A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that prescription drugs may not be dispensed unless the label of the container 2 identifies the drug prescribed and provides other specific 3 information that is considered essential for public health and 4 5 safety. Nonetheless, individuals may often have difficulty 6 reading the labels on the prescription drug containers due to age or disability, including persons with low vision or 7 8 blindness. Difficulty in reading the labels on prescription 9 drug containers may affect as many as sixty thousand residents 10 in the State. The legislature further finds that certain 11 technologies provide the prescription drug label information in 12 alternate formats that are more accessible to persons who have 13 difficulty seeing or reading standard printed labels on 14 prescription drug containers. 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

1 (A) Provide accessible prescription drug label information to individuals who have difficulty 2 seeing or reading standard printed labels on 3 prescription drug containers; and 4 Make sustained, periodic, and reasonable efforts 5 (B) 6 to inform the public that prescription drug label 7 information is available in alternate accessible formats for individuals who have difficulty 8 9 seeing or reading standard printed labels on prescription drug containers; and 10 11 (2)Require the board of pharmacy to adopt certain rules 12 necessary for the purposes of this Act before 13 December 31, 2024. 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 16 and to read as follows: 17 Pharmacies; prescription drug label information; "§461-18 accessibility. (a) When dispensing a prescription drug to an 19 individual who, as acknowledged by the individual, has 20 difficulty seeing or reading standard printed labels on 21 prescription drug containers, the dispensing pharmacy shall

1 label affixed to a container of prescription drugs and provide 2 the information in an audio format accessible to the 3 individual." 4 SECTION 4. No later than December 31, 2024, the board of 5 pharmacy shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii 6 Revised Statutes, necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act. The rules adopted by the board of pharmacy shall: 7 8 (1)Set forth rules in accordance with this Act applicable 9 to hospital pharmacies and manufacturers of 10 prescription drugs that provide their products 11 directly to consumers; and 12 (2) Allow the board of pharmacy to deny, revoke, or 13 suspend a pharmacy license or impose a fine not to 14 exceed \$1,000 per violation for failure to comply with 15 the purposes of this Act. 16 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored. 17 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
