reviewed and provided comment on the Phase II Site Assessment Report.

In FY 2017, HART also began attending regular status conferences between HART and a large property owner. There is an agreement between HART and the property owners stating that the owners will investigate and remediate the property and then relinquish ownership to HART. The property in question is key to a large parking structure and new highway access ramps near the Rail Operations Center. Although HDOH had been working directly with the property owner since November 2014 with the goal of closing the site, characterization and remediation kept stalling. In FY2021, we were finally able to close the second portion of the site and are in the process of closing the other two portions of the property in FY 2022.

### **Unexploded Ordnance (UXO) Issues Throughout the State**

UXO continues to be one of the main contaminants of concern throughout the State. Over the past two decades, dozens of UXO investigations have taken place throughout the State at both active military installations and Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS), highlighting the number and severity of the UXO problem. Many of the areas that have been and are currently being investigated are in or near residential areas (Waimea/Kamuela, Waikoloa Village, Maku'u/Popoki) and/or in areas heavily trafficked by the public (Maunawili Trail, Hapuna Beach, Bellows Air Force Base, Molokini, 'Ahihi Kina'u, etc.). Since there is no way to ensure 100% clearance of a UXO site, these sites present a potential danger to the public at-large. The HEER Office has continued to work with Department of Defense counterparts to address UXO concerns and inform the public of hazards.

As pandemic-related travel restrictions eased in FY2022, the HEER Office began participating again in outreach with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to discuss UXO safety with the public at sites on Hawaii Island and on Molokai and began making plans to participate with USACE in future outreach in FY2023 on Oahu, Lanai, Maui, and Kauai as

well. The HEER Office also continued utilizing the services of Terradex, Inc. to monitor excavation notifications in the Waikoloa Maneuver Area and a followed-up to the FY2021 direct-mailing to stakeholders in the Waikoloa Maneuver Area on Hawaii Island is scheduled to by identify new property-owners for targeted mailings of information about the 2019 Area-wide Environmental Hazard Management Plan (AEHMP) to address UXO hazards and provide safe guidance for redevelopment. Outreach and stakeholder participation meetings were also conducted for Air Force sites at Bellows Air Force Station on Oahu and for Hawaii Army National Guard sites on Maui.

In FY2022 the HEER Office continued its regulatory oversight of munitions response activities by the Department of Defense (DoD) throughout the state. Several munitions response site projects at Bellows Air Force Station, Waikoloa Maneuver Area, and the Navy's Lualualei are proceeding following re-evaluation of previous investigations at the request of HDOH and in light of new munitions response guidance from EPA. At some of these sites, Advanced Geophysical Classification (AGC) techniques and equipment are being implemented and evaluated. While the HEER Office has expressed some doubts about AGC in the past, the preliminary data is showing that the technology has some promise. Although AGC is not practical or functional for all sites in the state, in some areas it is showing promise in reducing the number of false-positive detections associated with the high iron content in Hawaiian soils. HDOH has continued to push DoD to find improved technology to address the munitions hazards in Hawaii, particularly underwater munitions that litter many offshore islets and near shore areas. Overall, munitions from former military training activities throughout the state continue to pose significant hazards that require HDOH oversight, particularly as development activities such as solar farms and residential housing expand into impacted areas.

At Pu'u Pa'a, adjacent to the Waikoloa Maneuver Area on Hawaii Island, in FY2022 the U.S. Army Garrison completed field work for a Time Critical Removal Action (TCRA) on close to 3,000 acres. The TCRA was requested by HDOH after 14 unexploded ordnance (UXO) items were discovered by a farmer installing fencing across the property. The field work involved removal of UXO from the surface of the site where an additional 46 UXO items, ranging in size from small



fuze components and 37mm projectiles to 155mm high-explosive Mk I/III projectiles, were removed. Additional work to address sub-surface munitions at the 3,000 acres and the remaining 10,000+ acres of Pu'u Pa'a will continue to be conducted by the Army in accordance with CERCLA with oversight by the HEER Office.

**Brownfields Re-development of Various Properties Across the State and Counties**

Land re-use and re-development is critical when living on an island and to facilitate that, the HEER Office has dedicated its time and resources to assist private parties in their endeavors. In addition to these projects, the HEER Office has assisted the City and County of Honolulu in researching potential parcels for use as transitional housing.

