ANNUAL REPORT ON THE USE AND DISCHARGE OF ELECTRIC GUNS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Pursuant to Section 134-87(b)(3), Hawaii Revised Statutes

Submitted to the Thirty-Second State Legislature Regular Session of 2023

Pursuant to section 134-87(b)(3), HRS, which took effect on January 1, 2022, the following information regarding use and discharge of electric guns by the Department of the Attorney General is provided, and covers the period from January 1, 2022, through October 31, 2022.

According to section 134-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), an "electric gun" means "any portable device that is designed to discharge electric energy, charge, voltage, or current into the body through direct contact or utilizing a projectile." It "includes but is not limited to devices commonly referred to as stun guns and Tasers" and "does not include any automatic external defibrillator used in emergency medical situations."

Law enforcement agencies, including the Department of the Attorney General, are exempted from the restrictions against possessing and using electric guns, but are required to maintain records regarding all electric guns possessed by and discharged by those agencies and report annually to the Legislature on the information in those records. The information is as follows:
