A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE USE OF ELECTRONIC FILING BY THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the
- 2 electronic filing of documents by and with the public utilities
- 3 commission.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 269-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 6 and to read as follows:
- 7 ""Document" includes but is not limited to any application,
- 8 complaint, pleading, brief, answer, motion, memorandum,
- 9 declaration, exhibit, certificate of service, and other papers
- 10 filed by or with the commission."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 269-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "\$269-6.5 Electronic copies of documents. (a) No later
- 14 than July 1, 2011, the public utilities commission shall accept
- 15 from any person who submits a document to the commission the
- 16 original or one electronic copy of each application, complaint,

- 1 pleading, brief, or other document required to be filed with the
- 2 commission pursuant to this chapter, and the consumer advocate
- 3 shall accept service of one paper or electronic copy of each
- 4 application, complaint, pleading, brief, or other document filed
- 5 with the commission.

- 17 service of [orders.] documents. A motor carrier shall have,
- 18 maintain and operate from a definite place of business in the
- 19 State and shall display therein the certificate or permit issued
- 20 by the public utilities commission. The certificate or permit
- 21 holder shall report any change of address or telephone number to

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- 1 the commission within five business days from such change.
- 2 Communications, correspondence, and service of orders and other
- 3 official documents shall be made upon the [certificate or permit
- 4 holder] motor carrier, complainant, and any other party at the
- 5 last recorded mailing or electronic mail address on file with
- **6** the commission. Proof of service by certified or registered
- 7 mail or by electronic transmission to the last known mailing or
- 8 electronic mail address shall constitute a valid service of any
- 9 commission's order."
- 10 SECTION 7. Section 271G-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 12 and to read as follows:
- ""Document" includes but is not limited to any application,

- 15 declaration, exhibit, certificate of service, and other papers
- 16 filed by or with the commission."
- 17 Section 8. Section 271G-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "\$271G-7.5 Electronic copies of documents. (a) No later
- 20 than July 1, 2011, the public utilities commission shall accept
- 21 from any person who submits a document to the commission the

- 6 Section 9. Section 271G-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 "[+]\$271G-8[+] Reports and decisions of commission.
- 9 Whenever the public utilities commission inquires into the
- 10 operations, operating rights, rates, safety of operations, or
- 11 directs inquiry and investigation into water carrier activities
- 12 regulated under this chapter, and holds public hearing thereon,
- 13 it shall make a report in writing, on paper or an electronic
- 14 copy, in respect thereto, which shall state its findings of fact
- 15 and conclusions of law, together with its decision, order, or
- 16 requirement in the premises. The provisions of chapter 91 shall
- 17 apply."
- 18 SECTION 10. Section 271G-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
- "(e) In addition to any other remedy available, the
- 21 commission or its enforcement officer may issue citations to

- 1 persons acting in the capacity of or engaging in the business of
- 2 a water carrier within the State, without having a certificate
- 3 of public convenience and necessity or other authority
- 4 previously obtained under and in compliance with this chapter
- 5 and the rules adopted thereunder [-], as follows:
- 6 (1)The citation may contain an order of abatement and an 7 assessment of civil penalties of [not] no less than 8 \$100 [nor] and no more than \$500 for each offense and, 9 in the case of a continuing violation, [not] no less 10 than \$200 [nor] and no more than \$500 for each day 11 that uncertified activity continues. All penalties 12 collected under this subsection shall be deposited in 13 the treasury of the State. Service of a citation 14 issued under this subsection shall be made by personal 15 service [whenever possible], electronic service, or by 16 certified mail, restricted delivery, sent to the last 17 known business, [or] residence, or electronic mail 18 address of the person cited[-];
 - (2) Any person served with a citation under this subsection may submit a written request, on paper or electronically, to the commission for a hearing within

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1		twenty days from the receipt of the citation, with
2		respect to the violations alleged, the scope of the
3		order of abatement, and the amount of civil penalties
4		assessed. If the person cited under this subsection
5		timely notifies the commission of the request for a
6		hearing, the commission shall afford an opportunity
7		for a hearing under chapter 91. The hearing shall be
8		conducted by the commission, or the commission may
9		designate a hearings officer to hold the hearing $[\cdot]$:
10	(3)	If the person cited under this subsection does not
11		submit a written request, on paper or electronically,
12		to the commission for a hearing within twenty days
13		from the receipt of the citation, the citation shall
14		be deemed a final order of the commission. The
15		commission may apply to the appropriate court for a
16		judgment to enforce the provisions of any final order
17		issued by the commission or designated hearings
18		officer pursuant to this subsection, including the
19		provisions for abatement and civil penalties imposed.
20		In any proceeding to enforce the provisions of the
21		final order of the commission or designated hearings

1		officer, the commission need only show that the notice
2		was given, a hearing was held, or the time granted for
3		requesting the hearing has run without a request, and
4		a certified copy of the final order of the commission
5		or designated hearings officer[-]; and
6	(4)	If any party is aggrieved by the decision of the
7		commission or the designated hearings officer, the
8		party may appeal, subject to chapter 602, in the
9		manner provided for civil appeals from the circuit
10		courts; provided that the operation of an abatement
11		order shall not be stayed on appeal unless
12		specifically ordered by a court of competent
13		jurisdiction after applying the stay criteria
14		enumerated in section 91-14(c).
15	The sanct	ions and disposition authorized under this subsection
16	shall be	separate and in addition to all other remedies, either
17	civil or	criminal, provided in any other applicable statutory
18	provision	. The commission may adopt rules under chapter 91 as
19	may be ne	cessary to fully effectuate this subsection."

1 SECTION 12. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