The HEER Office has had a longstanding relationship with DBEDT and continues to assist DHHL, DOT, DOE, and other State departments in providing guidance and oversight for their projects. The HEER Office assisted County of Kauai with their successful application for the EPA Brownfields Community-Wide Assessment Grant. The County of Kauai was granted \$300,000 to be used to revitalize and help underserved populations in the County of Kauai. Their planning and work under this grant is currently underway and expected to be completed by September 2023. The Brownfields grant funding will support efforts to assess and clean-up contaminated and abandoned industrial and commercial properties.

**High Priority State Sites**

A key role of the HEER Office is to identify sites where current or projected exposures to hazardous chemicals could pose a threat to public health or the environment. These sites receive high priority designations. In 2018 there were 66 high priority sites in the Hawaii State Response Program. Examples of major progress on high priority sites are described below:

**Kapalama Container Yard Development**

The Kapalama Container Yard project is a massive re-development project on both land and sea. The area was utilized by multiple and various tenants after it was transferred to the State from the Army in 1983 when it was known as the Kapalama Military Reservation. Historic information regarding the former

military reservation indicated petroleum, heavy metal, and PCB contamination on-site. An investigation was performed prior to construction and an EHMP was implemented on the site. Given the vast amount of soil and concrete that needs to be moved or disposed of, the HEER Office has worked closely with DOT's contractor Kiewit and the Solid Waste Section to ensure that the material being generated is being handled in accordance with state regulations.

During this fiscal year, the Kapalama Container Yard Project progressed to the next phase- the development of the Wharf Area and dredging in the harbor. A new Construction Environmental Hazard Management Plan (C-EHMP) was prepared by the DOT Harbor's contractor Kiewit to address project-specific environmental concerns for this phase of the project for the on-land portion. The basic management and handling procedures of the original environmental hazard management plan (EHMP) still apply, but they are refined by the C-EHMP Addendum.

The primary focus in FY22 was to safely manage dredge spoils the USCG dredged to allow needed draft depths to access the Kapalama Project. DOT-Harbors assisted USCG by dewatering the dredge materials on site with concurrence from DOH and proper re-use or disposal of spoils with concentrations exceeding DOH EALs.

**Iwilei Areawide Contamination**

Because of extensive historic petroleum contamination in subsurface soils dating back to territorial days, Honolulu Harbor remains one of HEER's top priorities. This fiscal year, the HEER office focused on the effects of remaining fuel on methane generation in groundwater and vapor from these sites which could pose a long-term problem for the State. While most of the petroleum plumes appear stable and not migrating in the area, the remaining petroleum is a carbon source for methane producing microbes. Methane production appears to be affected by rising water levels which may be exacerbated in the future with sea-level rise. Rising water and seawater levels bring less oxygen to the subsurface and may result in increased hydrogen sulfide gas and methane production. Further, methane (and hydrogen sulfide gas) in vapors is controlled by barometric pressure changes which become very important with increase in frequency of storm events. Increase and severity of flooding, sea-level rise, and storm events is expected to rise in the future as a result of climate change,

which all may increase methane and hydrogen sulfide gas issues and cut pose significant health problems and risk of fire and explosions. The HEER office is currently investigating the magnitude and distribution of this problem and has initiated response actions with responsible parties. Identified problematic areas include active petroleum fuel terminals, areas of previous pipelines, and historic petroleum handling and storage facilities. Work is underway at a number of high priority sites, including:

**BHP GASCO Benzene Site/Dole Cannery Building Site, Oahu**

The BHP Gasco Site was the most hazardous site in the State with high benzene concentrations in soil and groundwater as a result of releases from former gas manufacturing activities. The site is situated next to the Dole Cannery Building and is being remediated under a consent agreement signed in March 2004. The BHP Gasco Site has completed active remediation and source reduction and has been re-developed into a warehouse. Engineering and institutional controls have been implemented and the site together with the neighboring Dole Cannery Building is currently under a combined long-term monitoring program for groundwater, soil vapor, and indoor air monitoring after a warehouse was newly and underlain by an impermeable vapor barrier and a sub-slab ventilations system. Semi-annual monitoring was conducted during this fiscal year but will likely transition to annual monitoring next fiscal year due to overall lowered concentrations of benzene at the site. However, the site needs to be closely monitored for potential changes in the redox system and potential associated methane and/or other short chain hydrocarbon production. Iwilei District Participating Parties (IDPP) Enforceable Agreement for Areawide Contamination.

