A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the residents of the
State view animals, specifically companion animals, as more than
simply personal property. Animals bring comfort and are viewed
as extensions of the family. Animals provide support, guidance,
companionship, and therapy. Animals can provide critical
support to residents with disabilities.

7 The legislature further finds that the State has a history 8 of promoting the protection of animals. For more than sixty 9 years, persons who find and take possession of stray dogs have 10 been required to report the stray dogs to animal control. For more than fifty years, cruelty to animals has been criminalized 11 12 in the State. And most recently, Act 91, Session Laws of Hawaii 13 2021, encouraged bystanders to assist animals in peril by 14 limiting the liability of duly licensed veterinarians who render 15 emergency care and treatment to an animal.

1 However, the legislature finds that more may be done to 2 encourage and protect bystanders who are not duly licensed 3 veterinarians that assist animals in an emergency. 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to limit the civil 5 liability of good Samaritans who render emergency nonmedical care and emergency nonmedical assistance to animals during an 6 7 emergency. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 663, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately 10 designated and to read as follows: 11 "§663-Exception to liability; emergency nonmedical 12 care and emergency nonmedical assistance to animals. (a) Any 13 person who in good faith renders emergency nonmedical care or 14 emergency nonmedical assistance, without renumeration or 15 expectation of renumeration, at the scene of an emergency to an 16 animal shall not be liable for any civil damages resulting from 17 the person's acts or omissions, except for such damages as may 18 result from the person's gross negligence or wanton acts or 19 omissions.
