
# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1	. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by ame	nding subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) The	candidate and treasurer of the candidate

5	shall file pre	liminary, final, and supplemental reports as
6	follows:	
7	(1) The	filing dates for preliminary reports are:
8	(A)	February 28 of the year of a general election;

10	[ <del>(B)</del> ]	(C) Thirty calendar days before a primary,

14		calendar day before the filing deadline of those other

16	(2)	The filing date for the final primary report is twenty
17		calendar days after a primary, initial special[ $_{ au}$ ]
18		election, or initial nonpartisan election. The report

1	(3)	The filing date for the final election period report
2		is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,
3		subsequent special $[\tau]$ <u>election</u> , or subsequent
4		nonpartisan election. The report shall be current
5		through the day of the applicable election. The final
6		election period report shall be filed by a candidate
7		who is unsuccessful in a primary, initial special[ $ au$ ]
8		election, or initial nonpartisan election or a
9		candidate who is elected to office in the primary,
10		initial special $[\tau]$ election, or initial nonpartisan
11		election; provided that a candidate who is elected and
12		is to be sworn into office before thirty calendar days
13		after a general, subsequent, subsequent special[ $_7$ ]
14		election, or subsequent nonpartisan election in which
15		the candidate was elected, shall file the final
16		election period report three business days before the

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The report shall be current through December 31 for
the report filed on January 31 and current through
June 30 for the report filed on July 31."
SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2026.