The Iwilei District Participating Parties (IDPP), LLC, has completed intensive investigation and early cleanup actions for their areas of responsibility in Honolulu Harbor. Public participation and remedy selection are now complete for all major Operable Units (OU).

IDPP has implemented the remedies and response actions required by DOH to manage residual petroleum contamination in subsurface soils. These include free product removal, infrastructure repairs and a variety of institutional and engineering controls required to ensure long-term protectiveness of the remedies for future generations and the nearby marine environment. Site-specific EHMPs have been

developed for OU1C and the old Hilo Hattie property. EHMPs are being developed for the rest of the OUs (1A, 1B, 2) as well as the OU3 properties within Nimitz Highway. OU-1C received a No Further Action Determination with Institutional Controls (NFA-IC) in August 2018 and a refined methane survey has been completed. An EHMP has been completed for the site. In FY21, DOH and IDPP have focused on the long-term monitoring and controls needed at OU1B to address current and future risks as part of the final EHMP development for the site. IDPP maintains that the proposed 20 to 30-year monitoring period approved in the remedy for this operable unit to safely manage the historic petroleum spilled into the subsurface is no longer necessary, given short-term monitoring conducted previously for 2 to 3 years. Given changing ocean and atmospheric conditions due to climate change and sea level rise, long-term monitoring measurements to understand temporal changes cannot be replaced by short-term sampling completed years ago. These dynamic conditions in harbors and shorelines can increase methane generation and release, posing threats in the short term and in the future due to sea-level rise, increasing king tides, flooding and increasing storm frequency.

HEER works to stay up to date on changing environmental hazards, and adjusts remedies when data show new risks to human health and the environment are present. We hope to resolve the needed sampling approach for OU1B early in FY22 and begin collecting data that will assess methane generation hazard conditions and determine what actions are needed to ensure methane concentrations generated at this and other similar sites don't pose health or explosive risks. We also look to resolve the long-term responsibility and liability for management of historic petroleum spills in the subsurface has also not been clarified between the IDPP potential responsible parties.

**Oversight of Department of Defense Superfund Sites on the National Priorities List**

**Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam**

Multiple Basewide Preliminary Assessments (PA) have been conducted by the Navy to identify and evaluate sites potentially impacted by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). The primary focus of the PA was to identify areas that may have been impacted by historical and/or current use of aqueous film-forming

foam (AFFF) or other PFAS-containing products and to make prioritized recommendations as to which sites will be investigated in a site inspection (SI). Draft SI Work Plans have been submitted for regulatory review. Pearl Harbor Sediment Study, Pearl Harbor Naval Complex (PHNC).

The Navy continues to implement remedial actions, under CERCLA, that were described in a Record of Decision signed in September 2018. The selected CERCLA remedial actions include a combination of dredging, placement of a thin layer of clean material to enhance natural recovery (ENR), monitored natural recovery (MNR), and in-situ treatment with activated carbon (AC).

A Memorandum to File Regarding Record of Decision (ROD) for Pearl Harbor Sediment and Disposition of Sediment has been submitted by the Navy to address sediment that is not subject to a remedial action under the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) and therefore, not subject to the Off-Site Rule. The sediment from these areas would be eligible for consideration for ocean disposal evaluation. The Navy has also submitted a Draft Final Environmental Monitoring and Management Plan and Remedial Action Work Plan for regulatory review.

**Pearl City Fuel Annex (PCFA), Pearl City Peninsula, Pearl Harbor Fleet Industrial Supply Center (PHFISC)**

The PCFA site is located within the Pearl Harbor Naval Complex, on the Pearl City Peninsula, which is between the Middle and East Lochs of Pearl Harbor. Originally constructed in 1944, the site was used as a fuel storage complex where tanks historically stored fuel including jet propellant, motor gasoline, aviation gasoline, ballast, waste oil, and liquid purge waste. Actual operations at the PCFA ended in 2006.

