A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 46-13.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"[+] §46-13.1[+] Volunteer fire stations. (a) The council
4	of the several counties may establish and maintain one or more
5	volunteer fire stations in any area or areas of the county as it
6	may determine to be necessary to provide adequate fire
7	protection. All necessary facilities and equipment for the
8	volunteer fire stations may be furnished by the county. The
9	officers, firefighters, or other personnel necessary for the
10	operation or maintenance of these stations shall be selected and
11	appointed by the fire chief partially or entirely on a voluntary
12	noncompensatory basis [and], except as otherwise provided in
13	this section. All volunteer personnel for any volunteer fire
14	station shall serve at the pleasure of the fire chief.
15	(b) The fire chief of the county shall have full authority
16	and control over all volunteer fire stations, their equipment,
17	apparatus, officers, firefighters, and personnel, and the fire

- 1 volunteer fire station. Suitable instructors may be assigned
- 2 from time to time by the fire chief to such fire stations for
- 3 the training of volunteer firefighters and personnel.
- 4 (c) In case any person serving in the capacity of
- 5 volunteer personnel for the fire station, including a volunteer
- 6 officer or firefighter, sustains any injury or dies as a result
- 7 of any accident arising out of and in the course of training, or
- 8 the performance of duty for such fire station, the person shall
- 9 be entitled to the benefits provided for volunteer personnel in
- 10 part V of chapter 386, and be considered to be an employee of
- 11 the county for the purpose of obtaining compensation benefits
- 12 under chapter 386. Compensation benefits shall be determined
- 13 upon the basis of average weekly wages computed as set forth in
- 14 section 386-51, and upon the basis of earnings from the usual
- 15 employment of the person, or upon the basis of earnings at the
- 16 rate of \$18 per week, whichever is most favorable to the
- 17 claimant or claimants [-]; provided that for volunteer
- 18 firefighters, average weekly wages shall be computed as set
- 19 forth in section 386-181(c). The director of labor and
- 20 industrial relations shall administer the provisions [hereof] in
- 21 this subsection in accordance with section 386-172.

6	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
7	"(C)	In computing the average weekly wages of an injured
8	public bo	ard member, reserve police officer, police chaplain,
9	reserve p	ublic safety law enforcement officer, sheriffs'
10	chaplain,	volunteer firefighter, volunteer boating enforcement
11	officer,	or volunteer conservation and resources enforcement
12	officer:	
13	(1)	The person's income from self-employment shall be
14		considered wages;
15	(2)	The person shall, in no event, be considered to have
16		earned less than the minimum hourly wage prescribed in
17		chapter 387;
18	(3)	Wages of other employees in comparable employment

[shall not] may be considered; and

1	(4) All provisions of section 386-51 not inconsistent with
2	this section shall apply; provided that section 386-
3	51(5) shall not apply."
4	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6.	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
