Section 329-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 3 "(d) Under the system: Information on the filling of prescriptions for (1)designated controlled substances and the dispensing of drug samples by a licensed practitioner shall be reported in numerical format[7] at least once every day, provided that if no controlled substances are 9 dispensed, then a report of "zero" shall be reported 10 not less than once every seven days [, on the filling of prescriptions for designated controlled substances 11 12 and the dispensing of drug samples by a licensed 13 practitioner]; and Each dispenser shall maintain a record of such filled 14 (2) 15 prescriptions, including all information described in 16 subsection (c), for a period of five years. Description:

Amends subsection 329-101(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to require that a dispenser of a controlled substance report the filling of a controlled substance prescription and the dispensing of drug samples to the State's Electronic Prescription Accountability System at least once every day, or a report of "zero" be reported not less than once every seven days if no controlled substances prescriptions are filled or drug samples are dispensed.

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE ELECTRONIC

PRESCRIPTION ACCOUNTABILITY SYSTEM.

PURPOSE: To change the current requirement to report

the dispensing of controlled substances and drug samples to the electronic prescription accountability system from at least once every seven days to at least once a day, and to require a daily dispensing report of

"zero", when no controlled substances are dispensed, at least once every seven days.

MEANS: Amend section 329-101(d), Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: The current nationwide trend for reporting

of controlled substances dispensing is to submit reports on a daily basis. This bill moves Hawaii closer to what is becoming a national standard. Additionally, new federal requirements for daily reporting are

pending implementation, and this bill will position the State to readily comply with

those requirements.

Impact on the public: The proposed amendment would aid prescribers and pharmacists by providing information about a patient's controlled substance prescription history, thereby allowing better prescribing

and dispensing decisions.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The proposed amendment would assist the
department's Narcotics Enforcement Division
in determining compliance with the reporting

requirements in section 329-101.