Multiple historical petroleum releases have occurred at the site and aqueous film-forming foam was used during a 1985 fire that rendered former Tank #1 inoperable. Past maintenance activities at the former industrial facility generated various waste streams, including used sandblast grit, tank-bottom sludge, and tank condensate. Previous environmental investigations have documented past waste disposal practices, which included discharging sludge and tank condensate directly to the ground surface. This practice was discontinued but resulted in the release of metals and polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) to the ground surface. A Remedial Investigation

concluded that subsurface soil contamination was generally associated with subsurface petroleum releases and not associated with surface contamination releases. Contaminants of Potential Concern previously detected in site subsurface soils were volatile organic compounds (VOCs), total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), PAHs, and metals. Metals, TPH, and PAHs have previously been detected in groundwater above site screening levels. All former structures within the PCFA have been demolished. A Draft Remedial Investigation Addendum Work Plan has been submitted by the Navy for regulatory review. The principal objectives are to address data gaps in the current conceptual site model and data are needed to evaluate the nature and extent of contamination to assess whether exposure to site contamination could pose unacceptable risks to human health and the environment. The data gaps in the conceptual site model require data to be collected to address the following: whether soil and groundwater have been impacted by the historical use and storage of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) at the site; whether soil vapor has been impacted by COPCs at concentrations that represent a potential vapor intrusion hazard for hypothetical receptors in future site buildings; and whether COPC concentrations in groundwater have significantly changed since the last groundwater sampling event in 2011. A risk assessment will be conducted to determine whether exposure to soil, groundwater, and soil vapor poses unacceptable risks to current and hypothetical receptors.

**Naval Computer and Telecommunications Area Master Station (NCTAMS)**

Final Five-Year CERCLA Review for NCTAMS PAC National Priorities List Sites, JBPHH, Lualualei Annex and Wahiawa Annex was submitted in August of 2020. All remedies were functioning as intended and remain protective of human health and the environment.

On June 25, 2020, the Department signed the Record of Decision for the East Gulch Disposal Area (EGDA), JBPHH Wahiawa Annex, Oahu, Hawaii. The ROD documents the decision made by the Navy and USEPA, with the concurrence from HDOH, that this site is a part of the NCTAMS Pacific National Priorities List (NPL) was deemed No Further Action (NFA). The final decision had been selected in accordance with CERCLA, as amended by Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA), and to the extent practicable, the National Oil and Hazardous Substances

Pollution Contingency Plan (NCP), and the Office of the President of the United States Executive Order 12580 (EO 1987).

The final remedy was chosen after a Time-Critical Action Removal (TCRA) was performed and completed in March of 2017. Approximately 930 tons of CERCLA-regulated non-hazardous soil and 69.11 tons of waste debris were removed and disposed of from the steep-walled gulch slope. It was reported that the EGDA was used as a disposal site for municipal refuse, construction debris and inert objects (metal debris, e.g., washing machine and a truck) from the early 1940s to 1973. These waste materials were pushed over the edge of the gulch, impacting the slope's surface and subsurface soils and likely contamination of the surface water and sediment in Poamoho Stream. Upon completion of the TCRA, confirmation sampling for the areas of concern indicated that there is no unacceptable risk for human health and the environment at the EGDA site. Of the site's chemicals of potential concern (COPCs); polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), chlorinated pesticides, total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), and metals, the residual concentration of analytes that remain were well below the cleanup action levels (2017 EPA Regional Screening Levels for Residential Soil and the HDOH 2017 Environmental Action Levels for Soils) and will not pose adverse effects under an unrestricted use/unlimited exposure (UU/UE) scenario.

While the groundwater is a potential source of drinking water, the impacts were evaluated but deemed insignificant due to the relatively stable nature of the COPCs and the groundwater's approximation, 900 ft below ground surface.

Poamoho stream, located at the base of the site, was sampled during the 2015 SI (Site Investigation) Addendum. Surface water and sediment were collected and analyzed from upstream, midstream and downstream but did not contain concentrations of COPC's greater than the project screening levels. The runoff from rainfall was not considered to be a significant exposure pathway. Runoff would quickly drain away from the site due to the gulch's steep terrain.

