BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

"§710-1072.5 Obstruction of justice. (1) A person 3 commits the offense of obstruction of justice if the person 4 intentionally [engages in the following conduct]: 5

6	<u>(a)</u>	When called as a witness and having been granted
7		immunity pursuant to chapters 480 and $621C_{\underline{\prime}}$ before or
8		after having been qualified as a witness, [shall
9		refuse] refuses to testify or be qualified as a
10		witness when duly directed to testify or be qualified
11		as a witness[+]; or
12	(b)	Influences; obstructs; impedes; or endeavors to

influence, obstruct, or impede, the due administration 13

of justice by means of force, threat of force, 14

Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 8
