

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the average age of farmers in Hawaii is sixty years and the State does not have a 2 3 farming workforce large enough for expansion of cultivated 4 agricultural lands and food production. A primary cause of the 5 shortage of new farmers in Hawaii during the past several 6 decades has been the decline in support for agriculture education from state government, including training for 7 8 agriculture teachers. The lack of support for agriculture 9 education has resulted in an insufficient interest among youth 10 in pursuing the fields of agriculture and natural resource 11 management.

12 The legislature further finds that to meet the State's 13 aspirations for increased food security and self-sufficiency, 14 the number of local farms and farmers and the amount of food 15 produced for local markets will need to increase significantly. 16 Agriculture education is key to the development of future 17 farmers and to a society that values and understands the vital

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1 role of agriculture, food, fiber, and natural resources systems
2 in advancing personal, local, and global well-being. During the
3 past decade, a vibrant grassroots movement in support of
4 agriculture education has emerged in Hawaii, along with a marked
5 increase in new farmer training programs and student involvement
6 in FFA, formerly known as Future Farmers of America.

The legislature further finds that to encourage continued 7 8 momentum for agriculture education, the senate passed Senate 9 Resolution No. 80, Regular Session of 2015, which requested the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human 10 11 resources to convene a working group to develop a coordinated 12 framework of support for preschool through post-secondary 13 agriculture education and a plan for implementation, including 14 any proposed legislation, through annual reports to the 15 legislature prior to the regular sessions of 2017, 2018, and 16 2019.

17 The legislature further finds that for three years, the 18 University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human 19 resources convened the agriculture education working group, 20 which included governmental and non-governmental stakeholders. 21 The group's final report in 2019 to the legislature outlined a



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1 coordinated framework of support for agriculture education in 2 Hawaii and recommended that a coordinator position be 3 established. The legislature finds that effectuation of the coordinated framework of support for agriculture education in 4 5 Hawaii by the agriculture education coordinator and the 6 agriculture education working group will result in an increased 7 number of: 8 (1)Students exposed to agriculture education at all grade 9 levels in public, charter, and independent schools; 10 (2)Public school students entering and completing the 11 career and technical education agriculture, food 12 innovation, and natural resources career pathway; 13 Students entering and completing higher education (3) 14 programs, apprenticeships, internships, and work-based 15 learning programs in agriculture and food systems; 16 Teachers trained in agriculture and food systems (4) 17 education; and 18 (5) Local food producers and other food systems 19 professionals. 20 The coordinated framework of support will also lead to a 21 decrease in the average age of farmers in the State and an



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expansion of an educated agricultural workforce, thereby
 increasing food security, food self-sufficiency, sustainability,
 and resiliency for Hawaii.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to support a
coordinated framework for agriculture education by appropriating
funds for a full-time agriculture education coordinator position
at the college of tropical agriculture and human resources at
the University of Hawaii at Manoa.

9 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$300,000 or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the 12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 13 2024-2025 for the college of tropical of agriculture and human 14 resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa to establish one 15 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) agriculture education coordinator 16 position.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University18 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
