ACT 003

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A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE, THE AUDITOR, THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU, THE OMBUDSMAN, AND THE ETHICS COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 4 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2022-2023 has 5 already been exceeded by \$839,710,089 or 8.14 per cent. The appropriations contained in sections 2, 3, and 13 of this Act 6 7 will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal 8 year 2022-2023 to be exceeded by \$27,567,902 or 0.27 per cent. This current declaration takes into account additional general 9 fund appropriations authorized for fiscal year 2022-2023 in this 10 Act only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund 11 12 expenditure ceiling are that:

13 (1) The appropriations made in this Act are necessary to14 serve the public interest; and

15 (2) The appropriations made in this Act meet the needs16 addressed by this Act.

1	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$11,300,631 or so		
3	much thereof as may be necessary to the senate for the following		
4	expenses:		
5	(1)	The sum of \$10,038,131 for defraying any and all	
6		session and nonsession expenses of the senate up to	
7		and including June 30, 2024, including the 2023	
8		regular session, thirty-second legislature of the	
9		State of Hawaii and pre-session expenses and the	
10		expenses of any committee or committees established	
11		during the interim between the 2023 and 2024 regular	
12		sessions;	
13	(2)	The sum of \$1,150,000 for defraying the expenses of	
14		the legislative information system for cost items such	
15		as hardware, software, consultants, installation,	
16		materials, supplies, and other related costs	
17		associated with the legislative information system	
18		that have been or will be incurred; and	
19	(3)	The sum of \$112,500 for defraying the cost of the	
20		legislative broadcasting program to pay for the	
21		production and distribution of broadcasts of	

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1 legislative proceedings, including but not limited to 2 television broadcast, live streaming, and internet 3 platforms for public access. 4 The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by 5 the senate. 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$15,532,243 or so much thereof as may be necessary to the house of representatives 8 9 for the following expenses: 10 (1)The sum of \$14,481,319 for defraying any and all 11 session and nonsession expenses of the house of 12 representatives up to and including June 30, 2024, 13 including the 2023 regular session, thirty-second 14 legislature of the State of Hawaii and pre-session 15 expenses and the expense of any committee or 16 committees established during the interim between the 17 2023 and 2024 regular sessions; 18 (2) The sum of \$938,424 for defraying the expenses of the 19 legislative information system for cost items such as hardware, software, consultants, installation, 20 21 materials, supplies, and other related costs

associated with the legislative information system 1 that have been or will be incurred; and 2 (3) The sum of \$112,500 for defraying the cost of the 3 4 legislative broadcasting program to pay for the 5 production and distribution of broadcasts of 6 legislative proceedings, including but not limited to 7 television broadcast, live streaming, and internet platforms for public access. 8

9 The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by10 the house of representatives.

11 SECTION 4. Payment of expenses of the senate during the 12 interim between the 2023 and 2024 regular sessions shall be made 13 only with the approval of the president of the senate, and 14 payment of expenses of the house of representatives during the 15 interim between the 2023 and 2024 regular sessions shall be made 16 only with the approval of the speaker of the house of 17 representatives.

18 SECTION 5. Before January 17, 2024, the senate and the 19 house of representatives shall each have their accounts audited, 20 and a full report of the respective audits shall be presented to

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the senate and house of representatives convening on January 17,
 2024.

3 SECTION 6. Unless otherwise prescribed by law, the
4 expenses of any member of the legislature while traveling abroad
5 on official business of the legislature shall be \$145 a day as
6 authorized by the president of the senate and speaker of the
7 house of representatives.

8 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,474,364 or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary to the office of the auditor for the
11 following expenses:

12 (1) The sum of \$3,324,364 for defraying the expenses of
13 the office of the auditor during fiscal year
14 2023-2024; and

15 (2) The sum of \$150,000 during fiscal year 2023-2024 for:

16 (A) Performing special studies;

17 (B) Improving capabilities for planning, programming,18 and budgeting;

19 (C) Fulfilling other special requests made of the20 auditor by the legislature or jointly by the

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1		president of the senate and the speaker of the
2		house of representatives;
3	(D)	Legislative studies and contractual services for
4		those studies; and
5	(E)	Such other purposes as may be determined by the
6		joint action of the president of the senate and
7		the speaker of the house of representatives.
8	The sum ap	opropriated in this section shall be expended by
9	the auditor.	
10	SECTION 8	. There is appropriated out of the general
11	revenues of the	e State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,800,000 or so much
12	thereof as may	be necessary to the office of the auditor during
13	fiscal year 202	23-2024 to be deposited into the audit revolving
14	fund establishe	ed pursuant to section 23-3.6, Hawaii Revised
15	Statutes.	
16	SECTION 9	. There is appropriated out of the audit
17	revolving fund	the sum of \$6,300,000 or so much thereof as may
18	be necessary to	o the office of the auditor during fiscal year
19 <u>.</u>	2023-2024 for	the office to conduct or complete its audit
20	functions as p	rovided by law.

21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the auditor.

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1	SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general		
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,950,647 or so much		
3	thereof as may be necessary to the legislative reference bureau		
4	for defraying the expenses of the legislative reference bureau		
5	during fiscal year 2023-2024, including equipment relating to		
6	computer systems programming and operations.		
7	The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by		
8	the legislative reference bureau.		
9	SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general		
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,527,642 or so much		
11	thereof as may be necessary to the office of the ombudsman for		
12	defraying the expenses of the office during fiscal year		
13	2023-2024.		
14	The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by		
15	the ombudsman.		
16	SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the general		
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,541,514 or so much		
18	thereof as may be necessary to the office of the state ethics		
19	commission for defraying the expenses of the office during		
20	fiscal year 2023-2024.		

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1	The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by			
2	the state ethics commission.			
3	SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general			
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the following sums or so much			
5	thereof as may be necessary to be expended for the purpose of			
6	accrued vacation payments and vacation transfer payments for any			
7	employee leaving the employ of the senate, house of			
8	representatives, office of the auditor, legislative reference			
9	bureau, office of the ombudsman, and state ethics commission:			
10	Expending Agency Amount

12	House of Representatives \$294,524			
13	Office of the Auditor \$68,106			
14	Legislative Reference Bureau \$26,810			
15	Office of the Ombudsman \$84,035

17	provided that the appropriate expending agency shall first make			
18	payments from the vacation payout allocation before expending			
19	funds from turnover and vacancy amounts; and provided further			
20	that any unexpended funds shall lapse to the general fund on			
21	June 30, 2024.			

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SECTION 14. As of the close of business on June 30, 2024,
 the unexpended or unencumbered balance of any appropriation made
 by this Act shall lapse into the general fund.
 SECTION 15. Each section of this Act is declared to be

5 severable from the remainder of this Act.

6 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
