A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE KAIWI COAST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the lands of the
- 2 Kaiwi coast are an invaluable natural asset for the people of
- 3 Numerous community members and organizations have
- 4 fought long and hard over many decades to protect and preserve
- 5 this unspoiled area for future generations.
- 6 The legislature further finds that a growing interest in
- 7 this area of Oahu has brought a rapid increase in visitors to
- 8 the Kaiwi coast. Dangerous conflict between vehicles,
- 9 pedestrians, and bicyclists along the highway is increasing the
- 10 risk of injury and death on a regular basis.
- 11 Collaboration between community organizations and
- 12 government agencies is necessary to address myriad issues, such
- 13 as ensuring safety, managing human impacts, preventing invasive
- 14 species, and restoring the local ecosystem.
- 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to protect and
- 16 preserve the lands of the Kaiwi coast in perpetuity by requiring
- 17 certain lands to be petitioned to be designated as the Kaiwi

- 1 coast state park so the area can be properly protected and
- 2 managed for the benefit of residents and future generations.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) The department of land and natural
- 4 resources shall petition the board of land and natural resources
- 5 to designate the following tax map key numbers as a state park
- 6 under the name "Kaiwi coast state park":
- 7 (1) (1)3-9-11:002; and
- **8** (2) (1)3-9-11:007.
- 9 (b) The department of land and natural resources shall
- 10 administer the lands in subsection (a) that have been designated
- 11 by the board of land and natural resources as a state park.
- 12 (c) This Act shall be exempt from the requirements of
- 13 section 171-64.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the boundary
- 14 amendment requirements of chapter 205, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- (d) All conditions and obligations related to federal
- 16 funds previously expended on lands in subsection (a) shall be
- 17 observed unless otherwise authorized by the federal government.
- 18 SECTION 3. (a) All land within or added to the Kaiwi
- 19 coast state park shall be considered for designation as
- 20 conservation land.

- 1 (b) Land in the Kaiwi coast state park shall be preserved
- 2 in perpetuity primarily in its wild and natural state.
- 3 (c) Any land added to the Kaiwi coast state park after the
- 4 effective date of this Act shall be subject to this section.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