Though the sampling confirmed that the soils met the requirements for residential, unrestricted use, the Navy has not indicated a change in use of the EDGA

site since it is in an inaccessible, undeveloped area that is located on a steep gulch.

Site restoration and slope stabilization (introduction of hydro mulch) were implemented on the upper and mid portions of the gulch slope where most of the contamination was discovered. In addition, a three-wire cable barrier was installed at the top of the gulch, along with posted signs that reads, "No Dumping" and "No Trespassing Government Property" to discourage unauthorized entry and illegal dumping activities. A secondary barrier was also installed to prevent vehicle access to the north hiking trail.

Multiple Basewide Preliminary Assessments (PA) have been conducted by the Navy to identify and evaluate sites potentially impacted by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). The primary focus of the PA was to identify areas that may have been impacted by historical and/or current use of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) or other PFAS-containing products and to make prioritized recommendations as to which sites will be investigated in a site inspection (SI). Draft SI Work Plans have been submitted for regulatory review.

State Oversight of Key Federal Facilities Not listed on the National Priorities List:

**Pacific Missile Range Facility, Barking Sands, Kauai**  
Basewide Preliminary Assessments (PA) have been conducted by the Navy to identify and evaluate sites potentially impacted by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). The primary focus of the PA was to identify areas that may have been impacted by historical and/or current use of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) or other PFAS-containing products and to make prioritized recommendations as to which sites will be investigated in a site inspection (SI). Draft SI Work Plans have been submitted for regulatory review.

**Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam**  
Non-Base Realignment and Closure (non-BRAC) areas of the Former Naval Air Station Barbers Point Navy Munitions Command East Asia Division Pearl Harbor, Lualualei Annex.

A base-wide preliminary assessment was conducted to identify and evaluate sites potentially impacted by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) releases at non-NPL areas of JBPHH and associated non-NPL properties, Navy Munitions Command East Asia

Division Pearl Harbor, Lualualei Annex, and non-BRAC areas of the Former Naval Air Station Barbers Point, Kalaheo. The primary purpose of the preliminary assessment was to identify areas that may have been impacted by historic and/or current use of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) or other PFAS-containing products, and to make prioritized recommendations as to which sites will be investigated in a site inspection (SI).

**Marine Corps Base Hawaii and Associated Facilities**

A base-wide preliminary assessment was conducted to identify and evaluate sites potentially impacted by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) releases at Marine Corps Base Hawaii (MCBH) and at associated annexes including Marine Corps Base Camp H. M. Smith, Manana Housing, Marine Corps Training Area Bellows (MCTAB), and Puuloa Range Training Facility. The primary purpose of the preliminary assessment was to identify areas that may have been impacted by historic and/or current use of aqueous film-forming foam (AFFF) or other PFAS-containing products, and to make prioritized recommendations as to which sites will be investigated in a site inspection (SI).

**State Oversight of Military Munitions Response Program (MMRP) Sites**

The MMRP was created in 2001 and involved all branches of the military creating an inventory of formerly used/closed ranges across the country and its territories. These sites were put into the CERCLA process and are currently being addressed by the respective branches. Sites on properties that are no longer under the control of DoD and were transferred prior to October 17, 1986 are handled by the US Army Corps of Engineers under the Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS) Program. Half of the MMRP sites currently under investigation in the State are part of the FUDS program (14 active projects). Some of the most prominent MMRP sites are listed below:

**Waikoloa Maneuver Area**

The Waikoloa Maneuver Area is one of the largest FUDS in the nation (currently the entire site is approximately 185,000 acres which includes approximately 120,000 acres identified as potential munitions use areas), with a cost of over \$700 million to complete investigation and cleanup. With a \$10 million annual operating budget for the Waikoloa Maneuver Area is \$10 million; it will take decades to fully investigate and remove explosive hazards. The site is divided into 22 different munitions response

