# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LICENSE PLATES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Duke Kahanamoku 2 should be recognized for his contributions as an all-around 3 waterman, a lifeguard and lifesaver, a record-setting swimmer, a 4 swim and surf instructor, a five-time Olympic medalist in swimming and water polo, a sheriff of the city and county of 5 6 Honolulu, an early champion of volunteerism, and Hawaii's original ambassador of aloha. Duke Kahanamoku was inducted into 7 the Hawaii Waterman Hall of Fame, the United States Olympic Hall 8 9 of Fame, the International Swimming Hall of Fame, and the International Surfing Hall of Fame. As one of the first 10 11 internationally recognized native Hawaiians, Duke Kahanamoku 12 shared surfing and the aloha spirit with the world, and in doing 13 so, brought Hawaii to the world's attention. It is therefore appropriate that Duke Kahanamoku be honored with a special 14 15 license plate emblazoned with his name and likeness to further 16 promote his legacy of aloha.

1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the
2	issuance of special number plates to recognize and honor Duke
3	Kahanamoku.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
6	and to read as follows:
7	<u>\$249-</u> Special number plates for Duke Kahanamoku
8	authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
9	director of finance shall issue to any registered owner of a
10	motor vehicle, who is a resident of the State and has completed
11	the application and paid the required fees, a special number
12	plate for the registered owner's motor vehicle that commemorates
13	Duke Kahanamoku and his contribution to Hawaii; provided that
14	the director of finance of the city and county of Honolulu shall
15	not issue any special number plate pursuant to this section
16	before receiving from the owner of the Duke Kahanamoku
17	trademark, Malama Pono, Inc., written permission for the
18	trademark to be used for the special number plate and for all
19	proceeds to benefit the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation.
20	(b) The director of finance of the city and county of
21	Honolulu, in consultation with the directors of finance of the





2		trade name, service mark, copyright, or other

4	(2)	Represent any obscene or degrading image, idea, word,

6	(3)	Advertise or endorse a product, brand, or service that

8	(4)	Promote any religious belief; or

1	(f) The director of finance may charge an additional
2	fundraising fee, of the same or a different amount as the
3	fundraising fee established pursuant to subsection (e), for the
4	renewal of a special number plate. If an additional fundraising
5	fee is implemented pursuant to this subsection, the director of
6	finance shall not renew and instead shall revoke the special
7	number plate of the registered owner of a motor vehicle who
8	fails to pay the additional fundraising fee imposed by this
9	subsection.
10	(g) The revenue generated by the fundraising fees, or a
11	portion of the revenue generated by the fundraising fees as
12	determined by the director of finance, shall be deposited in the
13	name of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation in a separate
14	county budget account. The director of finance shall determine
15	the most efficient means of directing the net revenue generated
16	by the fundraising fees to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku
17	Foundation, as appropriate, to fund programs that promote water
18	safety and swim education across the State while developing
19	world class water athletes as a tribute to, and in the spirit
20	of, Duke Kahanamoku.

(h) The director of finance may revoke all special number
plates issued pursuant to this section if the total number of
registered owners of motor vehicles who obtain the special
number plates is less than one hundred fifty within three years
of issuance of the first special number plate.
(i) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to
any plates issued pursuant to section 249-9.2.
(j) For the purposes of this section, unless a different
meaning appears from the context, "special number plate" means a
license plate that commemorates Duke Kahanamoku."
SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
