A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that financial literacy is 2 among the many critical life skills needed for success. 3 Historically, life skills curriculums have not always covered 4 personal finance classes or financial literacy classes. In a 5 time where the cost of living is one of the most important 6 issues facing Hawaii residents, it is crucial that our students 7 begin learning the basics of sound financial literacy in high 8 school so that they can start adulthood with a firm 9 understanding of what it'll take to reach their financial goals 10 later in life.

11 The purpose of this Act is to require all public high 12 school students to take one financial literacy class before 13 graduation.

SECTION 2. SECTION 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

8	requirements established by the State board of
9	education; and
10	(3) Be made available in a traditional classroom setting,
11	blended learning environment, online-based, or other
12	technology-based format that is tailored to meet the
13	needs of each participating student."
14	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