areas/sectors. In the past few years, the US Army Corps of Engineers has attempted to pivot toward clearing areas of the Waikoloa Maneuver Area that are high-use residential and commercial areas and in areas proposed for new residential construction. Over the past year, the Corps of Engineers has completed most of the remediation field work for the DHHL Lalamilo property, which is expected to reach site closure in FY2023. USACE also conducted a Historical Data Review (HDR) to evaluate previous UXO clearance work conducted in Area BOQJ during a series of Non-Time-Critical Removal Actions (NTCRAs) between 2002 and 2016. The HDR was prepared in support of a Remedial Design (RD) for the entire 4,000+ acre BOQJ Munitions Response Site (MRS). The HDR determined that USACE had low confidence in the ability of the previous work to meet the current project objectives of protectiveness of the public. Therefore, the RD, which includes parts of Waimea/Kamuela Town, Lalamilo Farm Lots, DHHL’s Lalamilo property, and communities along Kawaihae Road, will likely expand the acreage requiring additional remediation from what was specified in the Decision Document. USACE has already discovered over a dozen UXO items in “previously cleared” areas of BOQJ, including along the stream near DHHL’s Lalamilo housing project and in other residential areas. These additional investigations were instigated by HEER Office concerns about USACE’s reliance on NTCRA data in selecting remedial alternatives. Other FUDS munitions sites that the HEER Office oversaw in FY2022 include Papohaku Ranchlands on Molokai and Oahu Island Targets on Oahu’s North Shore.

**Lalamilo/Area BOQJ, Waikoloa Maneuver Area**

The Department of Hawaiian Homelands (DDHL) Lalamilo parcel is located almost entirely within the MRS that was previously designated at BOQJ-Cleared. The Lalamilo parcel had been included in a Removal Action to reduce the UXO concentration in 2005 although there were a few small areas of the site that had not been “cleared” and were considered exception areas. Therefore, USACE has not yet been able to issue a Final Remedial Action Report (RAR) for Area BOQJ-Cleared and Lalamilo. This RAR is necessary for HDOH to issue a No Further Action of Conditional No Further Action with Institutional Controls (CNFA w/ICs) status to the site in order to satisfy U.S. Department Housing and Urban Development (HUD) financing restrictions which are disproportionately impacting DHHL beneficiaries. A 2016 Decision Document for Area BOQJ-Cleared required USACE to remove munitions

and explosives of concern (MEC) from the surface and subsurface of unobstructed areas where removal had not previously been completed. However, in around 2018/2019, HDOH began to have concerns about some of the previous Removal Action work performed in the WMA based on MEC and munitions debris that were encountered at other “previously cleared” parcels in Area P. Therefore, HDOH asked USACE to conduct a Post Remediation Verification investigation of those “previously cleared” areas at the Lalamilo parcel and other BOQJ-Cleared areas before issuing the RAR. Consequently, USACE revised their plans for the Remedial Action at BOQJ-Cleared and redirected the funding for that project to re-clear 160 acres within the Lalamilo parcel using a combination of new Advances Geophysical Classification (AGC) and traditional analog survey methods. This field work began in 2021 and continued through FY2022. During this field work, nine additional UXO items, mostly hand-grenades, were discovered in the “previously cleared” acreage that DHHL has planned for residential development. The HEER Office has been involved in decision making steps throughout the Lalamilo investigation, in part because it is employing new AGC technology that has yet to be proven effective in Hawaii but so far is showing great promise. To further address HEER Office concerns about the rest of BOQJ-Cleared, USACE initiated a Remedial Design (RD) to evaluate the previous Removal Action work across the entire 4,481-acre MRS. In 2021, as part of the RD, USACE completed a Historical Document Review that determined USACE had low confidence in all nine of the previous Non-Time Critical Removal Actions that had included Areas BOQJ-Cleared and BOQJ-Remnants, primarily due to lack of adequate quality control documentation. In FY2022, USACE began RD investigations that include a combination of transect investigations, grid investigations, and 100% surface and subsurface investigations across the combined BOQJ MRS using a combination of AGC and analog technologies. This RD investigation is anticipated to include most areas of the DHHL Lalamilo parcel that were not included in the Remedial Action, such that a thorough clearance of the parcel is anticipated which should result in HUD funding becoming available for DHHL beneficiaries. In areas where USACE cannot state with confidence that all UXO have been removed, HDOH will have to issue a CNFA w/ICs status that requires UXO Construction Support during development. The HEER Office has requested that USACE provide UXO Construction Support as a Land Use Control in such instances but so far without success.

