A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII RELATING TO ELECTED COUNTY SCHOOL BOARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds Hawaii is the only state in the nation where a single department of education and a single statewide board run all public schools in the state. All other states have school systems broken down into districts within the state, each with their own separate board of education. Hawaii's centralized school board and school system is unlike any other state.

8 The legislature finds that a centralized school system 9 comes with several drawbacks. For example, every public school, 10 regardless of the differences between them, are required to 11 follow the same set of state regulations and guidelines as it 12 relates to education. This system also leaves little room for 13 flexibility in introducing new teaching approaches, or in trying 14 new instructional programming.

15 The legislature finds that entrusting the governance of 16 public schools to citizens elected by their respective

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1	communities to oversee their school districts is imperative to a
2	well-functioning school system in the state. With this system in
3	place, elected board members can address the unique education-
4	related needs of their respective counties for better tailored
5	improvements in public education.
6	The purpose of this Act is to amend the Constitution of the
7	State of Hawaii to provide for a local school board in each
8	county that is populated with elected board members, in place of
9	the current Board of Education.
10	SECTION 2. Article X of the Constitution of the State of
11	Hawaii is amended by adding two new sections to be designated
12	and to read as follows:
13	"LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS
14	Section . Public education in the State shall be
15	provided through a decentralized system of independent school
16	districts with schools required to follow and satisfy statewide
17	student performance standards, as provided by law.
18	There shall be four local school boards, one for each
19	county, to oversee their respective school complex areas.
20	Members of each local school board shall be elected by voters

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1	who resid	e in that county, as provided by law. Each local
2	school bo	ard shall:
3	(1)	Formulate county-wide educational policies;
4	(2)	Select principals to manage the schools in the county;
5	(3)	Authorize the principal of each school to make the
6		decisions that affect student performance, educational
7		quality, and use of resources;
8	(4)	Evaluate the principals managing schools in the local
9		school board's county;
10	(5)	Administer programs that the schools are not able to
11		administer alone; and
12	(6)	Establish an open system that allows, to the extent
13		practicable given each school's resources and
14		capacity, the parents, guardians, and caretakers of
15		each public school student to select the school that
16		the student will attend.
17	E	DUCATION STANDARDS AND ACCOUNTABILITY COMMISSION
18	Sect	ion . There shall be an education standards and
19	accountab	ility commission, as provided by law, to:

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1	(1)	Establish and maintain rigorous academic and data-
2		reporting standards that apply to all school complex
3		areas within the statewide public education system;
4	(2)	Ensure that the school complex areas operate in an
5		open manner;
6	(3)	Publish annual report cards on each school complex
7		area's financial management and overall performance;
8	(4)	Ensure that all state and federal mandates are
9		fulfilled;
10	(5)	Establish a formula for distributing general funds for
11		school operations to all public schools based on the
12		number and needs of students enrolled at each school;
13	(6)	Establish a formula for the distribution of capital
14		improvement project funds to the school complex areas;
15		and
16	(7)	Administer programs that the school complex areas
17		cannot administer alone.
18	The	legislature shall appropriate all general funds for
19	school op	erations in a single amount to the education standards
20	and accou	ntability commission.

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1 The legislature shall appropriate all capital improvement 2 project funds for school capital improvement projects in a 3 single amount to the education standards and accountability 4 commission." 5 SECTION 3. Article XVI, section 4, of the Constitution of 6 the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows: 7 "OATH OF OFFICE 8 Section 4. All eligible public officers, before entering 9 upon the duties of their respective offices, shall take and 10 subscribe to the following oath or affirmation: "I do solemnly 11 swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the 12 Constitution of the United States, and the Constitution of the 13 State of Hawaii, and that I will faithfully discharge my duties as to the best of my ability." As used in this 14 15 section, "eligible public officers" means the governor, the 16 lieutenant governor, the members of both houses of the 17 legislature, the members of the [board of education,] county 18 school boards, the members of the national guard, State or 19 county employees who possess police powers, district court 20 judges, and all those whose appointment requires the consent of 21 the senate."

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1	SECTION 4. Article X, section 2 and 3, of the Constitution
2	of the State of Hawaii are repealed.
3	["BOARD OF EDUCATION
4	Section 2. There shall be a board of education. The
5	governor shall nominate and, by and with the advice and consent
6	of the senate, appoint the members of the board of education, as
7	provided by law.
8	POWER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION
9	Section 3. The board of education shall have the power, as
10	provided by law, to formulate statewide educational policy and
11	appoint the superintendent of education as the chief executive
12	officer of the public school system."]
13	SECTION 5. Article XVIII, section 7, of the Constitution
14	of the State of Hawaii, is repealed.
15	["1978 BOARD OF EDUCATION ELECTIONS
16	Section 7. Members elected to the board of education in
17	the 1978 general election shall serve for two-year terms."]
18	SECTION 6. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
19	be as follows:

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1 "Shall the statewide appointed board of education be 2 abolished and replace with four elected county school 3 boards?" 4 SECTION 7. Constitutional material to be repealed is 5 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is 6 underscored. 7 SECTION 8. This amendment shall take effect upon 8 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of 9 the State of Hawaii; provided that, subject to ratification, section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2026. 10 INTRODUCED BY: IAN 24
