A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HISTORIC PRESERVATION SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is in the public
- 2 interest to maintain and preserve the State's historic
- 3 government buildings. When Hawaii became the fiftieth state,
- 4 key elements of its multicultural heritage and culture were
- 5 incorporated into its government structures. These buildings
- 6 reflect Hawaii's Pacific-Asian values, making these structures
- 7 unique within the United States and the world. At the same
- 8 time, older structures like Iolani Palace and other historic
- 9 government buildings provide critical links to Hawaii's monarchs
- 10 and Native Hawaiian population. In order to restore and
- 11 preserve the state capitol, Iolani Palace, and other historic
- 12 government properties, the State should adhere to the same
- 13 long-term planning, budgeting, and preservation standards that
- 14 are used to preserve privately held historic sites.
- 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to develop a
- 16 holistic approach toward the restoration and preservation of the
- 17 State's historic government buildings by expressly allowing the

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Hawaii historic preservation special fund to be used for this
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    purpose.
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         SECTION 2. Section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
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    inserted and to read as follows:
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         ""Comptroller" means the comptroller of the department of
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    accounting and general services.
         "Department chairperson" means the chairperson of board of
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    land and natural resources, unless the context otherwise
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    requires."
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         SECTION 3. Section 6E-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "$6E-16 Hawaii historic preservation special fund. (a)
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    There is established a Hawaii historic preservation special fund
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    into which shall be deposited the following moneys:
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         (1)
              Appropriations by the legislature to the special
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              fund[+], in an amount equal to per cent of the
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              moneys appropriated for capital improvement projects
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              in a given year;
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1	(2)	Gifts, donations, <u>historic preservation funding from</u>
2		<pre>non-state sources, and grants from public agencies and</pre>
3		private persons;
4	(3)	All proceeds collected by the department derived from
5		historic preserve user fees, historic preserve leases
6		or concession fees, fees charged to carry out the
7		purposes of this chapter, or the sale of goods; and
8	(4)	Civil, criminal, and administrative penalties, fines,
9		and other charges collected under this chapter or any
10		rule adopted pursuant to this chapter.
11	All inter	est earned or accrued on moneys deposited in the fund
12	shall bec	ome part of the fund.
13	<u>(b)</u>	The fund shall be administered by the [department;
14	provided	that the department may contract with a public or
15	private a	gency to provide the day-to-day management of the
16	fund.] co	mptroller, with an advisory group comprising:
17	(1)	The department chairperson;
18	(2)	The state historic preservation officer; and
19	(3)	Preservation experts, who shall be selected and
20		invited to participate by the department director.

1	[-(b)-] (c) Subject to legislative authorization, the
2	[departme	nt] comptroller may expend moneys from the fund:
3	(1)	For permanent and temporary staff positions;
4	(2)	To replenish goods;
5	(3)	To produce public information materials;
6	(4)	To provide financial assistance to public agencies and
7		private agencies in accordance with chapter 42F
8		involved in historic preservation activities other
9		than those covered by section 6E-9; [and]
10	(5)	To cover administrative and operational costs of the
1		historic preservation program[+]; and
12	<u>(6)</u>	To repair, maintain, and preserve historic properties,
13		as defined in this chapter, except properties
14		maintained through a separate, dedicated funding
15		source.
16	(d)	The comptroller shall submit a report to the
17	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
18	each regu	lar session detailing the moneys deposited into and
19	expended	from the fund.
