## STATEMENT OF OBJECTIONS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 964

Honorable Members Thirty-Second Legislature State of Hawai'i

Pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawai'i, I am returning herewith, without my approval, House Bill No. 964, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to the Certification of Documents."

This bill, among other things, requires the Lieutenant Governor to assess a fee of \$10 for each apostille or non-apostille certification issued. The current fee is \$1.

This bill is objectionable because the increase from \$1 to \$10 is substantial and may be unaffordable to members of the public.

For the foregoing reasons, I am returning House Bill No. 964 without my approval.

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CERTIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 4 appropriations contained in H.B. No. 300, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, 5 C.D. 1, will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 6 for fiscal year 2023-2024 to be exceeded by \$1,063,767,367 or 7 10 per cent. In addition, the appropriations contained in this 8 Act will cause the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal 9 year 2023-2024 to be further exceeded by \$10,000 or 1 per cent. 10 The combined total amount of general fund appropriations 11 contained in only these two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2023-2024 to be 12 13 exceeded by \$1,063,777,367 or 11 per cent. The reasons for 14 exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that: 15 (1)The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to

serve the public interest; and

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.1	(2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
2	addressed by this Act.
3	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
4	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
5	as follows:
6	"CHAPTER
7	APOSTILLES AND CERTIFICATIONS
8	<b>§ -1 Definitions.</b> As used in this chapter, unless the
9	context otherwise requires:
10	"Apostille" means a certification issued to authenticate
11	documents pursuant to the Hague Treaty.
12	"Hague Treaty" refers to the convention, adopted in the
13	Hague in 1961, that created a simplified form of document
14	certification for countries that joined the convention.
15	"Non-apostille certification" means a certification issued
16	by the lieutenant governor to authenticate a document for a
17	country that does not recognize the Hague Treaty.
18	<b>§ -2 Fee.</b> (a) The lieutenant governor shall assess a
19	fee of \$10 for each apostille or non-apostille certification
20	issued.

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1 Moneys collected for the issuance of apostilles or (b) 2 non-apostille certifications shall be deposited into the apostilles and certifications special fund established pursuant 3 4 to section -3. 5 -3 Apostilles and certifications special fund; S established. (a) There is established the apostilles and 6 certifications special fund, which shall be administered by the 7 office of the lieutenant governor. 8 The following shall be deposited into the special 9 (b) fund: 10 11 (1)All fees assessed for the issuance of apostilles and non-apostille certifications pursuant to 12 13 section -2; 14 Any interest earned or accrued on moneys in the (2)15 special fund; and 16 (3) Moneys appropriated by the legislature. 17 The office of the lieutenant governor may expend (C) moneys in the apostilles and certifications special fund for 18 19 operational expenses, including but not limited to postage and 20 supplies."

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SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$10,000 or so much
thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 to be
deposited into the apostilles and certifications special fund.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2024.
