### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER NEUTRALITY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the concept of water
- 2 neutrality was conceived at the 2002 World Summit on Sustainable
- 3 Development in Johannesburg, South Africa. While the definition
- 4 of "water neutrality" has varied over the past twenty years, the
- 5 term generally means a process that balances water use through
- 6 reduced water usage and investment in projects that increase the
- 7 supply of fresh water.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force to
- 9 develop a plan for Hawaii to be water-neutral by the year 2050.
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department
- 11 of health for administrative purposes the water neutrality task
- 12 force.
- 13 (b) The task force shall create a plan for Hawaii to
- 14 become water-neutral by the year 2050. The water neutrality
- 15 plan shall include plans to:
- 16 (1) Reduce water usage;
- 17 (2) Increase water reuse and water recycling; and



1	(3)	increase the supply of fresh water.
2	(c)	The task force shall consist of the following members
3	or their	designees:
4	(1)	The deputy director for environmental health
5		administration of the department of health, who shall
6		serve as the chairperson of the task force;
7	(2)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
8		resources;
9	(3)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture;
10	(4)	A member of the commission on water resource
11		management, other than the chairperson of the board of
12		land and natural resources;
13	(5)	The chairperson of the house of representatives
14		committee with subject matter purview over water and
15		land; and
16	(6)	The chairperson of the senate committee with subject
17	•	matter purview over water and land.
18	(d)	In addition to the members specified in subsection
19	(c), the	chairperson shall invite the following individuals to
20	be members of the task force:	

1	(1)	A director-level representative from a county agency	
2		with permitting or implementation authority over water	
3		reuse in that county;	
4	(2)	A representative from a public agency with permitting	
5		or implementation authority over wastewater;	
6	(3)	A representative of the Fresh Water Council of Wai	
7		Maoli: Hawaii Fresh Water Initiative;	
8	(4)	The environmental program director of the Hawai`i	
9		Community Foundation, or the director's designee; and	
10	(5)	Any other individual whom the deputy director	
11		determines would provide a benefit to the task force.	
12	(e)	Private members of the task force shall serve without	
13	compensation but may be reimbursed for actual expenses,		
14	including	travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their	
15	duties.		
16	(f)	The task force shall consider the recommendations made	
17	by the water reuse task force established pursuant to H.C.R.		
18	No. 86, S	.D.1 (2018).	
19	(g)	The task force shall submit a report to the	
20	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of	

the regular session of 2024. The report shall include the water

- 1 neutrality plan, findings, recommendations, and any proposed
- 2 legislation.
- 3 (h) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2024.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