### **Sector 15/Pu’u Kapu, Waikoloa Maneuver Area**

Sector 15 is another area within the WMA that is mostly owned by DHHL. It includes DHHL’s Pu’u Kapu neighborhood and portions of Kuhio Village. DHHL beneficiaries in this area have also been impacted by HUD restrictions limiting their financing options. In 2018, USACE issued a Remedial Investigation (RI) report for Sector 15 and Sector 16 (an area primarily north of Kawaihae Road) along with a report for Areas A, F and G of the WMA. The HEER Office had concerns with some of the information presented in these reports and with some of the data collection methods and prepared comments on the reports in early 2019. For Sector 15, the RI had recommended no further action but stipulated that UXO may still be present. The HEER Office recommended that since the potential presence of UXO had not been ruled out, USACE should provide UXO Construction Support for any ground-disturbing activities to ensure protectiveness of residents and land users or otherwise complete a clearance of the entire site. USACE delayed responding to comments provided by the HEER Office and their contract to complete the RI expired. Consequently, activity at Sector 15 was put on de facto hold until FY2022 when USACE issued a new contract to complete the RI. The HEER Office has been working with USACE to develop the work plan for the completion of the RI, currently scheduled for FY2023. New changes to EPA munitions response RI guidance and additional historical use information provided in the recently finalized (August 2022) Preliminary Assessment report for the WMA are expected to help resolve some of the issues regarding Sector 15. Forward progress to complete remedial activities and satisfies HUD requirements at Sector 15 are one of the top three priorities in the WMA.

In FY2022, the HEER Office also oversaw remedial investigation activities at several sites at the Navy’s Luualalei Annex and at a former bazooka range the Marine Corps’ Camp Smith on Oahu. Additionally, the HEER Office worked closely with the Air Force to oversee the munitions response at three sites in the Bellows Air Force Station on Oahu’s east side and a Time-Critical Removal Action by the Army Garrison at Pu’u Pa’a on Hawaii Island. Long-term management and Interim Risk Management of munitions sites that have completed remediation with residual risk of munitions remaining or that are still awaiting munitions response were also conducted in FY2022. Munitions sites under long-term management include

Waikane Valley, Makua, Waikakalau, and former shooting ranges at Schofield Barracks and Fort Shafter. Interim Risk Management sites include Molokini Island, Lanai Bombing Targets, and Puu Makakilo Training Area.

### **Pu'u Pa'a**

In FY2022 the US Army Garrison- Hawaii completed a Time-Critical Removal Action (TCRA) at the request of HDOH on approximately 3,000 acres of Pu'u Pa'a/ Pu'u Pa'a former Army training site is located within the boundaries of the former Waikoloa Maneuver Area but is not part of the FUDS Program. The site was not relinquished back to the private property owner until the 2000s, therefore, the clean-up of this site is the responsibility of the US Army Garrison-Hawaii, rather than the US Army Corps of Engineers. In March of 2018, the HEER Office requested TCRA to address 2,800 acres of the property currently used by a goat farmer and his family, as well as modifications to the Remediation Alternatives presented in the Draft RI/FS. In 2017, the farmer had encountered 14 UXOs while constructing a fence on the property. The TCRA was limited to removal of UXO items on the surface within the Removal Action area and resulted in the discovery and disposal of .46 UXO items and over 15,000 tons of munitions debris. Remedial Action is still required to address the remaining UXO in the subsurface and in the rest of the 13,500-acre Pu'u Pa'a site. This work will be evaluated in the Feasibility Study and proposed plan for the site. In the interim, the Army Garrison is providing limited UXO Construction Support for

activities within Pu'u Pa'a, which is owned primarily by Parker Ranch.

