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## REPORT ON PROGRESS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IN IMPLEMENTING SECTION 2 OF ACT 315 (2022)

Pursuant to section 3 of Act 315, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022

Submitted to the Thirty-Second State Legislature Regular Session of 2023

Section 3 of Act 315, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022 (Act 315), requires each principal department of the State to submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of 2023 and 2024 on the department's progress in implementing section 2 of Act 315. Section 2 of Act 315 requires each department, office, or agency of the State to update the department, office, or agency's rules and policies to integrate the local hunting and fishing industries into any food security or sustainability strategies that the department, office, or agency employs.

The Department of the Attorney General does not have any rules or policies that may concern food security or sustainability strategies and has nothing to report.
