A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROTECTIVE DEVICES FOR MOTORCYCLES, MOTOR SCOOTERS, AND MOPEDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Ţ	SECTION 1. Section 286-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§286-81 Motorcycle, motor scooter, moped, etc.;
4	protective devices. (a) No person shall operate a motorcycle
5	or motor scooter, on any highway in the State unless the person
6	and any passenger the person carries on the motorcycle or motor
7	scooter wears:
8	(1) Safety glasses, goggles, or a face shield, in the case
9	of a motorcycle or motor scooter that is not equipped
10	with windscreens or windshields; [and]
11	(2) A safety helmet securely fastened with a chin strap,
12	and
13	$[\frac{(2)}{2}]$ Any other protective devices $[\frac{1}{2}]$ other than a
14	safety helmet, required by rules adopted by the
15	director.

- 1 For the purpose of meeting the requirements of this subsection,
- 2 a required device shall meet the specifications and requirements
- 3 established by rules adopted by the director.
- 4 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) and section 291C-195,
- 5 no person shall operate a moped or motor scooter leased from a
- 6 rental company on any roadway in the State unless the person
- 7 wears a safety helmet, which shall be provided by the rental
- 8 company unless the person provides the person's own safety
- 9 helmet; provided that this subsection shall not apply to persons
- 10 who possess a valid license under this chapter to operate a
- 11 motorcycle or an equivalent license issued from another
- 12 state. To meet the requirements of this subsection, the safety
- 13 helmet shall meet the specifications and requirements
- 14 established by rules adopted by the director.
- (c) In addition to the requirements of subsection (b), no

5	person or persons intending to operate or ride as a

8	is leased or rented may furnish for the person's own
9	use the protective devices required by this part.
10	For the purposes of meeting the requirements of this subsection
11	a required device shall meet the specifications and requirements
12	established by rules adopted by the director.
13	(d) No person shall sell, offer for sale, or furnish any
14	safety helmet, safety glasses, goggles, face shield, windscreen
15	windshield, or other protective devices represented to meet the
16	requirements of this part unless the device meets the
17	specifications and requirements established by rules adopted by
18	the director.
19	[(e) No person less than eighteen years of age shall
20	operate or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor scooter
21	on any highway in the State unless the person wears a safety
22	helmet securely fastened with a chin strap.

2	contrary, a safety helmet shall not be required for any person
3	who operates or rides as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor
4	scooter; provided that the motorcycle or motor scooter:

6	[(2) Is powered by an electric motor;
7	$\frac{(3)}{(2)}$ Has a roll bar, roll cage, or full body enclosed
8	cab; and
9	$[\frac{4}{3}]$ (3) Has a seat belt assembly or a child
10	restraint system for the driver and the passenger;
11	and the operator and passenger uses the seat belt or
12	child restraint system pursuant to sections 291-11.5
13	and 291-11.6."
14	SECTION 2. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
16	"(a) Notwithstanding section 286-81(b), no person:
17	(1) Less than fifteen years of age shall drive a moped on
18	a highway, street, roadway, or any other public
19	property in the State; and
20	(2) [Less than eighteen years of age shall] <u>Shall</u> drive a
21	moped unless the person wears a safety helmet securel
22	fastened with a chin strap.

Highway Safety; Safety Equipment; Protective Devices; Motorcycles, Motor Scooters, and Mopeds

Description:

DEPARTMENT: Transportation

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PROTECTIVE

DEVICES FOR MOTORCYCLES, MOTOR SCOOTERS, AND

MOPEDS.

PURPOSE: To require operators and passengers of

motorcycles and motor scooters to wear a helmet secured by a chin strap and require operators of a moped to wear a helmet with a

chin strap.

MEANS: Amend sections 286-81 and 291C-195(a), Hawaii

Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: Motorcycles and motor scooter registrations

represent approximately only 3 percent of registered vehicles in the State of Hawaii. Yet, in 2021, motorcycle and moped operators and their passengers represented 35 percent

of all the roadway fatalities.

In 2021, Hawaii gas prices were at an average of \$4.08 a gallon that probably caused more people to purchase and operate more motorcycles and mopeds instead of motor vehicles. With the additional motorcycles and mopeds on the roadways, the fatalities rose from 18 in 2020 to 33 in 2021. Of these 33 fatalities, 32 were the vehicle operator

and one was a passenger.

Of the 33 riders, 21 riders (64 percent) were not wearing helmets. Helmets are still the best way to save lives and prevent head injuries. Hawaii only has a partial helmet law that only requires helmets for those under the age of 18 years old.

Impact on the public: This bill will lessen the impact on motorcycle, motor scooter, and moped riders involved in crashes.