### **Bellows Air Force Station**

In 2020, the HEER Office reviewed remedial action plans for several sites at Bellows Air Force Station in Waimanalo and noticed that the remedial investigations for munitions and explosives of concern had not been adequate to delineate the nature and extent of munitions hazards at the sites. The Air Force modified their plans to incorporate educational outreach and fencing to warn the community of the potential hazards, but this proposal met resistance from the community. In 2021, the HEER Office worked with the community and the Air Force, as well as several legislative and congressional representatives to look at alternatives and the Air Force agreed to re-investigate the site in order to gather more data to better estimate the risk posed to the community at the site and then to reassess the remedial alternatives. In August 2022, the Air Force will complete field work of the former Urban Warfare Training Area located between the Bellows Air Force Station entrance at Waimanalo Stream and Hunananiho Beach Park. This Remedial Design investigation involves transects across a percentage of the site to re-evaluate the nature and extent of UXO items in the area that had previously had a Removal Action Clearance. Simultaneously, at the request of the HEER Office, the Air Force will investigate a portion of its Large Bomb Range site that includes its recreational beach and camping areas that had not previously been investigated.

### Sites Eligible for Possible Listing Under CERCLA

Three Hawaii sites are listed on the EPA National Priority List (NPL). Costs for site investigation and cleanup are being borne by the responsible parties. The state is not obligated to contribute to cleanup or future operation and maintenance costs.

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### The Hawaii State Response Program (HSRP) Chemical Release Notification Log

The Hawaii State Response Program Release Notification Log shows a listing of all chemical and petroleum release notifications received by the HEER Office Emergency Preparedness and Response team during the fiscal year. The Release Notification Log is sorted in order of Island, Locality, and the Case Name.

The FY2022 Release Notification Log lists 440 hazardous substance and petroleum release notifications managed by the HEER Office State On-Scene Coordinators (SOSCs). 293 cases were directly related to the release of petroleum related substances.

HEER Office SOSCs performed direct oversight on 266 cases requiring on-site visits or off-scene coordination. 70 cases were referred to other agencies.

HEER Office SOSCs actively participated in 28 oil and chemical release drills working with various commercial and response organizations.

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## The Hawaii Response Program (HSRP) – List of Priority Sites

Chapter 128D, HRS, Environmental Response Law, Section 7, HRS mandates that a State List of Sites be published annually listing the sites with potential or known hazardous substances or pollutants or contaminants. Overall, in FY2022, HEER had oversight responsibilities for 1,565 active sites and reached No Further Action determinations at 11 sites.

We present the list in two sections.

The Hawaii State Response Program List of Priority Sites presents all non-military Hawaii sites identified for potential or known non-emergency response actions under HRS 128D. Current ERRF funding supports only part of the HEER Office response obligation for these sites. 1,058 active sites under direct DOH oversight in the various State programs are listed. Eight state sites with known or suspected contamination received No Further Action Determinations.

The Hawaii State Response Program DSMOA Program List of Priority Sites presents military sites in Hawaii for which SDAR provides oversight. Hazardous substance response actions are managed by various DOD branches under CERCLA authorities, with regulatory oversight from SDAR. Cleanup sites within the Pearl Harbor Naval Complex are co-regulated by US EPA, due to the National Priorities List (“Superfund”) designation. The DOD sites include numerous high priority unexploded ordnance sites (UXO). Investigations and cleanups of military sites with petroleum-contaminated sites are conducted under 128D authorities, as petroleum is not covered under CERCLA. ERRF funds are not currently used for oversight of non-emergency military cleanups in Hawaii. Staff positions providing oversight for this work are currently funded by federal DSMOA grants. The list includes 507 sites that are co-managed by DOH and DOD under CERCLA and HRS 128D authorities.

Because the Air Force and Navy work systematically to address high priority sites first, the majority of these sites remaining are medium and low priority. In 2022, clean up decisions were reached at two DSMOA sites, some of which will require ongoing management of residual contamination through Environmental Hazard Management Plans. The lists are sorted in the order of Island, Locality or Installation, and Site Name. The site Priority, Action, and Potential Hazard are identified for each Facility/Site. Sites are categorized as a potential hazard when sampling data indicate that contaminant concentrations exceed Hawaii Environmental Action Levels. Generally, these conservative action levels are set to be protective of long term, daily exposures. Hazards are managed by removal or destruction of the contaminants (No Hazard), use restrictions that limit access to the contamination, (Institutional Controls), or physical barriers that limit exposure to the contaminants (Engineering Controls).

Over time, a site may be managed within the HEER Office under one or more program areas, starting with the site assessment phase and if required by the State, through to cleanup completion.
