RELATING TO RECORD DISPOSITION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide greater 2 uniformity, flexibility, and efficiency in handling and 3 maintaining state ethics commission records. 4 SECTION 2. Section 84-17.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: "(a) All financial disclosure statements filed by a 6 7 legislator, employee, or delegate to a constitutional convention 8 shall be maintained by the state ethics commission for a period 9 of six years from the date of the financial disclosure 10 statement's filing. Upon the expiration of the six-year period, 11 the financial disclosure statement and all copies thereof 12 [shall] may be destroyed. 13 (b) Upon the expiration of six years after an election for

14 which a candidate for state elective office or a constitutional 15 convention has filed a financial disclosure statement, the state 16 ethics commission [shall] may destroy the candidate's financial 17 disclosure statement and all copies thereof."
