A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GIFTS FROM LOBBYISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to improve standards
- 2 of conduct by prohibiting lobbyists from making certain gifts to
- 3 legislators and state employees.
- 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 97, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 5 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 "§97- Unlawful gifts by lobbyists. (a) It shall be
- 8 unlawful for a lobbyist or any person or entity required to file
- 9 a statement of expenditures under section 97-3 to make a gift to
- 10 a legislator or employee that is prohibited by section 84-11 or
- 11 title 21, chapter 7 of the Hawaii administrative rules.
- 12 (b) For the purposes of this section, "employee" shall
- 13 have the same meaning as defined in section 84-3."
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 97-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 16 "(a) Any person [who:] or entity that:

14	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were

18	invalid,	the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
19	applicat:	ions of the Act that can be given effect without the
20	invalid p	provision or application, and to this end the provisions
21	of this	Act are severable.
